1 CALL TO ORDER:

2 **COUNCILMAN:** This Town Council Workshop and Bike  
3 Festival After Action Review Meeting is called  
4 to order this Monday, September 23rd, year  
5 2024, at 6:01 p.m. Roll call.

6 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Mayor Pro Tem Josephine Isom.

7 **MS. ISOM:** Here.

8 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Councilwoman Jacqueline Gore.

9 **MS. GORE:** Here.

10 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Mayor Jake Evans.

11 **MAYOR EVANS:** Here.

12 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Wait a minute. You got to call  
13 the other names.

14 **MAYOR EVANS:** Yeah.

15 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Yeah, just call ---

16 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Just call 'em.

17 **MAYOR EVANS:** Yeah, for the record.

18 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Councilman Edward Campbell.

19 (No response.)

20 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Councilman John David.

21 (No response.)

22 **MAYOR EVANS:** Okay. Thank you.

23 (Inaudible comments.)

24 **MAYOR EVANS:** I want to take the time to welcome  
25 the general public, the few that are here, and



1 ask at this time if you have any pagers or  
2 phones that might disturb the proceedings, to  
3 silence those for us at this time. And if you  
4 would, stand for a moment of silence.

5 (Moment of Silence)

6 (Pledge of Allegiance)

7 **MAYOR EVANS:** Council, we're down to ceremonial  
8 matters. Anyone have any ceremonial matters?  
9 If not ---

10 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** I don't, but -- but -- and it's  
11 just a couple people in here that may even know  
12 who I'm talking about for the -- what's her  
13 name? Estelle Sinclair.

14 **MAYOR EVANS:** Yes.

15 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Town long time resident, Ms.  
16 Janie, you know (inaudible)?

17 **MAYOR EVANS:** Estelle.

18 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Yeah.

19 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

20 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** She passed away.

21 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** And (inaudible) down there,  
22 Thompson, he was a councilman, so I would ask  
23 that some time we do a ---

24 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** A resolution.

25 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** --- the resolution and send it to



1 his wife.

2 **MALE SPEAKER:** Yes, ma'am.

3 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Since we -- we didn't get it done  
4 (inaudible) will we please do that?

5 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

6 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Yeah, okay.

7 **MALE SPEAKER:** Okay.

8 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Okay.

9 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** The door must have locked again.  
10 (inaudible)

11 **MOTION FOR APPROVAL OF AGENDA:**

12 **MAYOR EVANS:** We're down to approval of the agenda.  
13 Council, seek a motion for the approval of the  
14 agenda.

15 **COUNCILWOMAN:** So moved.

16 **MAYOR EVANS:** Second?

17 **COUNCILWOMAN:** Second.

18 **MAYOR EVANS:** There's a motion and second on the  
19 floor for the approval of the agenda. Any  
20 other questions or comments?

21 (No response.)

22 **MAYOR EVANS:** Roll call.

23 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Mayor Pro Tem Josephine Isom.

24 **MS. ISOM:** Yay.

25 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Councilwoman Jacqueline Gore.



1 MS. GORE: Yay.

2 FEMALE SPEAKER: Mayor Jake Evans.

3 MAYOR EVANS: Yay. Motion passed.

4 2024 BIKE FESTIVAL AFTER ACTION REVIEW:

5 MAYOR EVANS: All right. We're down to the 2024  
6 Bike Festival After Action Review.

7 MR. BELLAMY: All right. Good evening. How's  
8 everybody doing? Today's meet- -- today is a  
9 workshop. We're providing Council information  
10 of our -- our observation and lessons learned  
11 from the Bike Fest. The Council -- during a  
12 workshop, the Council cannot make any decisions  
13 in regards to the Bike Fest. All this  
14 information, recommendation to the Council.  
15 So, I want to make that very clear that we  
16 can't make any decisions because that will go  
17 through an ordinance. An ordinance in the Town  
18 of Atlantic Beach is required two -- we have a  
19 first reading and a second reading. What I  
20 like to -- for the Bike Fest is that I arrive  
21 here May 10th, and I'd like to commend the  
22 staff of the Town of Atlantic Beach during that  
23 time period. They were working 14, 15, hours  
24 a day to make the -- this operation happen.  
25 And they did a splendid, outstanding job of



