The contractor had some issues with the fabrication the equipment, had some οf the wrong equipment and had to have it replaced. I've been on them to get it done and have a date of August the 12th that it should be completed. It is about 85 percent done, there is some equipment I think they're doing tomorrow, well as the perimeter fencing that has to be completed before the entire playground is done. just want to throw out to Council to thinking about a date once it's completed to have a dedication ceremony, ribbon-cutting, and think, Mayor, you indicated also Ι the playground has not been formally named,

correct?

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MAYOR EVANS: Right.

MR. QUATTLEBAUM: So, in terms of potentially coming up with a naming of the playground at that dedication ribbon-cutting particular and ceremony that anticipate to happen probably a couple weeks after the completion is done, probably sometime in September so want Council to be thinking about some names to designate аt that particular time. the park Any want pleased questions? Also, to -to announce that the Town of Atlantic Beach has won another grant award, \$50,000 grant award Gaylord Dorothy from the and Donnelley Foundation for the continued accumulation of artifacts, information data, history of Town of Atlantic Beach and getting it codified in -- and the records. The Historic Committee and also Ms. Denise Gibson have been working on the first grant we received of \$25,000 from the Preservation Society, we filed our first report the \$25,000, quarterly report on onthe activity that was held primarily during Bike accumulation and interviews Fest, with residents of the town to gather history and

information and documentation on the history of
the Town of Atlantic Beach. This grant goes
further for and pays for the collection of
artifacts, data, history, and will be digitized
as well as in print form. The grant award was
to be received on July 29th. We received
notice that the actual award will be on August
the 12th, that the actual payment. The
first grant award is a reimbursable \$25,000.
We paid the first quarter payment and have
submitted Ms. Gibson has submitted the
invoices for reimbursement under the
preservation grant of \$25,000. Item C, with
very short notice, like to commend, first of
all, Ms. Gibson, Ms. Cheatham, KHAFRA, Mr.
Ballentine, Bates, the principal, for, on a
short notice, turning around an application for
\$500,000 to the County. The County notified us
I think around the end of June that they had
some additional American Rescue Recovery
funding and that municipalities were eligible
to submit grants up to \$50,000 sorry
\$500,000 by July the 29th. In less than a
week, the team of professionals put together a
grant submission to the County on July the 29th

and we are waiting decision for the grant
award. We chose to apply for broadband
improvement, basically putting replacing
streetlights in the town with equipped with
cameras, Wi-Fi access and a number of other
amenities and lighting, improved lighting, for
the town. The grant is not large enough to do
the entire town, the primary focus of the grant
on this round of funding would be on 30th
Avenue and giving us the access, the
capability, to improve and bring broadband
enhancement and Wi-Fi to the Town of Atlantic
Beach. So like to, again, commend Ms. Gibson
and the team for working diligently on very
short notice to turn around an application and
get us in the running and consideration for a
grant award of \$500,000. That's all I have.
