MR. QUATTLEBAUM: Mayor, Council, I just wanted to give some of the highlights for the public is that the BikeFest 2023, the dates -- will start on Friday the 26th through Monday the 29th. All of the fee schedules are carried over from last year -- 30th Avenue is \$675; alcohol from 30th Avenue, \$2,000; beer and wine, \$750; retail \$650; exhibitors \$300; late registration fee will enact on March 31st if not registered before that time. The hours of operation are the same as last year, will end at 3:00 a.m. and on -- other than Monday, it concludes at 3:00 p.m. on the 29th of 2023. So all of the other components of BikeFest will remain in effect and the same, as I indicated, rates and everything are the same as they were last year. This is the first reading, second reading will be in January.

22	MAYOR EVANS: We're down to the Manager's Report.
23	MR. QUATTLEBAUM: Mayor, Council and public, I just
24	wanted to go through an updated view on a
25	number of items. One, recycling which was

approved at the last Council meeting has begun
in the Town of Atlantic Beach. Number I'll
come back to number two, Chief Robinson on our
annual Christmas Program here at the Community
Center. Item Number 3, Santee Cooper Economic
Development Grant, just wanted to reiterate to
the Council and public that the Town has been
granted up to \$10,000 a year to apply for
economic development planning, marketing of the
Town, and it's a reimbursable grant, we would
have to spend resources in the area of
developing our economic development plan and
implementation and submit to Santee Cooper for
reimbursement up to \$10,000 per year, not just
this year, 2022, but in the years following.
Number 4, just to alert Council and the public,
the president has declared South Carolina's
state of emergency as a result of Hurricane Ian
and allows the Town and municipalities to apply
for FEMA reimbursement for debris cleanup and
security services that were provided after
Hurricane Ian. I've already met with FEMA
representatives, an initial meeting, before the
declaration was official, I received word this
week after the declaration emergency

declaration was actually implemented. Follow-
up meetings in terms of supplying to them the
documentation necessary to get reimbursed 75
percent of the cost for debris cleanup for
Hurricane Ian. One other note that's not on
your agenda, I was received a notice from
the Lowcountry Food Bank organization that they
will be donating food distribution on December
the 21st at the cul-de-sac from 4:00 to 6:00
p.m. from a food distribution truck. All
residents are eligible to receive for
distribution. Ms. Isom I think facilitated
this with Kari Hanna from the Low food bank,
and they will do this I think monthly starting
December the 21st. The last thing I had, been
asked by Ms. Mallett to read a proposal being
presented to the Council, if Council elects, it
will be on the agenda for formal approval at
the January meeting, but she asked me to read
this on her behalf this evening and it's
(inaudible). Atlantic Beach Gullah Geechee
Cultural and Nature Festival, the only Black-
owned incorporated oceanfront town on the East
Coast. We would like to schedule June 24th,
2023 from 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. in Atlantic

1	Beach to highlight the significance of Gullah
2	Geechee cultures and the wider African
3	diaspora. Gullah Geechee refers to the
4	descendants of enslaved individuals,
5	predominantly from West Africa, who retained
6	many of the their African traditions and
7	cultures because of their relative isolation
8	from the rest of the world. Also, the day will
9	feature amplified main stage and performers and
10	musicians, a vendor market with food vendors,
11	an arts and crafts station and will recreate
12	the punk patio style experience. We are
13	requesting the cul-de-sac on Main Street and
14	closure of up to 400 Block of 30th Avenue since
15	that is the central location where most of the
16	historical events have been held. We will
17	coordinate parking with private lots. Most
18	events will be free and open to the public,
19	anticipated participation will be 300 to 500
20	people with 10 to 15 vendors. We are
21	requesting police assistance, porta- potties
22	and increased trash cans. Sincerely, Patricia
