I'm the lead auditor with Love, 19 Bailey and Associates that does the Town audit. 20 I hope all of you all had a Merry Christmas and 21 a Happy New Year so far. Just to start off the 22 presentation, I wanted to go over a few things 23 in regards the Town's responsibility and our 24 responsibility as the auditor for audit. So 25 the Town's responsibility for the audit is to



1	maintain effective internal controls that
2	regularly assess risk. This basically just
3	means that the proper approvals and sign-offs
4	on payables, segregation of duties and whatnot.
5	So, we do evaluate the internal controls each
6	and every year, and there were no findings for
7	the 2020 audit so that's always a positive,
8	good thing for the Town. Additionally, the
9	Town is responsible for the financial
10	statements we prepare and the but the books
11	we audit must be complete and accurate. And in
12	2020, we had a few adjusting journal entries,
13	but nothing that causes any kind of
14	(inaudible). So overall, we believe the Town
15	has good control just based on the size of the
16	Town. In regards to our responsibility as the
17	auditors, we (inaudible) which gives reasonable
18	assurance that the financial statements are
19	materially correct. So we audit the trial
20	balance and the numbers we are given to
21	reasonableness. In 2020, the Town received an
22	unmodified opinion, which is the best opinion
23	you can receive. And like I said, we review
24	internal controls, but the audit overall is not
25	to detect fraud if it existed. However, we do
24	internal controls, but the audit overall is not



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1	design procedures to try and pick up on any
2	possible fraud, if any, of which we have no
3	discovery in the 2020 audit. Our audit did not
4	address the financial condition or provide
5	suggestions as to what direction the Town
6	should take. We just made clear our auditing
7	is on (inaudible) reasonableness. So, in
8	regards to new items for the Town in 2020
9	related to GASB Accounting Standards, there
10	were none that impacted the Town. And this
11	presentation that I'm about to go over briefly
12	is gonna be focused on the fund balance, which
13	is what the Town uses to develop a budget each
14	and every year. So first and foremost, I want
15	to go over a little bit of the balance sheet
16	items. And I don't know if you all have the
17	financial statement, but this is page 5 of the
18	financials if you all care to look on. So
19	COUNCILMAN EVANS: Page 5?
20	COUNCILWOMAN ISOM: (Inaudible.)
21	MR. WALLS: Yes, sir, page 5 of the financial
22	statement. This is the balance sheet of the
23	governmental funds.
24	COUNCILMAN EVANS: Okay.
25	MR. WALLS: All right. So, the general fund and
20	me general rund and



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1	cash balances decreased from \$510,000 in 2019
2	to \$229,000 in 2020. This is a result of
3	several items. One, there's a decrease in fund
4	balance of \$107,000. We'll I'll go over
5	that when I'm talking about the revenue and
6	expenses for the year. There was a reduction
7	in your A/P, which basically means that you all
8	paid your vendors that you all owed in 2020 so
9	that was a reduction of \$22,000 of your cash.
10	And then another significant item was \$175,000
11	reduction in under business licenses, and
12	I'm also gonna go over that here in a little
13	bit too, a little further down. So, accounts
14	receivable totaled \$56,000, which is lower than
15	2019, mostly because in 2020 you all had
16	\$16,000 of similar reimbursements and you all
17	did not have that item in 2020. Total
18	liability was lower than prior year \$45,000
19	versus \$67,000 in '19. And again, that was
20	mostly due to the reduction in A/P that you all
21	paid more vendors in 2020 than in 2019. So the
22	unearned business licenses dropped from
23	\$230,000 to \$55,000 in 2020, and this is one of
24	the main reductions in cash. In prior years,
25	the business licenses were usually fully



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1	collected by 6/30, but due to COVID I believe
2	you all gave all the businesses an extension.
3	So you all are gonna be collecting that cash,
4	it was just gonna be subsequent to 6/30/2020.
5	And just to give you all an update, the cash
6	balances were up from around \$60,000 more
7	than they were at year end in December so you
8	all are being successful in collecting those
9	business licenses. Overall, the total fund
10	balance decreased \$107,000 to \$188,000. Of
11	that, \$183,000 is unrestricted which means that
12	the Town can use that however they would like
13	to. And just to give you all a little
14	background, at 6/30/2015, the unrestricted
15	balance was a negative \$221,000, and so the
16	Town has made significant improvements since
17	2015 to 2020, albeit while you all are dealing
18	with COVID at the same time. Looking positive
19	for the Town. GFOA recommends a minimum of
20	16.7 percent, or two months, of cash available
21	for expenses. Here at Love, Bailey, we like
22	that to be around three months, or 25 percent.
23	So in 2020, the Town had expenses of \$807,000
24	and you all had \$229,000 cash on hand, which
25	represents around 29 percent, or 3.2 months, of



