18	done an outstanding job of positioning the Town
19	to apply for these grant funds. They have been
20	working tirelessly around the clock, she's
21	working with me on the weekends, Saturdays and
22	Sundays, to get prepared to apply for these
23	funds. Let me just read in terms of a report
24	giving Council and the public an update on the
25	activities of KHAFRA and the team of



1	individuals that have been working so
2	diligently. Our relationship with KHAFRA
3	Engineering continues to allow the Town to
4	aggressively review, evaluate and submit
5	applications for proposals for infrastructure
6	funding opportunities. As I shared in March,
7	with KHAFRA engineering and design support,
8	number one, an application was has been
9	submitted telling the full history presentation
10	(inaudible) with the National Historic Trust
11	and Historic Preservation
12	(Inaudible background noise.)
13	MR. QUATTLEBAUM: and create historic beach
14	(Inaudible background noise.)
15	COUNCILWOMAN GORE: Can you all mute your all's
16	phones? Can you all mute your all's phones,
17	please? Thank you.
18	FEMALE SPEAKER: I mean I can look it up. I just

20	MR. QUATTLEBAUM: More news is expected this month
21	on that Historic Preservation Grant award.
22	FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant was completed and
23	submitted. Award news is expected in mid

4	Park Service to fund a historic survey of
5	Atlantic Beach and, if appropriate, application
6	for National Historic Registry. Since our
7	March meeting, the Town has submitted requests
8	with detailed engineering information for
9	infrastructure funding from Horry County
10	planning team and from the State of South
11	Carolina House of Representatives. KHAFRA team
12	is in the final stages of preparing a response
13	to the Department of Transportation 2022 RAISE
14	Discretionary Grant Program, also known as
15	Rebuilding American Infrastructure
16	Sustainability Equity Grant Discretionary
17	Program, that's the acronym for RAISE. This
18	grant opportunity offers communities like
19	Atlantic Beach a unique opportunity to update
20	their transportation infrastructure with an eye
21	to the future. The grant merit evaluation
22	system focused not only on roads and bridges,
23	but also emphasizes sustainability, equity and
24	resiliency. The design being presented to the
25	Department of Transportation includes



1	improvements along Highway 17, 30th Avenue and
2	to South Ocean Boulevard. Improvements
3	proposed include updates to the roadways,
4	sideways sidewalks, parking, and including
5	installing electric vehicle parking stations at
6	part of the paid parking grid being designed.
7	New walking paths, beach access points, bike
8	lanes will be installed along South Ocean
9	Boulevard, 30th Avenue South. The current
10	walking paths between North Myrtle Beach, the
11	Town at both the north and south ends, will be
12	made safer for pedestrians. The due date for
13	submission of this grant application, RAISE
14	Grant application, is April the 14th. As I
15	shared last month, in addition to extensive
16	engineering data, KHAFRA has developed an
17	extensive cost benefit analysis as required for
18	successful submission of the Department of
19	Transportation RAISE Grant. This analysis is
20	not a service offered by KHAFRA. Your approval
21	last month for me to research a company to do
22	this work resulted in the team being contacted
23	with by the following companies, these are
24	the companies that submitted a response to a
25	request to prepare the RAISE Grant formal

5	MR. QUATTLEBAUM: not do the grant due to her
6	workload. Heather Maloney, Alta Planning and
7	Design, Charlotte, North Carolina served as the
8	(inaudible) for the Spartanburg, South Carolina
9	successful application. The cost of this type
10	support ranges from \$15,000 to \$25,000. They
11	did not have the capacity to take on us for
12	this site, they had already determined their
13	client list for spring 2022 RAISE Grant cycle.
14	Peter Angelis DIS referred by Alta Planning and
15	Design has a proven track record of winning
16	RAISE Grants. We have only engaged them to
17	complete the cost benefit analysis. The
18	(inaudible) proposal, engineering and pricing
19	is being completed by KHAFRA and the Town
20	support team. The team has identified ESI
21	Consulting from Philadelphia to complete this
22	analysis. ESI has successful experience with
23	the RAISE bid by partnering with the developing
24	cost benefit analysis with successful
25	municipalities like Southern Pennsylvania;



1	Monks County, Pennsylvania; Wilmington,
2	Delaware; Riverfront transportation and
3	infrastructure projects in 2021 award cycle.
4	The RAISE Grant is due April the 14th, 2022.
5	My request is that the Council authorize to
6	engage ESI Consulting at a fee not to exceed
7	the fee of \$15,000 to develop cost benefit
8	analysis for the Department of Transportation
9	RAISE Discretionary Grant application for
10	Atlantic Beach. Any questions in regards to a
11	request for approval?