1 signing business license, permits and making  
2 sure that things were very functionable and  
3 organized. And I'm very impressed with their  
4 work ethic during that -- those operations --  
5 those four days. I didn't have any complaints  
6 from the employees. They were very motivated  
7 and very focused on their mission and did an  
8 outstanding job, as I said, for that. It was  
9 a very successful operation. Anytime that you  
10 have the number of people that move into an  
11 area with the time frame, we had public safety  
12 and all the support that was needed to make  
13 this successful, there was not one incident.  
14 And I applaud the staff and our public safety  
15 partners from North Myrtle Beach, Myrtle Beach,  
16 Horry County, SLED, South Carolina DNR,  
17 Forestry Department and also the Highway Patrol  
18 working together for our safety. At this time,  
19 we won't prolong you very long here, because,  
20 I said, this is strictly information and  
21 recommendation. And our first presenter will  
22 be Chief Castillo.

23 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** Good evening. So, as Mr. Bellamy  
24 said, there was no incident -- no incidents,  
25 nothing to report. Nobody went to jail, which



1 is a successful event in my eyes. Nobody got  
2 hurt. Everybody's here to have fun. No issues  
3 whatsoever.

4 A few things I would like to address will be  
5 -- or a few concerns are the permits for the  
6 RVs. Obviously, that takes a lot of our time  
7 trying to go into knocking on everybody's RV  
8 making sure they're up to date with the permit  
9 or whatnot. A lot of them had old, last year's  
10 permits on the window, saying, oh, I got my  
11 permit. Obviously, that didn't -- that didn't  
12 go too well. They need to get permits.

13 Another issue was during -- towards the end  
14 of each night, the barricades on 30th were  
15 being moved and motorcycles were coming from  
16 their designated area onto where people were  
17 walking, and that just congested both sides of  
18 the roadway. So, I've come up with some  
19 recommendations on those issues. The first  
20 one, the RV permit, if it's possible, if we can  
21 set up something like on 30th Ave, all RVs have  
22 to travel through 30th Ave, and we have  
23 officers there making sure that they got their  
24 permit before they're able to enter the town.  
25 That way, once they park, it's kind of hard to



1 maintain who got a permit and who doesn't. Or  
2 if we can assign the designated person that  
3 they're solely -- their sole job is to check  
4 permits all weekend long, that's another  
5 recommendation. Also, for the barricades on  
6 30th Ave, I would like for the fire -- for  
7 Horry County Fire to come in and fill up those  
8 barricades with water, so, that way they can't  
9 be moved, and pedestrian traffic stays on the  
10 right and motorcycles stay on the left-hand  
11 side, so that way there's no -- there's no  
12 cloggedness on each side of the road trying to  
13 get from one end to the other in the town. The  
14 traffic pattern's gonna stay the same. And my  
15 goal for this Bike Fest will be to have myself  
16 and a daytime officer from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00  
17 p.m. And then at night, have an officer from  
18 4:00 p.m. to 4:00 a.m., and an officer from  
19 6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., and then I'll be out  
20 until the festival ends. That way, we have 24-  
21 hour coverage, and people's property and their  
22 vendors can feel safe knowing that, you know,  
23 their property is being tend to and watched for  
24 24 hours.

25 And I believe that's my recommendations, and



1 I appreciate you guys taking the time to  
2 listen. I thank you everybody for coming out.

3 **MALE SPEAKER:** Thank you.

4 **MALE SPEAKER:** At the end, we'll have -- just write  
5 your questions down, and at the end, we'll have  
6 a Q and A, okay.

7 **MALE SPEAKER:** Okay. Next presenter.

8 **MALE SPEAKER:** Ms. Carnesha.

9 **MALE SPEAKER:** Okay.

10 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Hello. My name is Carnesha. So,  
11 for the 2024, we had a total of 40 food vendors  
12 and 13 retail vendors, and we collected a total  
13 of 20 RV permits.

