23	Legislature South Carolina Business License
24	Ordinance. This ordinance makes the collection
25	of business license fees for all municipalities

1	in the State of South Carolina on a the same
2	date, May 1st, running through April 30th from
3	each year. Prior business license cycles ran
4	from July 1st of the year 'til June 30th.
5	We've gone over all of the basic changes to the
6	ordinance, the most significant being the
7	change in how business license fees are
8	computed, changing from a percentage based on
9	the type of business that's classified under
10	the federal Management and Budget
11	classification for all businesses must fall
12	under and, basically, it goes from a percentage
13	to a flat dollar amount, 28 per 1,000 after
14	deduction of \$2,000 of the gross income earned
15	by the business for that prior year. That is
16	a major change. And also, the penalties of 5
17	percent of 30 days of nonpayment until the
18	balance is paid, and considerable fines can be
19	levied or and even jail time if after 30
20	days is not complied with. Those are the major
21	changes to the Business License Ordinance.
22	Once Council has adopted the new Business
23	License Ordinance, the notices will go out to
24	all of the businesses in the Town of Atlantic
25	Beach letting them know how they can apply for

After March 23 31st, the fee increases by \$100 late fee. 24 We're posting the location for property owners 25 for vendors to contact you in terms of leasing

your property for Memorial Day weekend, and
that will give us if you'll report that
information to us or give us a gauge on how
many vendors are actually committed to coming
for Memorial Day weekend. So, with that
listing, once you have been contacted by a
prospective vendor, if you can turn that
information in as soon as possible, it will be
helpful to us to gauge what the participation
will be. The Chief of Police is hosting, as we
do every year, law enforcement who will be
involved with the planning and preparation for
Bike Fest weekend on April the 9th. And also,
the Chief, after that meeting, is hosting all
of the chiefs in the county to meet with them.
But we do our annual planning session on April
9th to prepare for Bike Fest weekend. With
that, that's as far and as much information as
we have in regards to Bike Fest at this time.

Playground Equipment, reported out I think last

1	month, we entered into a contract with Bliss
2	Products to construct the refurbishing of our
3	playground adjacent to the Community Center.
4	They are now in the process of ordering and
5	fabricating the playground equipment. We were
6	told about three weeks ago it would take six,
7	almost eight weeks, to get the materials to
8	start construction. I'm requesting we've
9	had a request on the part of Conway Christian
10	Academy LLC out of Conway to have the old
11	playground equipment donated, and a contractor
12	who sits on the board has agreed to remove the
13	old playground material at no cost to the Town
14	if Council, the other option is for us to
15	pay a contractor to remove it and possibly sell
16	it and get whatever we can as a return. If
17	Council agrees to donating the old equipment to
18	the Conway Christian Academy, LLC, the removal
19	will be at no cost, we will just have to hire
20	a contractor to remove the perimeter fencing
21	around the playground. So, I need what's
22	Council's pleasure? If you agree, I'd
23	recommend that we donate the equipment to the
24	Christian Academy with a hold harmless clause
25	to protect the Town in the event of any adverse

conditions after they receive the equipment.

COUNCILWOMAN GORE: I agree to giving -- to donate

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MAYOR EVANS: Right, that's fine with me.

COUNCILMAN DeWITT: Yeah, let's donate it.

MR. QUATTLEBAUM: All right, thank you. Also, we received a request -- the Board of Zoning Appeals has not been active since 2019. At this time, we -the Council will make a determination whether the Board will constitute three or five individuals based on the applications that we receive. You can pick up an application Town Hall or contact Cheryl, have it e-mailed to you or sent to you, and the applications -we would like to have them in by the end of the month, March, that Council can make SO determination and a selection by the April meeting, Council meeting. Going back to Bike

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Fest, a Dr. Darby, who is a property owner here on 30th Avenue, contacted me today and would like to offer -- he has a grant to do health screening, COVID testing and shots during Bike Fest weekend at no cost to the Town. He asked me to see if the Council would be interested in having a booth set up and his staff would administer COVID testing, shots and other If you screenings during Bike Fest weekend. have nо objections, I would (inaudible) authorization.

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Lastly, I'd like to give a report MR. QUATTLEBAUM: March grant update. KHAFRA, on the engineering firm out of Atlanta whom the Town hired, continues to aggressively -- reviewing evaluating infrastructure funding and opportunities for Atlantic Beach. The FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant application has been completed and submitted. In mid-February, the Department of Transportation issued a call for for the 2022 RAISE Discretionary proposals Grant program, also known as the Rebuilding

American Infrastructure and Sustainability
Equity Grant. This grant opportunity offers
communities like Atlantic Beach a unique
opportunity to update their transportation
infrastructure with an eye to the future. The
grant's merited valuation system focuses not
only on roads and bridges, but also emphasizes
sustainability, equity and resiliency. KHAFRA
Team and I have met with the South Carolina
Department of Transportation representative
days after the release of the bid instructions.
In fact, an Atlantic Beach team was the first
team to meet with the State DOT team. After
our meeting, they expressed full support of the
Atlantic Beach submission and will be
supportive of our efforts. In addition to the
extensive engineering data which KHAFRA is
developing now, an extensive cost benefit
analysis is required. This analysis is not as
a service offered by is not a service
offered by KHAFRA, the team has identified ESI
Consultants of Philadelphia to complete this
analysis. ESI has a successful experience in
RAISE bidding by partnering with developing
cost benefit analysis and successful

municipalities like Southern Pennsylvania;
Bucks County, Pennsylvania; Wilmington,
Delaware; and Riverfront Transportation
infrastructure projects awarded in 2021. The
RAISE Grant is due on April 14th, 2022. Our
request is for Council to authorize engagement
of a firm at the fee of a fee not to exceed
\$15,000 to develop the cost benefit analysis
for the Department of Transportation RAISE
Discretionary Grant application for Atlantic
Beach. I am seeking authorization to enter
negotiate with firms to provide the grant
application services for the Town of Atlantic
Beach at this time.
