12	hearing regarding the budget approval for
13	fiscal year '22-'23 starting July 1st, 2022.
14	At our last meeting, budget hearing but
15	first, let me address one amendment to the
16	budget, Ms. Denise Gibson informed me the
17	\$25,000 grant we received for the soil
18	preservation needs to be recorded in this
19	fiscal year, current fiscal year, so \$25,000
20	will be added to the estimated close of the
21	budget on the year budget report for 2022, an
22	additional \$25,000 go in the record for that
23	grant. That grant is a reimbursable grant,
24	meaning that we will have to expend the funds,
25	and she's putting together a schedule of



1	payments that will be made under the grant
2	requirements in 2022, but the \$25,000 will be
3	credited in this current fiscal year so just
4	make a note on your budget. Also, at our last
5	budget hearing, there were questions raised by
6	the public that I wish to address. First of
7	all, Mr. McIver asked for information in
8	regards to staffing, the number of staff we
9	have and budgeted positions. Currently, we
10	have the Chief and one, two, three, four, five
11	officers budgeted for this and next fiscal
12	year. That does not include if we should be
13	fortunate enough to find any additional
14	officers, we will make a modification amendment
15	to the budget to obtain that. We currently
16	have four officers on two are in the process
17	of getting their certification in addition
18	to the Chief and cops. We have one court
19	clerk, one court court clerk and then one
20	administrative clerk, Cheryl Pereira. We have
21	a laborer/code enforcement position and one
22	other vacant maintenance position that is
23	unfilled. We posted for the position, have not
24	had a positive response. I would like to amend
25	that position to allow for either a contract



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1	employee or company to assist the Town with
2	town maintenance, lawn cutting and other
3	maintenance tasks within the town. So, those
4	are the positions that are budgeted for for
5	2022 and proposed for 2023. At our last
6	meeting, Ms. Cheatham raised questions on the
7	professional services line, what does that
8	consist of? The professional services line
9	consists of the salaries of the Town Manager,
10	our code enforcement officials, our auditors,
11	our accountant are all incorporated in that
12	line item. Again, Town Manager, the building
13	official, the accountant, fee accountant, and
14	also (inaudible) now, I don't know whether
15	I would have to double check unless there's
16	a separate line item, our court judge is also
17	paid for under that line item, \$1,250 (ph) a
18	month to operate our courts, so that consists
19	of the projected cost of 2,000 2022-2023
20	\$207,900. I think those were all of the
21	questions that were raised at the last budget
22	hearing, and I open the floor for any questions
23	from Council or public on the budget. Also
24	requested was a 3-year comparison (inaudible)
25	budget, which the public has, as well as

18		supplemental ability to contract with an
19		individual or a company to do (inaudible)
20		maintenance services, either/or, you with me?
21	MR.	SKETERS: Sure.
22	MR.	QUATTLEBAUM: Okay. Any other questions?
23		(Inaudible background noise.)
24	MAY	OR EVANS: Okay
25	MR.	QUATTLEBAUM: Just to state again for the



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1	record, this is one of the best fiscal years
2	that we've had in the Town of Atlantic Beach
3	probably in the last 20 years. As I indicated,
4	the only debt the Town has is the recent
5	purchase of two police vehicles, and we've been
6	able to have our audits completed successfully
7	for six consecutive years without any major
8	audit finds. Thank you, Mayor.

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1	five years that I've administered Bike Fest,
2	it's been able to operate on the net profits
3	from the prior years, and we anticipate a net
4	profit again in 2022. The total Bike Fest
5	expenditures to date is \$49,684.22. The
6	current projected net profit to date, which
7	will probably decrease, is \$31,831.59. So, I
8	do anticipate that number going down, factoring
9	in some other costs, overtime personnel costs
10	have not been factored in to these numbers so
11	I'm estimating that our net profit will be
12	in the ballpark between anywhere from 23 to
13	\$25,000 all said and done. So that money is in
14	a separate account and will be the seed money,
15	along with the prior year's net profit, I think
16	we made \$22,814, so combining whatever that
17	bottom line figure is what we'll be going forth
18	for 2023. Also like to report and thank, first
19	of all, Ms. Gibson, again, Denise Gibson for
20	passing at the last meeting a survey at the
21	last meeting. We had 14 responses, on a scale
22	of 1 to 10, 10 being excellent, the average
23	score was 7.38. The major items of concern,
24	number one, trash collection, traffic
25	management and parking I think are the two