14 As far as some of the concerns from vendors  
15 and the public, the forms are recommended to be  
16 maybe online instead of paper application.  
17 They were concerned about only having money  
18 orders. So, a recommendation would be for us  
19 to somehow have online payments if possible.  
20 And just overall, like, the money order was an  
21 inconvenience for a lot of the vendors.  
22 Another recommendation is for the website to be  
23 more user friendly. And I think we're in the  
24 process of talking to Mr. John, who is over our  
25 website.



1 FEMALE SPEAKER: What's his name?  
2 FEMALE SPEAKER: John.  
3 FEMALE SPEAKER: John.  
4 FEMALE SPEAKER: I don't know his last name.  
5 MALE SPEAKER: (Inaudible) the website (inaudible)  
6 FEMALE SPEAKER: (Inaudible)  
7 FEMALE SPEAKER: Yeah. He maintains the website,  
8 yeah.  
9 MALE SPEAKER: For the town?  
10 FEMALE SPEAKER: For the Town. I know I personally  
11 do the Police website, so maybe he could give  
12 me permission to do the Town's website. I will  
13 talk to him about that.  
14 FEMALE SPEAKER: Wait -- wait a minute. So, we  
15 have somebody that we pay to do our website.  
16 MALE SPEAKER: Right. (Inaudible)  
17 FEMALE SPEAKER: But you do websites, as well?  
18 FEMALE SPEAKER: Well, he kind of gave me  
19 authorization to edit the Police website to be  
20 more user friendly.  
21 FEMALE SPEAKER: So, do you do websites, as well,  
22 though?  
23 FEMALE SPEAKER: Yeah, I could. When -- if he  
24 gives me the permission to.  
25 FEMALE SPEAKER: Okay.



1     **MALE SPEAKER:**           (Inaudible)       He controls the  
2                            website.

3     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**        Yeah, he kind of like -- Ms.  
4                            Cheryl will send him information to post on the  
5                            website.

6     **MALE SPEAKER:**        (Inaudible)

7     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**        Yeah. Another recommendation is  
8                            for us to, again, do the debit card machine at  
9                            the office, or they pay online. And we want to  
10                           do a flat rate vendor permit fee. So, instead  
11                           of coming up with numbers based on how wide  
12                           your booth is or how long your food truck is,  
13                           it'll be a flat rate. So, it's no measurements  
14                           on different -- what's the word I'm looking  
15                           for? I guess booths. Like every -- everyone  
16                           would pay like a flat fee for the size of their  
17                           (inaudible). And that's it.

18    **MALE SPEAKER:**        (Inaudible) Environmental Services.

19    **MR. BELLAMY:**        Michael had an appointment. He was  
20                           not be -- able to be with us tonight. He had  
21                           an appointment. Far as the environmental side  
22                           of it, location of portalets and portable  
23                           restrooms and rollbacks, trash, rollback --  
24                           rollback 40 foot containers. What he's  
25                           recommending is that he will be going out to



1 the site. So, we're at that -- this year --  
2 last year, we had -- we did have rollbacks in  
3 certain locations. So, what we're gonna do is,  
4 we have time now, we'll go out to the property  
5 owners and we'll look -- look at strategic  
6 locations for the rollbacks. Okay. Because  
7 there are some areas that we could have used,  
8 but we -- we did not contact the owners early  
9 enough on. So, next month -- starting here,  
10 next week, we'll start contacting the --  
11 contacting the landowners, and ask them for  
12 space, especially on 30th Avenue, because  
13 that's the most where -- during our  
14 observation, that's where most of your garbage  
15 and trash was, because you have the food  
16 vendors, especially down near the entertainment  
17 area, because it's A larger crowd. So, we're  
18 looking at strategic locations there at the  
19 entertainment site, having two there and  
20 sporadically on -- as you're going down 30th  
21 Avenue on left and right, you have two, two and  
22 two, and a total of ten. And then across the  
23 street over here -- well, eight, and then  
24 across the street here, we have one here in  
25 this location. So, that way -- and then with



