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1 Call to Order:

2 **MAYOR EVANS:** This Town Council Special Budget  
3 meeting is called to order this Wednesday, May  
4 15, year 2024 at 2:00 p.m. Roll call.

5 **CLERK:** Councilman Edward Campbell? Mayor Pro Tem  
6 Josephine Isom?

7 **MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:** Here.

8 **CLERK:** Councilwoman Jacqueline Gore?

9 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Here.

10 **CLERK:** Councilman John David? Mayor Jake Evans?

11 **MAYOR EVANS:** Here. Council, has anyone heard from  
12 the other Council members or you -- at all?

13 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** No.

14 **MAYOR EVANS:** Okay. Council, seek a motion to go  
15 into Executive Session for the budget ---

16 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** So moved.

17 **MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:** Second.

18 **MAYOR EVANS:** There's a motion and second on the  
19 floor to go into Executive Session for the  
20 budget meeting. Any other questions or  
21 comments? Roll call.

22 **CLERK:** Mayor Pro Tem Josephine Isom?

23 **MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:** Yea.

24 **CLERK:** Councilwoman Jacqueline Gore?

25 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Yea.



1 **CLERK:** Mayor Jake Evans?

2 **MAYOR EVANS:** Yea. The motion's granted, Executive  
3 Session.

4 **Executive Session:**

5 (Executive Session.)

6 **MAYOR EVANS:** Council, I seek a motion to come out  
7 of Executive Session into the Special Session.

8 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** So moved.

9 **MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:** Second.

10 **MAYOR EVANS:** Motion and a second to come out of the  
11 Executive Session into the Special Session.  
12 Any other questions or comments? Roll call.

13 **CLERK:** Mayor Pro Tem Josephine Isom?

14 **MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:** Yea.

15 **CLERK:** Councilwoman Jacqueline Gore?

16 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Yea.

17 **CLERK:** Mayor Jake Evans?

18 **MAYOR EVANS:** Yea. The motion's granted.

19 **Special Session:**

20 **MAYOR EVANS:** I want to take this time to welcome  
21 the general public and ask at this time if you  
22 have any pagers or phones that might disrupt  
23 the proceedings, silence those for us at this  
24 time please. And if you would, stand for a  
25 moment of silence.



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(Moment of Silence.)

**MAYOR EVANS:** And now, we'll -- Pledge of Allegiance.

(Pledge of Allegiance recited in unison.)

**MAYOR EVANS:** Council, we're down to approval of the agenda, seek a motion for the approval of the agenda ---

**MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:** So ---

**CLERK:** Mayor Pro Tem Josephine Isom?

**MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:** Yea.

**CLERK:** Councilwoman Jacqueline Gore?

**COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Yea.

**CLERK:** Mayor Jake Evans?

**MAYOR EVANS:** Yea. The motion is granted for the approval of the agenda. We're down to Old Business, we have none.

**New Business:**

**MAYOR EVANS:** New Business, our budget meeting. For the public, we'll be having our budget meeting on Monday, May the 20th at 11:00 a.m. We're down to Bike Fest briefing and Town Manager, Orton Bellamy, will kind of give us a briefing on the Bike Fest.

**MR. BELLAMY:** Good evening. How's everybody doing?

(Inaudible background noise.)



1     **MR. BELLAMY:** First of all, I would like to share  
2                   with the Mayor and the Town of Atlantic Beach  
3                   Council members my observations in being on the  
4                   job for the last -- what is it, three days now?  
5                   Now, off and running. What -- my observation  
6                   is that the subsequent evaluation of the  
7                   employees here, you have a phenomenal staff  
8                   here. They are technically proficient in their  
9                   jobs, very knowledgeable in their jobs, self-  
10                  service, duty, resilience, technically  
11                  efficient in interpersonal skills, mission  
12                  accomplishments, orientation and initiative;  
13                  most important is (inaudible) is the ability to  
14                  work together as a team, okay? And where they  
15                  -- and when we provided them information, their  
16                  immediate response and work as a team and they  
17                  are very turnaround task oriented, okay? So,  
18                  your -- you planned and execute (inaudible)  
19                  simple as that. You can plan all day, if you  
20                  don't execute the mission, you're not  
21                  accomplishing anything. But you have a staff  
22                  that is well -- it's a well-trained -- and I'm  
23                  very impressed with it, I look forward to  
24                  working with them. Thank you. Thank you for  
25                  working with me the last three or four days I



1 (inaudible) things to do (inaudible) mission  
2 that was very important to show that  
3 initiative. Typically the environment you're  
4 working in ---

5 (Inaudible background noise.)