6	MAYOR EVANS: And we're down to the Manager's
7	Report. Was that it, Ben? You've got some
8	other stuff to report here?
9	MR. QUATTLEBAUM: Yes. Mayor, Council and public,
10	an update on Bike Fest. We have seen a strong
11	response and registration over the first
12	several weeks for Bike Fest, more than usual.
13	Paid the registrations and commitments to
14	property owners to lease their property during
15	Bike Fest is very encouraging at this point.
16	The deadline for registration without any
17	penalty was March the 31st. After that, a \$100
18	late fee will be assessed to all registrants
19	after that time. But we have seen an uptick
20	and of registration as well as interest in
21	participating in Bike Fest 2022. On April the
22	13th, Chief Robinson will be hosting, as we do
23	every year, the police two meetings, one,
24	he'll be hosting all of the chiefs of police in
25	the county for meeting and also our annual



1	meeting in preparation for Bike Fest 2022 to go
2	over logistics, deployment and all of the
3	factors that are necessary to provide security
4	for that date. We are looking at the bids.
5	Proposal has been out for cleanup. It is due
6	April 7th
7	FEMALE SPEAKER: 6th.
8	MR. QUATTLEBAUM: 6th?
9	FEMALE SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
10	MR. QUATTLEBAUM: April 6th, the response is due for
11	
12	FEMALE SPEAKER: At 4:00 p.m at 2:00 p.m.
13	MR. QUATTLEBAUM: 2:00 p.m. on the 6th,
14	proposals are due for cleanup. We're assessing
15	our costs for all of the administrative
16	overhead, lighting to port-o-johns and making
17	commitments and assessments to do that. I want
18	to encourage all residents and property owners
19	who plan to lease their property, if they need
20	to utilize any electrical power poles, to have
21	their information submitted for inspection by a
22	building inspector or an electrician and also
23	have your paperwork in to Santee Cooper
24	COUNCILWOMAN GORE: Santee Cooper.
25	MR. QUATTLEBAUM: yeah, prior to. We don't want



1	residents to wait 'til the week of Bike Fest to
2	do so. We ran into two years ago, Santee
3	Cooper refusing to come out during that week
4	so, if anyone requires and has a power pole
5	that needs to be activated, it needs to be
6	inspected, approved, prior to utilization so I
7	encourage you to do that as quickly as you can.
8	Any other residents who are interested in
9	leasing their property, please share that
10	information with Cheryl so she can put it
11	online for potential vendors that are still
12	calling and looking for vendor spots to operate
13	during Memorial Day weekend. Also, next week
14	is the cleanup campaign week, I think a flyer's
15	gone out, Beautification Committee initiating a
16	cleanup campaign for the week. There will be
17	three dumpsters placed in the town, one on this
18	side of town and two on the east side of town
19	for household items only, no yard debris or
20	things of that nature, just household items to
21	be dispensed in those dumpsters for the week,
22	it'll run from Monday to Monday?
23	MS. BOOKER: Yes.
24	MR. QUATTLEBAUM: Monday to Monday. Mayor, that's
25	all I have. Any questions?



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MAYOR EVANS: Any questions, Council?

2 COUNCILWOMAN GORE: I've got one question, and this is for the Chief. Chief, this year, will they 3 4 be doing the -- last year -- not -- well, last 5 year we had -- we went around the street at the 6 end of the night -- and I've been to a lot of 7 festivals, all over the country, I have never 8 seen nobody get rid of the people off the beach 9 like they were actually animals. Those 10 policemen were behind the people as they were 11 leaving off of the beach and they were not able 12 to turn around, didn't -- everybody was -- the 13 police cars, like they were just being put out 14 of there like animals and stuff. I don't think that was right, I honestly don't, because we 15 16 should be able to tell our vendors that we're 17 shutting down at a certain time and they start 18 doing like that and then maybe how they used to 19 do it, the police just go by and tell all the 20 vendors, and they might even say something on 21 the horn that the Town will be closing down at 22 so-and-so time. I don't think that was done 23 right, how -- I don't think -- it was like --24 they may have well been on horses and stuff 25 behind those people how they were doing, we're