1 the portalets, the same thing, is that we'll  
2 have -- look at strategic locations again for  
3 portalets and easy access, starting from 30th  
4 all the way down oceanfront, 31st, 29th Sea  
5 Breeze, and you have easy access, especially in  
6 the area of the entertainment section. You  
7 have -- since you have more people down there,  
8 so, it'd be strategic located. We can do this  
9 if we start early. And I think that -- and I  
10 think he came up with an excellent plan to do  
11 this. And we're also gonna contract out a  
12 street sweeper to come in, say, 4:00 or 5:00 in  
13 the morning, go through, do a clean sweep on  
14 all the streets, 29th, 30th, 31st, 32nd, and  
15 get the streets cleaned up. Do that every --  
16 early in the morning for that, okay. And I  
17 think he -- he developed -- he did an excellent  
18 plan of planning, and just a matter of now just  
19 to reach out to the -- to the landowners.  
20 Okay. Kim, our next presenter.

21 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Good evening.

22 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Good evening.

23 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** As some of you may or may not  
24 know, I've been doing the negotiating on  
25 pricing for the vendors that we use in order to



1 hold the bike event, such as (inaudible) Light  
2 Towers and ---

3 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** We can't hardly hear you.

4 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Hold on. Can you hear me now?

5 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Uh-huh.

6 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Okay. I've been doing the  
7 negotiating on pricing for the vendors that we  
8 need in order to hold the Bike Fest. With  
9 Elvis Reynolds in Myrtle Beach, we had the 40  
10 foot Conex (ph) trailer. They bring in the  
11 portajohns. They bring in the additional  
12 portajohns for SLED. We have a food tent  
13 that's set up by SLED. So, what I pretty much  
14 do is make contact with all these people, which  
15 I've -- I've done already for next year, and  
16 have the pricing. And the two most expensive  
17 vendors that we use have agreed to hold the  
18 pricing for 2025 that we paid for 2024, which  
19 is a good thing. Some of the smaller  
20 companies that we use, for example, ice, we  
21 paid 2550 this year for two trailers, each  
22 having 250 20-pound bags of ice per trailer.  
23 Well, for next year, it's gone up \$280. Some  
24 of them have gone up not by a great margin.  
25 Some of them have offered to stay the same.



1 I'm waiting on room accommodations as they have  
2 to wait till basically the end of the year to  
3 give any sort of a fair price. However, they  
4 do -- I've been working with them for over five  
5 years. They do give us a 30 percent discount  
6 on room rates.

7 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** What's that?

8 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** The hotel accommodations for the  
9 officers that come from Lake City and other  
10 areas, as well as Mr. Bellamy, Carnesha, the  
11 ones that stay in close proximity to the bike  
12 event.

13 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Okay.

14 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** We have a -- I've organized a  
15 chart basically on how these items have to come  
16 in on the property, because if they come in  
17 randomly, some of them can't -- can't get in.  
18 In other words, we have to start with a  
19 dumpster first. Mike schedules that. But it  
20 has to be brought on the property first thing  
21 in the morning early. Then we get the 40-foot  
22 trailer that we put refrigerators and freezers  
23 in who are donated to us. As long as they can  
24 put their banner around the trailer, they give  
25 them to us for free. They've been doing that



1 for five years. And then they go in order  
2 from, like I said, the most important to get in  
3 to fit, and then move towards 17. So, it's --  
4 it's -- we have a pretty narrowed down routine  
5 of how these things work. Initially, when I  
6 first started here, there was no sort of  
7 organization, but in the last few years, I've  
8 made sure that I'll have a time and a date for  
9 everything that comes on the property for the  
10 Bike Fest in a certain order, so that it's run  
11 smooth.

12 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) clarification. Are you  
13 referring to (inaudible)

14 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** No, the ---

15 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)  
16 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

17 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Yeah, well, that sets pretty much  
18 on -- off the street, but the grassy area is  
19 where the 40-foot trailer has to come in for  
20 SLED to put in refrigerators, freezers ---

21 **MALE SPEAKER:** Service area?

22 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Right. That command center, as  
23 long as it stays on the street and comes in a  
24 little later, because these large objects have  
25 to be in there first or nobody else can get in.



1           You can't maneuver around 'em.

2   **MALE SPEAKER:**       (Inaudible) because you have the  
3           command center and you have a tent area where  
4           all the police officers (inaudible).

