24	Council approved a bid of \$162,000 to Bliss
25	Construction, a playground entity out of

9	entire renovation of the playground facility.
10	Again, it will take about six to eight weeks to
11	fabricate the equipment before actual, physical

2	a parking lot so we have all these beautiful
3	plants and really we're not giving it to you,
4	we're asking for you all to please take it and
5	let it live on because we're really sad, you
6	know, and we would just it's the special
7	thing about it is that it's all native plants
8	that we all know like blanket flower, the dune
9	sunflower and the Muhly grass, and they have
10	had no pesticides so in the September and
11	October, you will have beautiful butterflies.
12	So anyway, if you'll let us, we would love to
13	bring it and create this relationship between
14	the two of us, and we appreciate it. Thank
15	you.
16	MAYOR EVANS: Thank you. I don't see Gloria. Is
17	Gloria Lance here?