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1	three major issues cited by the respondents to
2	the survey. The most attended and most popular
3	things were the Telling the Full Story, the
4	vending and neighborhood exhibits, and also the
5	Welcome Friends Neighborhood Back to Our
6	Community after COVID-19 got the highest
7	ratings. Overall, the question was asked,
8	would you recommend or invite your family and
9	friends to 2023 nine of the 14 said yes,
10	zero said no and one not sure. So that's the
11	results of the survey that was generated and
12	taken by resident participants at our last
13	June meeting. Again, overall, it was very
14	successful and I appreciate, again, the staff
15	and their support in getting putting on
16	another successful Bike Fest. Any questions,
17	Council, Mayor, anyone?
18	COUNCILMAN DeWITT: I'd like to say at the last
19	meeting, we did not acknowledge you and your
20	efforts, and we were remissed in doing that, so
21	I want to take this time to acknowledge you and
22	say thank you for the work that you did to make
23	Bike Fest a success.

My name is 14 Daniel Gaskins, and I am the owner of Lot 15 Number 9, which is located at the end of Tyson 16 and Ocean Boulevard. My reason for being here 17 is that we are in dispute of -- with how much 18 of that property I own. The last time I was 19 Ι qave pamphlets here, some out, some 20 literature out, indicating certain things on 21 the beach. I gave it to the Council, the Mayor 22 and (inaudible) the City Manager. I just --23 I'll be briefly -- brief, I just want to 24 illustrate a couple of things. I don't know 25 whether you guys still got your pamphlet or



1	not, but one of the things I want to illustrate
2	is the fact that my taxes on that property is
3	\$11,000 \$11,395, the taxes on Lot 8 is
4	\$4,000, the taxes on Lot 7 is \$3,000, the taxes
5	on Lot 6 is \$4,000 and the taxes on Lot 5 is
6	\$8,000. Now, according to the my tax
7	status, I am paying taxes on 0.35 acres. 0.35
8	acres. My lot is listed as being 103 foot
9	wide, 149 foot deep. If you do the math on
10	that, it comes to 0.35 acres. Now, the City
11	says I don't own the road. I went down to a
12	company at the (inaudible) beach, the
13	(inaudible) department (inaudible) and I'd like
14	for the City or the Town of Atlantic Beach to
15	give me a clear deed on the property that I
16	own. Now, if you're saying that 'cause the
17	City's saying that I don't own that property
18	and I've been paying tax on the property for
19	all these years, and my question is what am I
20	paying taxes on? 'Cause see, the County would
21	not bill you for property that you don't own.
22	My aunt, which was (inaudible) mother, built a
23	motel on our property approximately '53 to
24	somewhere between '53 and '55. That property
25	that motel stood on our property until



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1	approximately 2006 or 2007. Now, I wonder how
2	she got a building permit from the County and
3	from the City on some property that she didn't
4	own. I'm just suggesting that you take a look
5	at that and realize that something's wrong
6	here. Now, if I don't own the property, which
7	is the road, and the County says I do, then I
8	paid a lot of money that I need to receive
9	back, and so there's a lot of (inaudible) I
10	just wanted to bring it to the attention of
11	Council because I didn't want to litigate this
12	if possible because it's common sense here,
13	just saying, it's very common sense, that I own
14	that property. So, I'll close by saying, I
15	want the Council and the Mayor and the
16	Administrator to get together and get back to
17	me about this property because I've wasted a
18	lot of time and energy with it, and I'm sure
19	that I own that property (inaudible). Thank
20	you.
