which is on 30th Avenue. Most of you are
familiar with that area. Books will be open
for filing from August 23rd, 2019 ad 12:00
o'clock noon and remain open during regular
business hours and close on September 6th, 2019
at 12:00 o'clock noon. The filling fee for

Mayor is \$50. Councilmember fee, \$25. And the unexpired Councilmember term is \$25. It is a Nonpartisan Election and no party affiliation shall be placed on the ballot. The polls shall open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 7:00 p.m. Αt 7:00 p.m. on said election day, the election commissioners will begin to examine the absentee ballot and return envelopes. This examination will be held at the community center. On November 7th, at 10:00 a.m. at the Town of Atlantic Beach community center, the Municipal Election Commission with hold hearing to determine the validity of ballots challenged in this election. 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MR. **OUATTLEBAUM:** Mayor and Council, at the July 23rd meeting, Council authorized the Mayor and myself to enter into negotiations for the acquisition of the property on 3000 30th Avenue South and Highway 17. We had one initial meeting with the realtor/representative Elliott Realtor and indicated to him that the constraints the town is under in terms of the approval, not to pay more than fair price for the property. We indicated to him at that time that the figure of \$91,000 would not be agreed to and left it in his court to seek a counter proposal for the sale of the property from his owners. From the owners. That is the status of where we are at this particular time. Any question, Council?

$\operatorname{}$ one of the suggestions made by one of the
youngest members of the town community, Ms.
Taylor's granddaughter and also Mr.
Montgomery has consistently asked me to make
improvements to the playground area adjacent to
the community center. I received a notice from
the Waccamaw-Cobb, that there are available
CDBG funds to be a application that are due
September the 26th. Based on some of the
larger items recommended by residents of
capital improvements from sidewalks, street-
scape the number of other improvements. My
conversation with Mr. Brigman from Waccamaw-
Cobb, given the time constraint that we have in
submitting the application that he recommended
and I am recommending to Council that we submit
an application by September the 26th for full
funding of the referbization of our playground
facility. As I indicated at the last meeting,
I had already ordered based on a donation and
contribution from the Lynx no, not Lynx. I
can't think of the name. A public group two
years ago did a fund raiser, donated some
funds. The merry-go-round is on order, due to
be delivered here on August the 12th. And

subsequently my conversations with Mr. Rigley and the timing of us putting an application -- which they will take the lead on for putting the application together -- we concluded that given our time constraint, our best option is to go for a grant. CDBG grant to fund the refurbishment of our playground facility. Any questions, Council?

resolution and make me official, that's fine.
But if you don't, that's fine also. No
problem. And I want to step back and I want to
thank all y'all for y'all's service for the
Town of Atlantic Beach. I want to welcome the
new police officer to this Town of Atlantic
Beach. I didn't get your name, but I'm quite
sure we'll being seeing each other in the Town
of Atlantic Beach. Anyway it appears to me in
some cases that we are going in private
direction. And in other cases, it appears to
me also that we have ourselves in reverse gear
just a bit. It's not saying that we I know
we can do better. We have the expertise to do
better. We have the qualifications. And most
of all, we have the love for Atlantic Beach to

do better and it's up to all of us to make this city what it ought to be. And now, what I'm asking is to make this thing official, just let me know. I can take it. I'm ex-GI, I can take I had some hard knock. But anyway, I want it. thank y'all for listening. Just some unfinished business that we need to start taking care of. Thank vou.