5   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**       Well, lunch, dinner in the  
6           evening. They cook like three meals a day,  
7           provide drinks at SLED.

8   **MALE SPEAKER:**       (Inaudible)

9   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**       Uh-huh.

10   **MALE SPEAKER:**       Okay.

11   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**       (Inaudible)

12   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**       The main thing is that, I mean,  
13           it's good to give us the info, but the main  
14           thing is that they know what (inaudible) here.  
15           That's really (inaudible) they put information  
16           (inaudible)

17   **MALE SPEAKER:**       Right.

18   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**       I work with these vendors and set  
19           a time, and they're pretty accommodating, you  
20           know, they've -- I've been out here at 7:00 in  
21           the morning for them to bring in certain  
22           equipment or product that we use, so, it works  
23           pretty smooth now, luckily. Any questions?

24   **MALE SPEAKER:**       Okay. We'll answer questions at the  
25           end (inaudible)



1     **MALE SPEAKER:**     All right.

2     **MR. BELLAMY:**     Okay. Memorial Day Ceremony Balloon  
3           Release date, Sunday, May 25th, 2025, 7:00 p.m.  
4           This -- this year we had a balloon release on  
5           the beach, and it was very successful, and we  
6           received a great deal of positive feedback from  
7           family members that was on the beach and came  
8           out and participated. And there's sons that --  
9           they were happened to be walking on the beach,  
10          and they came to join us, and they really  
11          appreciated. We received the comments was that  
12          my grandfather or my great grandfather was in  
13          World War II, Korean conflict or Afghanistan.  
14          So, we really -- it was very appreciative to do  
15          that for our -- for our -- for our deceased  
16          veterans, and we appreciate the staff inflating  
17          the balloons and carrying them out to the beach  
18          and then releasing them. Far as entertainment,  
19          we're -- this is just a recommendation, from  
20          Sunday having, you know, just a variety of  
21          entertainment, and want to discuss that with  
22          whoever's awarded the contract for the  
23          entertainment, that goes to a -- we post it on  
24          our website, and my understanding is that it's  
25          competitive bid. It goes through that process,



1 and then the Council votes on -- votes on the  
2 award of the contract to sign -- signed the  
3 contract for that -- for that venture, whatever  
4 company represent. And we gotta request  
5 whoever ---

6 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Okay. Wait a minute. I just want  
7 to cut you off a minute because last year ---

8 **MR. BELLAMY:** Yes.

9 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** --- before Mr. Q (inaudible)

10 **MR. BELLAMY:** Yes.

11 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** He was awarded that contract.

12 **MR. BELLAMY:** Right.

13 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** And what happened was, whenever we  
14 had awarded out to Marcus Media ---

15 **MR. BELLAMY:** Yes.

16 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** --- Marcus Media couldn't do  
17 nothing with it that first year, nor that  
18 second year, because you can't do nothing with  
19 the first -- and I thought that he had put in  
20 information his proposal ---

21 **MALE SPEAKER:** It was supposed to be for five  
22 years.

23 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** --- and it was for five years,  
24 that's what Mr. Q has said. So, therefore, in  
25 order for somebody to ever make any kind of



1 profit for the Town or for themselves, it's  
2 going to take a Town (inaudible). And so,  
3 therefore, yeah, I think that we had discussed  
4 that before, because I seen this right here.

5 **MR. BELLAMY:** Right.

6 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** --- and I would like for that to  
7 go back around because in order for anybody to  
8 come and get that first year, they don't do  
9 nothing but lose like he did last year.

10 **MR. BELLAMY:** Right, okay.

11 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** So, therefore, yes, so, therefore.  
12 Go ahead.

13 **MR. BELLAMY:** Okay. But what we're gonna do is  
14 request, okay, so it's a 25-year contract -- I  
15 meant five.

16 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Yeah.

17 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** No, not 25.

18 **MR. BELLAMY:** Okay. 5, 5, 5, Okay.