6 **MR. BELLAMY:** --- straight line so if you stay  
7 focused on your mission and your task. I  
8 appreciate that and will be (inaudible) as we  
9 move forward. At our staff meeting, each  
10 individual staff member provided a briefing for  
11 the Bike Festival and I'll call up the staff  
12 member to do the presentation. We'll start  
13 with Ms. Cheryl Pereira.

14 **CLERK:** All right. (Inaudible.) Bike Fest 2024 is  
15 (inaudible) May the 24th ---

16 **MAYOR EVANS:** Cheryl, you might want to get the mike  
17 a little closer.

18 **CLERK:** Can you hear me now?

19 **MAYOR EVANS:** Real good now, loud and clear.

20 **CLERK:** Greetings to all. Bike Fest 2024 is next  
21 week, May the 24th to the 27th. Property  
22 owners can come to the office and fill out a  
23 permit to furnish temporary service and  
24 (inaudible) inspector so Santee Cooper can come  
25 in early and turn on the power for their pole.



1 Residential passes will be available on Monday,  
2 May the 20th at Town Hall for pickup and  
3 throughout the week. Residents who call in to  
4 ask where they can park their vehicles after  
5 returning to their residence after work can  
6 contact Michael Gore at (843) 663-2284.  
7 Property owners fill out their property owner's  
8 registration form and their contact information  
9 is posted on the Town's website for the vendors  
10 and -- for the vendors for rental space. All  
11 information for Bike Fest 2024 is posted on the  
12 Town's website for vendors and the public.  
13 DHEC is requesting that all food vendors -- the  
14 food vendors list -- (inaudible) listed two  
15 weeks before the festival and I will continue  
16 to update the list as food vendors coming. We  
17 -- at this time, we have 17 food vendors and  
18 one retail vendor. As most vendors come in, I  
19 -- in the week of Bike Fest, as they do every  
20 year. Okay?

21 **MAYOR EVANS:** Thank you, Cheryl.

22 **CLERK:** Any questions or ---

23 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

24 **MR. BELLAMY:** Next briefing, Chief Carlos Costello.

25 **(Inaudible background noise.)**





1 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** All right, good afternoon,  
2 Council.

3 **IN UNISON:** Good afternoon.

4 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** So, for Bike Week, we use  
5 the (inaudible) here to make sure everybody's  
6 safe in the community first off and then the  
7 patrons here. We're expecting a large crowd so  
8 we have a good amount of law enforcement coming  
9 in from different agencies, helping us out, and  
10 I just want to reassure you guys that you have  
11 nothing to worry about and, you know, we -- our  
12 main goal and our focus is to make sure  
13 everybody's safe and nothing happens. Just in  
14 case we have some sort of catastrophe, we'll  
15 have plenty of agencies here so we'll be able  
16 to tackle anything that comes our way, and  
17 we're gonna have a -- I -- we're gonna have an  
18 after-action review after the Bike Fest so  
19 we're able to fix anything. We encourage the  
20 Town, the community, to put in suggestions,  
21 that way we get better off every year and make  
22 things safer and easier for everybody but ...  
23 Does anybody have any questions?

24 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

25 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** Yes, ma'am?



1 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Just wanted to confirm that curfew  
2 is 2:30 a.m.

3 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** It -- I believe it is --  
4 2:30, is that correct?

5 **IN UNISON:** 3:00 o'clock.

6 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** 3:00 a.m. 3:00 a.m., yes,  
7 ma'am.

8 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Okay. And so the safety and  
9 (inaudible) the various agencies will be there?

10 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** We will be notifying them of  
11 the time, give them at least like a 15-minute  
12 window to start packing their stuff away and,  
13 after that, we'll start taking action.

14 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** But the other agencies that you're  
15 gonna work with, they will be there at 3:00  
16 a.m. each night?

17 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** Yes, ma'am.

18 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Thank you.

19 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** Yes, ma'am.

20 **MR. BELLAMY:** You want to go over the agencies that  
21 are a part of this?

22 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** Yeah. So, the agencies  
23 coming will be Lake City Police Department,  
24 there will be South Carolina Highway Patrol,  
25 there will be SLED, there will be South



1 Carolina DNR, Horry County Police Department  
2 will be in the area as well. We'll have the  
3 Fire Department here. We'll have EMS stationed  
4 as well. And we -- all assistance, anything,  
5 they're helping us out and we greatly  
6 appreciate them for coming out here and helping  
7 us. Yes, ma'am?