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1	cash reserve. So that is that is what we
2	like to see. And it has increased subsequent
3	to year end. The next thing I was go over was
4	page 7, the statement of revenue and
5	expenditures. So overall, the revenue
6	decreased from \$50,000 from 2019 to a total
7	of \$753,000. This so basic overview of each
8	account: Property taxes were \$222,000 in '19
9	and they were \$240,000 in 2020. Licenses and
10	permits were \$289,000 in '19 and \$309,000 in
11	2020. Franchise fees decreased slightly from
12	\$67 to \$62,000 in 2020. Intergovernmental was
13	made of \$60,000 of in hospitality of \$36,000
14	(ph), which is slightly lower than 2019. The
15	biggest drop in revenue that you all had this
16	year was you all had \$60,000 of Bike Fest
17	revenue in 2019 but obviously, you know, due to
18	COVID, you all did not have that in 2020 so
19	there was very little income for the Bike Fest
20	in 2020. In regards to the expenditures,
21	expenditures increased by \$65,000 from \$795,000
22	in 2019 to \$860,000 in 2020. Some background
23	on that, salaries and benefits increased
24	\$101,000. Benefits and tax of \$42,000 and
25	salaries were \$59,000 of that. Basically, the



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1	increase was budgeted though from your all's
2	last year's budget. The supplies and training
3	increased by \$20,000 (ph) with additional
4	labor, and the Bike Fest (inaudible) were down
5	(inaudible) due to you all not having Bike
6	Fest. So the next thing I was gonna look at
7	real briefly is the budget versus actual on
8	page this is page 29 of the financials. So
9	revenue was slightly lower than budget by
10	\$3,000. Nothing changed there. No big
11	discrepancy there. Oh, expenses were higher in
12	the budget by \$102,000, and that was made up of
13	salaries and benefits being above budget by
14	\$33,000. Travel and mileage up \$15,000.
15	Repairs and maintenance up \$25,000.
16	Professional services up \$46,000. Equipment
17	rental, insurance, project reserves and
18	miscellaneous were down \$49,000. So the
19	overall Town budgets break even, but had a
20	\$108,000 loss in 2020. A few other items to
21	note, on the net pension liability, which is
22	the State pension liability that you all are
23	part of with the State, that liability
24	increased from \$343,000 to \$469,000. And what
25	we like to always tell our clients is each year



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1	the percentage of contributions that the Town
2	is required to make increases 1 percent a year
3	so whether you all added an employee or not,
4	every 1 percent increase is gonna cost the Town
5	an additional \$3,500. So in 2017, that
6	increase that expense was increased \$14,000
7	although you all had the had much activity
8	as far as adding employees. 2021, however, the
9	pension contribution rate is actually gonna
10	stay the same due to COVID so I think everybody
11	was trying to give all the towns and counties
12	a break and not increase the contribution rates
13	from 2020 to 2021. Lastly, I'm just gonna talk
14	about the capital assets for a minute. The
15	you all had \$53,000 in capital asset additions
16	during 2020. \$3,800 of that related to the
17	HVAC for the Town Hall, \$2,655 for the
18	merry-go-round, and then the remaining amount
19	was related to police cars and related to
20	Police Department equipment. I believe that
21	that's all I have for the (inaudible)
22	presentation. Just wanted to open up the phone
23	call for any questions that the Council may
24	have or Mr. Q or Ms. Cheryl if you all have any
25	questions.

8	Happy New Year to everybody, the ones I haven't
9	spoke to yet.
10	IN UNISON: Happy New Year.
11	POLICE CHIEF ROBINSON: This year, we didn't have
12	our party because of COVID so we had like a
13	drive-through for the Christmas giveaway. It
14	was a pretty good turnout. First off, I want
15	to thank everybody that donated to the
16	Christmas giveaway, the Beachwear Store, The
17	Vera Motel, Dollhouse, Club Drip, Councilwoman
18	Williams. The Mayor came out and helped us,
19	gave out passed out some stuff, and
20	Chick-fil-A. And everybody else if I missed

17	before any public governmental property can be
18	disposed of or sold. So this offer came
19	unsolicited, as the Mayor indicated, to the
20	Council for Council's consideration. In order
21	to sell the property, the Council has not, and
22	it's not on the agenda, to make a decision
23	around the disposition or sale of the property.
24	And it cannot be done unless there is a public
25	advertisement and offering to the general



1	public. The property has not been appraised
2	and if the Council should consider selling it,
3	it will be publicly offered and listed
4	accordingly. And any development that is
5	proposed to be done on the site has to be in
6	accordance with the Master Plan and local
7	zoning ordinances that require in terms of
8	building in that location. But at this time,
9	the Council has not made a determination. It
10	was on the Executive Session for discussion,
11	and to clarify the status of the property
12	currently now as it is listed. So that's where
13	we are. Any public offering or decision
14	Council should make to sell the property or
15	dispose of it will be done through a public
16	process. I hope that answers all of your seven