1	hitting them with whips, that's how it appeared
2	to me so therefore, I just think we don't have
3	to I don't think we have to (inaudible) them
4	like that, I've never seen it like that before.
5	POLICE CHIEF ROBINSON: On that, we try I'm just
6	gonna be frank for a moment (ph). We try to be
7	gentle with people and tell them that the
8	Town's shutting down, they don't listen. They
9	refuse to go. So but we don't put our hands
10	on nobody. The most of the time we have the
11	Highway Patrol and DNR with their 4-wheelers,
12	they'll be behind, just to make sure
13	everybody's still going the same way.
14	Everybody'll still be respectful to everybody.
15	Since I've took over, I think we've been at one
16	arrest throughout the whole Bike Week Fest so
17	for the most part, everybody respects us
18	when we when they hear but at 2:00
19	o'clock, we tell the vendors and they shut down
20	at 2:00 o'clock.
21	COUNCILWOMAN GORE: Well, it's 3:00 o'clock.
22	POLICE CHIEF ROBINSON: Yeah, I mean I know this
23	year, I'm talking about the past. We tell them
24	at 2:00 o'clock. 2:10, we walk past them, we
25	go back, they're still selling food, they're



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1	letting people circle back around and serve the
2	food. So, all this stuff we're paying for,
3	there's more manpower with that the Town's
4	gonna be paying for because the officers are
5	still out because now we've got to circle back
6	around and make sure everybody leaves on time.
7	I would love for vendors to shut down at the
8	time and move forward, but in reality it don't
9	work that way. You have to we don't push
10	put our hands on nobody, but you have to almost
11	kinda push people in a polite way and say, hey,
12	you've got to keep moving, and that's what we
13	do. We don't we don't spray nobody, we
14	don't yell at nobody, but we do push them, we
15	when people see blue lights and stuff, they
16	move a whole lot faster than if somebody says
17	hey, sir, the Town is closing down. We all
18	know it don't work that simple. Now, when you
19	see blue lights behind you, your antenna goes
20	up a little bit more and you say, well hey,
21	they're for real, they want to shut down. The
22	guys that've been coming here been coming here
23	for plenty of years, all officers, so we've
24	never really had a problem here
25	COUNCILWOMAN GORE: Yeah, we



POLICE CHIEF ROBINSON: --- I hate that it seems that way, but, from being inside, it's frankly not that way, but you have to -- if we sit back until they move, we'll still be out there at 6:00 o'clock, trying to wait for everybody to leave.

7 COUNCILWOMAN GORE: But I -- apparently, it's not a 8 problem with nobody else so I'm gonna let it 9 die. It's just to me, for the record, I think 10 it's wrong but I'm gonna let it die since 11 nobody else don't have a problem with it so 12 therefore, carry on.

POLICE CHIEF ROBINSON: Also, while I'm up here, I know our festival lasted three -- for anybody that gets an alcohol license, you have to stop selling at 2:00 p. -- 2:00 a.m., that is state law, can't sell past 2:00. I know that our festival went from 2:00 to 3:00 this year ---

19 COUNCILWOMAN GORE: Uh-huh.

20 POLICE CHIEF ROBINSON: --- but alcohol sales have 21 to stop at 2:00, and SLED will be enforcing 22 that. And if any of you -- anybody's got 23 vendors that's on their property, let them know 24 because that fine is like \$1,500, the first 25 time, it's not ---



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ATLANTIC BEACH TOWN COUNCIL MEETING 23 (Inaudible background noise.) 1 2 POLICE CHIEF ROBINSON: --- it's 15 then the second time, I think it's like \$3,000. It doubles 3 4 each time so I know nobody wants to get that 5 kinda fine. 6 MAYOR EVANS: Chief, let me ask you this 'cause I 7 heard you say that the Town shuts down, but the 8 Town doesn't actually shut down. 9 COUNCILWOMAN GORE: That's right. 10 MAYOR EVANS: We still have -- and I asked you that in the form of a question because what do we do 11 12 if after that hour some people choose to go to 13 Thee DollHouse or one of these businesses over 14 here, and then you've got Off The Hoof down the 15 street, they're a business that operates anyway 16 after -- and I understand what you're SO 17 saying, when you say the Town closes down, you 18 mean the vendors have to shut down at that 19 particular time ---20 Well ---POLICE CHIEF ROBINSON: 21 MAYOR EVANS: --- but if people want to attend 22 another business in the Town of Atlantic Beach, 23 how does that work? 24 POLICE CHIEF ROBINSON: Since I took over and before 25 I came here, when the festival ended, they've



1	always been on that side of the highway. On
2	the other side on the beach (inaudible) that
3	side always shuts down, even Off The Hook, they
4	always shut down at 2:00. I don't and I
5	know a lot of people say, well, if it wasn't