8 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Just since this is my first  
9 experience dealing with the vendors, you know,  
10 and I've been dealing with Mike and he's  
11 phenomenal. Just a question in terms of the  
12 food vendors, when they bring a truck, will  
13 they get some kind of parking pass, like how  
14 did they -- how would all your entities know  
15 that they're coming in?

16 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** They're gonna have a permit  
17 I believe. They're gonna have a vendor permit  
18 ---

19 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** That goes in their vehicle, right?

20 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** Correct. So they'll know  
21 who to let in, the residents will have the  
22 passes to come into town, to their homes, in  
23 and out, and they'll be able to come and go as  
24 they please.

25 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Okay. And they pick that up at the



1 Town Hall?

2 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** Yes, ma'am.

3 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Thank you.

4 (Inaudible background noise.)

5 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** Yeah. So, just in case of a  
6 major emergency and we need to bring in a  
7 helicopter, we have the airport back here and  
8 also, there's a little cul-de-sac on 29th Ave.  
9 that if we need to land it out there, we --  
10 we'll be able to use that and deal with --  
11 render aid as soon as possible.

12 **MALE SPEAKER:** Is there a MedEvac operation?

13 **POLICE CHIEF COSTELLO:** Uh-huh. We'll have MedEvac  
14 operation in place.

15 **MALE SPEAKER:** Thank you very much, sir.

16 **IN UNISON:** Thank you.

17 **MR. BELLAMY:** Okay ---

18 (Inaudible background noise.)

19 **MS. ISOM:** Good afternoon (inaudible).

20 **IN UNISON:** Good afternoon.

21 **MS. ISOM:** Mr. Bellamy has asked me to provide  
22 counsel with some of the vendors that are  
23 required to pull off this wonderful Bike Fest  
24 that we have every year, and to let you know  
25 what they are. Room accommodations have been



1 scheduled through the Brittain Resorts group  
2 sales. This is for the officers and staff who  
3 choose to be near our town while the event's  
4 going on in case they're needed immediately,  
5 rather than be elsewhere or at home. So, those  
6 accommodations have been made and are ready to  
7 roll. The light towers that are scattered  
8 throughout the town, which we're using 12 this  
9 year, they're scheduled as well and, luckily,  
10 payment is not due for these lights until 30  
11 days after the Bike Fest has ended. They will  
12 deliver them, they'll help the officers scatter  
13 them around the town where he wants them placed  
14 everywhere, and that'll provide light from  
15 probably 8:30 p.m. 'til you close at 3:00 a.m.  
16 so plenty of lighting around. The Look Event  
17 Rentals is who we get all of the tables, chairs  
18 -- they come and they set up underneath the  
19 tent that SLED -- where they do their cooking.  
20 These items -- tables, chairs -- are all set up  
21 -- 120 chairs, 24 tables -- so they're ready to  
22 go. And we use 2 Cams Ice Company out of North  
23 Carolina, Fayetteville, that's the most  
24 reasonable price that I've found in years for  
25 delivery. We'll have 250 20-pound bags that



1 will be delivered in two separate trailers, it  
2 will be put on the property so that easily  
3 accessible to get ice. There's a spider up  
4 there. We have 18 golfcarts coming from the  
5 new shop up -- which I'm not sure their name.  
6 They're right near new the new T-shirt shop ---

7 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

8 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Myrtle Beach Golf, is it?

9 **IN UNISON:** Yeah.

10 **MS. ISOM:** So we have a fairly good rate with them  
11 and they're delivering 18. Elvis Equipment  
12 Company out of Myrtle Beach, they are who  
13 brings the 40-foot Conex office trailer.  
14 That's the item that goes in first before  
15 anything else can go on the lot because it's 40  
16 foot long. So, we have Jimmy the electrician  
17 coming to set that up upon delivery. We also  
18 have three two-station sinks and 32 portable  
19 toilets that come along with that so that's all  
20 set up to be delivered on Wednesday morning  
21 before anything else comes on the property.  
22 Aaron's Appliance Rental has been kind enough  
23 the last three years, they will deliver us one  
24 refrigerator and two freezers to put inside the  
25 40-foot trailer as a donation so one good place



1 we can save some money on but ... Do you have  
2 any questions on any of these items?

3 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Now, this -- you're talking  
4 about mainly for the police setup over there,  
5 is that mainly what ---

6 **MS. ISOM:** Yeah, it's for all law enforcement.

7 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Okay, right.

8 **MS. ISOM:** Where the tent goes ---

9 **MAYOR EVANS:** Okay.

10 **MS. ISOM:** --- all of this goes in that area.

11 **MALE SPEAKER:** I've got a question.

