therefore be resolved that the town of Atlantic
Beach authorizes the Town Manager to enter into
an agreement with the Municipal Association of
South Carolina for the collection of debt owed
the town of Atlantic Beach. We further resolve
that the town of Atlantic Beach indemnifies the
Municipal Association of South Carolina to the
extent permitted by law against any injury,
action, liabilities or proceedings arising from
the performance under the Setoff Debt
Provision.

Just in case I don't get to the meeting, Gullah Geechee made \$22,235.74. Our expenses so far are \$13,271.47. We now have a balance of \$8,974.27 with a few more expenses pending. As you may recall I previously reported that the Horry County was awarded an unprecedented Counties Communities Grant by the National Park Service on behalf of Atlantic Beach to complete a submission of our designation to the National Registry οf This Historic Places. grant supports the overall Horry County Historic Preservation Plan t.he Atlantic Strategic and Beach Comprehensive Plan. Ι am pleased to share tonight that Chronological Heritage has selected to compete -- complete our town survey I am also pleased to for this submission. announce that this selection was made with two Atlantic Beach residents serving as member of the selection committee. Now the work begins. Chronicle Heritage will be conducting field work in Atlantic Beach which will be documenting Atlantic Beach history for its submission. There will be included two parts,

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physical individual interviews, reviews of structures in the town, which are more than 50 years old. The individual interviews will take place on August 10th here at the community the center. Because of importance οf the project to our town, our Mayor will kick interview process. Photographers and historians will be conducting structural reviews in Atlantic Beach from August 14th to August 16th. Chronicle employees will with identifiable vests and identification You may observe them discussing the cards. structures, taking photographs of structures, questions they may even ask about structures. (Inaudible) Graham, Linda Cheatham and Ms. Pat Malett are available to answer any questions about this process. Last thing I have, Mayor, on my report, I wanted to inform the Mayor, Council and the Public that the town of Atlantic Beach did receive reimbursement for Hurricane Ian. Initially they said we would receive 75 percent of the amount expended. received 100 percent to the total of \$9,885 reimbursed for all of our expenses for debris removal after Hurricane Ian. We received it in

1 June. Just wanted to report that.
