See the dark blue? All of that is WF2 currently under the December approval. the approval for December, MS2 for the location coming down from 29th in the orange I guess -or I guess you call that burnt brown -- MS2 areas, okay? That's the current zoning -- MS2. If you come over to ---

And again, I'm not being a hardball, I'm not going against those people. You all can put them in office for 20 years if you want. But I just think that somehow, some way, it should be made known that these positions are open. And I understand the Town people and stuff, but that's not going -what's gonna help us grow. What's gonna help

us grow is coming together as a business and a unified body. I'm not coming, again, against you all, but we've gotta start doing this the right way. No one even knew these positions were open. It wasn't even advertised. Mr. Q, did you put anything out that these positions was open?