12 **MR. BELLAMY:** Yes, sir.

13 **MALE SPEAKER:** Will the vendors be able to buy ice  
14 from the Town?

15 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Yeah, is that ice for sale for  
16 the Town? Okay, so that's what you're asking?

17 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

18 **MR. BELLAMY:** That's police officers.

19 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Oh, just for the officers ---

20 **MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:** For the police officers.

21 **MR. BELLAMY:** (Inaudible.)

22 **MS. ISOM:** Yeah, this -- we tried last year to sell  
23 some and it didn't go over, but with SLED and  
24 as much cooking as they do, they provide ice  
25 cream and ice cream sandwiches, they need the



1 ice.

2 **MALE SPEAKER:** Okay. Okay.

3 **MS. ISOM:** Anything else?

4 **IN UNISON:** Thank you.

5 **MR. BELLAMY:** Michael Gore.

6 **MR. GORE:** Good evening.

7 **IN UNISON:** Good evening.

8 **MR. GORE:** Well, my job is simple, it's just to make  
9 sure everything is put out right, anything for  
10 the job, the trash dumpsters, and to make sure  
11 that we have access to emergency -- for  
12 emergency vehicles and stuff like that so my  
13 job is very simple, just work with the police,  
14 work with the staff and that's it. Any  
15 questions?

16 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

17 **MR. GORE:** Oh -- yeah. Well, that's what I said,  
18 I'm gonna make sure all the (inaudible) get  
19 (inaudible) where it's supposed to be and all  
20 the port-o-johns, gonna make sure the officers  
21 get water taken to them or whatever they need  
22 me for.

23 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** All right.

24 **MAYOR EVANS:** Thanks, Mike.

25 **(Inaudible background noise.)**





1     **MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:**   Mr. Gore?

2     **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:**   Mr. Gore?

3     **MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:**       What day is the trash  
4                   containers coming?

5     **MR. GORE:**       They'll be -- they should be here by  
6                   Wednesday -- Wednesday or Thursday.

7     **MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:**   Oh -- yeah, okay.

8     **MR. GORE:**       Yeah.

9     **MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:**   Okay.

10    **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:**   I have a question for you as  
11                   well ---

12    **MR. GORE:**       Yes, ma'am.

13    **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:**   Are we going to be giving  
14                   vendors trash bags like we used to do prior  
15                   years, we'll be doing that ---

16    **MR. GORE:**       Yes, we will because all the vendors are  
17                   gonna be required to -- at the end of the day  
18                   or end of the night, whenever their trash needs  
19                   to be picked, they're gonna be taking their  
20                   trash to the dumpsters so that we don't have a  
21                   trash buildup around any of the vendor spaces.

22    **MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:**   Okay.

23    **MR. BELLAMY:**   And also, we're going to share with  
24                   vendors or put that information in the packet  
25                   to encourage them to do that, we'll be working



1 -- we're going around checking also.

2 **MR. GORE:** Right. Yeah, all the vendors will have a  
3 -- have this information in their packet and  
4 take it -- just go by the packet and they --  
5 we're gonna tell them where the trash dumpsters  
6 and -- so we won't have a buildup of trash  
7 during the festival. Any more questions?  
8 Okay, thank you.

9 **IN UNISON:** Thank you.

10 **MR. BELLAMY:** Yes, after the -- after we conclude  
11 the Bike Festival, probably about a week later,  
12 we'll have the staff meeting and we're --  
13 conduct -- some call it after-action review.  
14 What is that? It -- after-action review lets  
15 us work -- after every operation, we want to go  
16 back and critique it, look at strength and  
17 weakness of that operation then we can improve  
18 it for next year. So, we'll actually have  
19 Atlantic Beach citizens, would like every --  
20 input, feedback from them and see how we can  
21 improve in the services areas and public  
22 safety. We have a law enforcement mobile site,  
23 it's operational, vendors license and  
24 environmental services so in those areas -- as  
25 (inaudible) said, we're going to emphasize to



1 the litter team, clean as you go. Don't wait  
2 until the trash piles up, you're constantly  
3 picking up the trash, okay? See it in the  
4 street, pick it up, keep moving. Same thing,  
5 we're -- provide information to the vendors,  
6 provide trash cans at the end -- trash bags, at  
7 the end of the day, tie it up, take it to the  
8 dumpster. And we'll be constantly going  
9 through, checking and doing inspections and --  
10 throughout the operation. Any questions at  
11 this time to the Council and employees have any  
12 questions?

13 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

14 **MR. BELLAMY:** All right, thank you very much.