19 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

20 **MR. BELLAMY:** I was looking at 2025 here, okay.  
21 But, yeah, we'll get with you and (inaudible)  
22 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

23 **MR. BELLAMY:** (Inaudible) if you -- for Sunday, if  
24 we could do maybe a Motown show, I'll get with  
25 you on that, okay. Okay. Perfect. Thank you.



1 **MALE SPEAKER:** On the -- let's talk about this form  
2 here.

3 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Uh-huh.

4 **MALE SPEAKER:** This form here. (Inaudible) Okay.  
5 If you'll go to your left, you see here, says,  
6 rate calculation 0 to 10 with rate (inaudible)  
7 and then 0 to 20, rate time (inaudible). What  
8 that is is that -- left-hand side, right here.

9 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Uh-huh. We know what you talking  
10 about.

11 **MALE SPEAKER:** Right here, okay.

12 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Uh-huh.

13 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

14 **MALE SPEAKER:** Okay. Right here. What it is is  
15 that -- what we were doing through the Bike  
16 Fest, is that when someone come in and say,  
17 okay, I have a (inaudible) ---

18 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

19 **MALE SPEAKER:** --- and the rate would be, say,  
20 retail, 650 and then, if you -- it was -- if  
21 it's 10 by 20, it will be -- it'll be 1.5  
22 percent of that added to it. So, you say 650  
23 -- say seven, I'm just gonna throw out numbers,  
24 \$700 (inaudible).

25 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)



1 **MALE SPEAKER:** Now, what we're asking Council is to  
2 delete that requirement. Again, that's just a  
3 recommendation. We'll make that decision  
4 during our -- our second reading. (Inaudible)  
5 their permit, because that takes it -- that's  
6 not -- one of my duties and responsibility, if  
7 you -- if I come to you as a landowner, say,  
8 okay, I'm the -- I own a -- I own -- my name is  
9 Joe Jackson and I have a (inaudible) I want to  
10 sell. (Inaudible), right? What is 10 by 10.  
11 Okay. When he comes to Town Hall, I have her  
12 fill out a permit and say, okay, it's 1.5. So,  
13 we shouldn't be in business of doing that.  
14 That should be decided by the land owner. How  
15 do you want to rent your space?

16 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Exactly.

17 **MALE SPEAKER:** So, we learned from that, okay. So,  
18 we know that when you come in, if your veggie  
19 stand is 10 by 10, that's on you. If you have  
20 a 10 by 20, that's still on you. That's  
21 between you (inaudible)

22 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

23 **MALE SPEAKER:** We have (inaudible)

24 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

25 **MALE SPEAKER:** --- it caused our staff additional



1 work, okay, because we have to sit there and  
2 commute all this and say, okay, is it 10 by 10?  
3 No. You have a veggie stand (inaudible) 10 by  
4 10. Okay, it's 10 by 20. So, when it comes  
5 in, you have a (inaudible) stand, and we'll  
6 sign your permit. That was that. And that's  
7 between you and the owner ---

8 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** That's right.

9 **MALE SPEAKER:** --- to negotiate. Okay.

10 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Good.

11 **MALE SPEAKER:** All right. (Inaudible)

12 **MALE SPEAKER:** So, you're recommending that that be  
13 deleted is what you ---

14 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** That be deleted.

15 **MALE SPEAKER:** Okay.

16 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** It was like that years and years  
17 and years and years ago (inaudible)

18 **MALE SPEAKER:** Yes, sir.

19 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

20 **MALE SPEAKER:** Okay. And over here, numbers with  
21 you for 2020, (inaudible).

22 **MALE SPEAKER:** How many did we have?

23 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Right (inaudible)

24 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Yes, she shows you collected 6400,  
25 but the fee was \$2,000 plus if you were getting

(Inaudible - multiple speakers)

**MALE SPEAKER:** It was how many?

**MALE SPEAKER:** Correct that.

**MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) I can go back and look  
at it.

**MALE SPEAKER:** Yeah, see how many -- how many ---

**FEMALE SPEAKER:** How many alcohol vendors you had.  
(Inaudible - multiple speakers)



1 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) look at (inaudible) back  
2 some numbers ---

3 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** So, how many was the ---

4 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** More than enough. It was  
5 (inaudible)  
6 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

7 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) five?

