#### Report:

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MR. QUATTLEBAUM: Mayor and Council, and residents, public, I would like to provide an update on the aftermath clean uр after hurricane Florence. As I hope most residents are aware, 30th initially we had a dumpster placed on Avenue for residents to bring yard debris to that location. And I have engaged a contractor to start the pickup of curbside debris removal, starting this Thursday. Formal notice will be sent out to all residents. If you can get the word out to the community for residents to have their yard debris only -- tree limbs, trees and any other yard debris created by the hurricane. curbside ΤО have it nо later than this Thursday. Contractors will pick up that yard debris Thursday, October the 4th. Any on questions, Council?

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Most most of -- I've toured the QUATTLEBAUM: Most of the residents have already put town. their debris curbside. The major challenge we are absentee property owners have and them being away and not being about to get their their debris to the curbside bv prop-Many of them, in our past experience Thursday. with hurricane Matthew, did not have adequate time to get down and have their debris brought curbside. I'm also considering -- this will be the first initial pass through bу contractor -- at a later date I'm looking at another pass through to give those property owners additional time to get their debris curbside.

MAYOR EVANS: Okay. If you all could pass the word οf the residents that to any you know. Absentee property owners, if they could possibly. Ιt would be very helpful and beneficial and effective and efficient to to get it out by the 4th. All of you may be that during the hurricane and heavy rains, that we've been experiencing

1	backup flooding on 30th Avenue at the cul-de-
2	sac. I've had the state DOT as well as the
3	County out to survey the problems and issues at
4	that location. They had crews out prior to the
5	hurricane to try to unstop or cl they
6	clogged the drain system. Long story short the
7	crews could not form the County could not
8	unstop it at that time. They're scheduled to
9	come back. They had some issues with getting
10	back here due to flooding based on where their
11	equipment is housed out in Conway and could not
12	get back. I'm looking to schedule another
13	date, hopefully before the end of this week or
14	early next week for the county crews to come
15	back out to address the problem. The long term
16	problem is that the outfall pipes from the
17	dunes to the ocean needs to be repaired.
18	They're scheduled to be done at the same time,
19	I think this winter. When North Myrtle Beach
20	had them servicing of their systems also.
21	Outfall systems. So, that is the situation.
22	It seems that any time we have a heavy rain,
23	that it backs up. We've been making the effort
24	to have it pumped out as much as possible.