15 **IN UNISON:** Thank you.

16 **MAYOR EVANS:** We're down to Public Time but before  
17 we -- I think we've got one public comment  
18 card. Atlantic Beach has been chosen to  
19 receive a historic preservation reward and I  
20 want to read this. Congratulations, the  
21 Atlantic Beach Gullah Geechee Cultural and  
22 Nature Festival 2023, you have been chosen to  
23 receive a historic preservation award for your  
24 efforts to preserve Horry County history. And  
25 it says please join us in celebration at our



1 annual awards ceremony, and this will be at the  
2 Government and Justice Center in Conway, 1301  
3 2nd Avenue, and this is May 20th which is  
4 Monday at 5:30.

5 **Public Time:**

6 **MAYOR EVANS:** We're down to Public Time and we do  
7 have one public comment I believe and I think  
8 it's Ms. Diane Hill.

9 **MS. HILL:** Thank you, Mr. Mayor ---

10 **MAYOR EVANS:** Thank you.

11 **MS. HILL:** --- Mr. Bellamy, Town Council members ---

12 **MR. BELLAMY:** Yes, ma'am.

13 **MS. HILL:** --- and my fellow citizens. I stand  
14 before you today with a simple request of the  
15 police, the Town and, of course, all of my  
16 neighbors and that is that the police, please  
17 brief our guest police officers and the police  
18 who are coming in and remind them that we are  
19 a group and a town of law-abiding citizens and  
20 we expect, as we have in the past had, law-  
21 abiding citizens coming into our festival and  
22 having a great time. We don't need to be  
23 policed, we don't need to be harassed, we would  
24 like to be treated with dignity and respect,  
25 and we are of the same dignity and respect in



1 return. We're just law-abiding citizens here  
2 having a good time, inviting our guests to join  
3 us and do the same, and I'm speaking  
4 specifically because my son asked me to make  
5 this notation because he says last year, he  
6 says, Mom, I felt as if the police were trying  
7 to intimidate me, and my son -- this particular  
8 one is the older one who is a young man who  
9 supervises a group of 16 to 18 year olds, 100  
10 or more, everyday in a high school setting and  
11 he gives them dignity and respect, and he gets  
12 the same in return, dignity and respect. So,  
13 that's what we expect. We want Officer  
14 Friendly. We would like Officer Friendly and  
15 all of the officer friendlies to join us, enjoy  
16 what we're doing and we're just law-abiding  
17 citizens, we don't need someone to harass us,  
18 yell us, shove us around and trying to  
19 intimidate us. My son particularly said -- he  
20 said, listen, he said, Mom, I've gone to war in  
21 Iraq, I've got combat ribbons and combat  
22 medals, nobody is going to intimidate me but  
23 he's very soft spoken, very soft spoken, very  
24 kind, very polite, law-abiding. Thank you.

25 **IN UNISON:** Thank you.



1     **MAYOR EVANS:** Thank you, Ms. Hill.

2     **MR. BELLAMY:** Mayor, may I address that with her?

3     **MAYOR EVANS:** Sure.

4     **MR. BELLAMY:** Okay. Ma'am. Ms ---

5     **MS. HILL:** Yes?

6     **MR. BELLAMY:** --- Hill?

7     **MS. HILL:** Yes.

8     **MR. BELLAMY:** Okay, incidents like that, we have --  
9             during the festival, we have something called  
10            -- we have incident reports, okay? So, we will  
11            have -- just e-mail that to our office ---

12    **MS. HILL:** Right.

13    **MR. BELLAMY:** --- and if you have -- anyone have any  
14            incidents like that, please mail that to our  
15            office, that's all part of the after-action  
16            review.

17    **MS. HILL:** Absolutely.

18    **MR. BELLAMY:** Okay? And name of police officer,  
19            department, badge number and the incident  
20            report, and then we will follow up with that  
21            department.

22    **MS. HILL:** Thank you, sir.

23    **MR. BELLAMY:** Okay? Thank you very much.

24    **MS. HILL:** Thank you.

25    **MR. BELLAMY:** Okay.



1     **MAYOR EVANS:** Thank you. Council, seek a motion to  
2             adjourn.

3     **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** So moved ---

4     **MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:** So moved.

5     **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Second.

6     **MAYOR EVANS:** There's a motion and a second on the  
7             floor to adjourn. Roll call.

8     **CLERK:** Mayor Pro Tem Josephine Isom?

9     **MAYOR PRO TEM ISOM:** Yea.

10    **CLERK:** Councilwoman Jacqueline Gore?

11    **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Yea.
