report. First of all, I'd like to thank all of

the residents, the property owners, the staff,

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1	our police officers, Council for your support
2	for a successful 2019 Bike Fest. Based on
3	police reports, the crowd size on
4	Saturday/Sunday, was estimated to over 20,000
5	participants. We had this year, 57 total
6	vendors. 65 last year. Down somewhat from
7	last last year. The positive is that we had
8	17 new vendors to register this year. Most of
9	the vendors were food vendors. About 35, I
10	think. And about 17 retail vendors. Retail
11	vendors have been steadily decreasing. A lot
12	of theories in regards to that. But based on
13	the marketing and advertisement, the public
14	attendance and the attraction of new vendors
15	in my opinion was very successful. We did not
16	have any major events. I mean issues, during
17	the weekend. Overall the vendors based on
18	their response to me were very satisfied
19	with the event. And overall I think it went
20	pretty well in terms of its attendance.
21	Participation, vendor participation,
22	entertainment. There were some concerns around
23	the music at one point which we addressed
24	with the promoter. He had addressed them and
25	we will continue to address them in the future.

1 COUNCILWOMAN GORE: Yes.

MR. QUATTLEBAUM: No. I don't have the exact number. But not only the Town, but all of the residents and properties power poles had to be inspected also. I don't have an exact number.

COUNCILWOMAN GORE: Okay. All right. Okay.

MR. QUATTLEBAUM: Based on the success of the Bike Fest 2019, item C on the agenda. The Town of Atlantic Beach with the promoter, who promoted this years entertainment, is proposing -- or would like to make a proposal for a Labor Day weekend Festival. The Good Time Festival for Labor Day weekend. It is a one day event to start. With the objective to try to make it a full weekend festival. The promoter has provided a ---

MR. QUATTLEBAUM: A basic read. Basically what he is proposing, is a Monday festival. R&B, Jazz, Blues, Hip-Hop, DJ tarking -- targeting ages 25 and above. Featuring vendors and our food trucks. The target market is South Carolina,

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North Carolina, Virginia and Georgia. The intent is to build the event to a three day festival. Ocean front property at the cul-desac -- where the stage was this year -- would be the site location. Facing again, diagonally towards baywatch. The promoter is proposing to handle all security costs, port-a-johns costs, lighting, fencing barricades, sound, insurance. His full staff, all entertainment costs, all marketing costs, food trucks, vendors, a cash bar and clean up. Doesn't have specific numbers. But with -- he's seeking authorization to put together а financial proposal and the approval for -- of the town -to move forward with planning such an event for Labor Day weekend. Again August 31st, Saturday. From the hours of 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m.

don't think we as Council have enough
information on this yet to make a decision as
to whether we want to go forward with this or
not. Certainly something that I think we need

to have more discussion before we decide that this is what we want to do.

MAYOR EVANS: Yeah. So we can kind of give him the authorization to kind of look into it and bring us back more information before we kinda ---

COUNCILWOMAN GORE: The manager, yes.

MAYOR EVANS: Okay. You got that; right?

MR. QUATTLEBAUM: Yes, sir.

MAYOR EVANS: Okay.

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MR. QUATTLEBAUM: Just two more items. One, the those freedom readers program -- for all community people who don't know -- the school system has set up and tudor program during the fall season this year, here at the community center. 12 tudors and 12 resident students participated in the fall program. asking to extend the program through the summer, starting on June the 18th. They have 12 tudors that will be coming here volunteering to work with residents of the town tudor our children from hours of 10:30 to 12:00 noon. Through August, I think the 18th, is the time frame. And they're looking to start the meetings with their volunteers initial and

teachers on the 6th of June. And the actual
program they'll be recruiting in community
to get students to sign up and be involved in
the tudoring program through the summer August
the 18th. Any questions. While we were in the
meeting, I just received an email report
through the participation through the fall. I
don't have didn't have time to read it. But
it gave me some numbers and demographic
information on participation of our residents
here in the town in the program. The final
thing I have, Mayor, a letter that was
addressed to you by Ms. Delma Thompson. Wanted
to donate a bench in honor of her relative to
be constructed in the Town of Atlantic Beach.
And she would defray the cost in memory of one
of her loved ones. I can provide more detail
to the Council. But she's seeking approval to
donate a memorial bench in the town.
Potentially down at the cul-de-sac area.

COUNCILWOMAN GORE: James Lewis.

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James Lewis has cleaned. He cleaned as MS. BOOKER: the Bike Fest was going. The people that got this contract acted like they did not care and they probably don't because this is not their beach. And I don't think that we should always look at the dollars. I think we should look at the people who -- who do quality work. You're always going to get what you pay for. And when I approached this gentleman about coming around to 29th Street, he was very argumentative with Telling me that he's not responsible for me. trash that the wind blows. He's not responsible for trash on the housing the

lots where houses are. That's not true. That trash wasn't there before Bike Fest and he is And Mr. Quattlebaum did take care responsible. of it and he did come around. But we shouldn't through that. have to qo I'm going to be quick. The next thing is, there's some work that's being done at the French Quarter -- the French old Ouarter and it is $m \vee$ understanding that when there's work of that caliber going on, there should be a dumpster. And they've not had one. They're laying all of their stuff down on the ground. And I don't think that acceptable.
