

# THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA



## BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS, A petition was filed on the 21st day of April A. D. 19 65, by ten freehold electors in the precinct in which the town of Atlantic Beach is situated, setting forth the corporate limits, the number of inhabitants of the proposed town, and that they desired to be incorporated.

AND WHEREAS, A commission was issued on the 7th day of May A. D. 19 66 to Emery Gore, Gladys G. Murray and Millard Rucker

empowering them to appoint managers to hold the election, and to have them to certify the result under oath to the Secretary of State.

AND WHEREAS, Emery Gore, Gladys G. Murray and Millard Rucker managers of election duly appointed to hold the election for the purpose of determining the incorporation of the town of Atlantic Beach did, on the 14th day of June 19 66, file with the Secretary of State a written declaration of the result of said election under oath signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: In favor of corporation.

SECOND: The name of the proposed town to be Atlantic Beach, South Carolina

THIRD: That Emery Gore

was duly elected Intendant, and Lee Grant Gore, Millard Rucker, Daniel Gore and John Mark Simmons were elected Wardens.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. Frank Thornton, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority vested in me by an Act of the General Assembly, entitled "An Act to Provide for the Incorporation of Towns of Less Than One Thousand Inhabitants," do hereby issue to the Intendant and Wardens elect this Certificate of Incorporation, with the privileges, powers and immunities, and subject to the limitations prescribed in the said Act.