8 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Yeah, I mean, that's just me  
9 talking now. I'm just making (inaudible)

10 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)  
11 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

12 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) workshop (inaudible)

13 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Right, right.

14 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) \$2,000.

15 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** \$2,000.

16 **MALE SPEAKER:** Yeah.

17 **MALE SPEAKER:** So, you've seen (inaudible)  
18 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

19 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) three and probably a  
20 late fee 'cause it was (inaudible). Looks like  
21 it was (inaudible)  
22 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

23 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** How many the chief signed off on?

24 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Oh, yeah. Wait a minute.  
25 Question.



1 **MALE SPEAKER:** It was -- it was (inaudible) by the  
2 entertainment itself.

3 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Right.

4 **MALE SPEAKER:** That -- that -- approve and then  
5 there was a lemonade stand, and then there's  
6 (inaudible)

7 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Right.

8 **MALE SPEAKER:** So, that I remember -- that I  
9 remember ---

10 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

11 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Does he have to sign off on.

12 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

13 **MALE SPEAKER:** --- probably like six or seven. But  
14 if there's \$6,000, that means we only sold  
15 three.

16 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Right.

17 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible).

18 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

19 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Could be a typo. Could be a typo.

20 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Okay.

21 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** I know it was more than three.

22 **MALE SPEAKER:** Okay. Okay. Hold on a second,  
23 here. Beer and wine ---

24 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Beer.

25 **MALE SPEAKER:** So, I guess ---



1 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

2 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Wait a minute, now. Beer and wine  
3 is different from the alcohol now.

4 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) was that lemonade  
5 considered -- was that ---

6 **MALE SPEAKER:** No, that was alcoholic because you  
7 were serving it with the lemonade.

8 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Oh (inaudible)

9 **MALE SPEAKER:** Somebody gets a permit to sell  
10 alcohol at one spot and they have two or three  
11 bars on that one spot, is that considered just  
12 one fee?

13 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

14 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

15 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** That's supposed to ---

16 **MALE SPEAKER:** -- application for each spot.

17 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Wait a minute.

18 **MALE SPEAKER:** Even if it's on one lot.

19 **MALE SPEAKER:** And different -- different  
20 addresses.

21 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Right, different addresses.

22 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) different address,  
23 because entertainment have three spots, three  
24 different locations, so, it's three different  
25 addresses.



1     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Three different locations.

2     **MALE SPEAKER:**     They have -- they have to get a  
3         permit for that.

4     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay.

5     **MALE SPEAKER:**     So, each -- each individual  
6         (inaudible). Now, let's say if somebody owns  
7         two lots and only one sells alcohol, and they  
8         sell eight stands there, then that's just one  
9         address.

10    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay.

11    **MALE SPEAKER:**     But the application each -- is for  
12         each address (inaudible) serving alcohol.

13    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

14    **MALE SPEAKER:**     So, yeah, that's what I'm asking.  
15         If there's just one lot and you have an  
16         application to sell alcohol, you can set up  
17         more than one booth on that one lot to sell  
18         alcohol?

19    **MALE SPEAKER:**     If it's the same person.

20    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Same person.

21    **MALE SPEAKER:**     It's the same person.

22    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah, if it's individual -- somebody  
23         else, then it would have to be (inaudible)

24    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Well, yeah, we need somebody to keep  
25         up with that though.



1 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Well, they -- trust me ---

2 **MALE SPEAKER:** We've got records, I mean  
3 (inaudible)

4 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** There is nobody going to allow  
5 somebody else to go sell some alcohol on a lot  
6 with them, so, you ain't even gotta worry about  
7 that. I guarantee you that's not gonna happen.

8 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)  
9 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

10 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** And SLED's gonna check that, so  
11 your job ain't gotta be (inaudible), but they  
12 gonna let you know. They (inaudible)  
13 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

14 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** And he has to sign off on those  
15 things.  
16 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

17 **MALE SPEAKER:** I'm -- I want to make sure the Town  
18 is getting what they deserve (inaudible).

19 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

20 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)  
21 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

22 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Do you -- do you have to sign off  
23 on the beer and wine?

