recommendations for two small changes. One,
reflect to reflect the state model
ordinance, to be consistent with the state
model ordinance, because that's what FEMA
requires. We made adjustments to a section on
accessory structures, which in your packet was
listed on page 19 and it was all in red
underlined font, and that entire section had
been changed by FEMA so we made the change
there. And then near the beginning of the
ordinance, there was a section referencing
Section 4, lands to which the ordinance
applies, it referenced the flood insurance
study and originally it had dated and I
believe it was dated 1999, but we've updated

that to December 16th, 2021. So, the new maps 1 2 were adopted by FEMA and went into place on 3 December 16th, and we are now playing catch-up 4 to have this submitted to FEMA so that they --5 there won't be a lag in your coverage. 6 MAYOR EVANS: Okay ---7 MS. A 1 1 ofbusiness classifications the for businesses in the town have been identified and classified by the state. The major difference is that in -- the change is that there will not be a percentage collection on the fee rate but a flat dollar amount. It is indicated that it will be revenue neutral, meaning that there should not bе any major increases in the