24 **MALE SPEAKER:** No, it's the liquor.

25 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Just the liquor.



1     **MALE SPEAKER:**     The liquor, yeah.  Anybody serving  
2                   liquor has to go get a liquor license.

3     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Uh-huh.

4     **MALE SPEAKER:**     No, beer and wine -- I think when  
5                   you sign (inaudible)

6     **MALE SPEAKER:**     It covers that same thing?

7     **MALE SPEAKER:**     It covers that too.

8     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay.  I thought it was -- okay.  
9                   So, it's liquor, beer, and wine.

10    (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

11    **MALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible) but without (inaudible)

12    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Correct, they can't -- they can't --  
13                   yeah.  At first, they have to go to the Town to  
14                   get the license, the permit first.

15    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Uh-huh.

16    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Then they come see me.

17    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Right.

18    **MALE SPEAKER:**     There's a procedure that I go  
19                   through.

20    **MALE SPEAKER:**     then they go to the ABC (inaudible).

21    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Okay.

22    **MALE SPEAKER:**     That's a local (inaudible).

23    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah, that's (inaudible)

24    (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

25    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Market Common.



1 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

2 **MALE SPEAKER:** (inaudible) application there, but they  
3 approve it in Columbia, okay.

4 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

5 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

6 **MALE SPEAKER:** DOR -- that's a DOR (inaudible).

7 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

8 **MALE SPEAKER:** One second.

9 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** And now getting back to the beer  
10 and wine, I'll tell you how many (inaudible).

11 **MALE SPEAKER:** Beer and wine was (inaudible) 49  
12 vendors (inaudible)

13 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** They only \$200, aren't they?

14 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** It's 49.

15 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** 4-9 divided by 750 (inaudible) 6.

16 **MALE SPEAKER:** Beer and wine is 750.

17 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** 750.

18 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Times 750.

19 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Maybe it has late fees or  
20 something going on there or whatever, but that  
21 should have been at least six of those.

22 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) number for beer and wine  
23 or (inaudible)

24 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) I'm not doing no fact  
25 checking, but I'm just letting you know right



1           there ahead is a typo, because I know for sure  
2           it's more than three.

3       **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay.   Look back on the licenses,  
4           what we can do is I can back and look at the  
5           actual application.

6       **MALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible) was included in that.

7       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    We just want the numbers right.  
8           We don't want nothing to come back and haunt us  
9           in the years to come.   That's all.   We just  
10          want to make sure everything was right.   We  
11          never -- that's all.

12       **MALE SPEAKER:**    That's all right.   No problem.   I'll  
13          look (inaudible).   Alcohol license.

14       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Now, see, there ain't nothing but  
15          one late -- ain't nothing but one late fee  
16          charge.

17       **MALE SPEAKER:**    Right.

18       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Now, so -- and you all don't  
19          charge people for that license.   Y'all just  
20          charge them for that one license, cause the  
21          State, they have to pay that, so, therefore, I  
22          hope that's not the number that was added  
23          (inaudible)

24       **MALE SPEAKER:**    No, no.

25       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Okay.



1     **MALE SPEAKER:**     This is strictly our (inaudible)

2     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Well, yeah.

3     **MR. BELLAMY:**       (Inaudible) All right.    On the --  
4                    okay.    On the process force (inaudible) as  
5                    we've talked -- Carnesha was talking early on,  
6                    just saying what we're doing-- bring it up to  
7                    date, the staff.    On this billing here on --  
8                    starting first Friday morning, we're upgrading  
9                    the communication system here going to a new  
10                   Spectrum system with fiber optics.    Okay.    So,  
11                   that's gonna increase our capabilities for our  
12                   WiFi and our ways of communicating through our  
13                   internet.    So, that's a major improvement, and  
14                   (inaudible) when we've (inaudible).    Now, at  
15                   the Town Hall within the next two weeks, we're  
16                   gonna -- we're going through the same process.  
17                   They already ran the cable in.    It's a matter  
18                   of about two weeks we should be up and running.

25                   package of information.    Just click on, fill



1 out the form, and you can use your debit card  
2 or credit card and make those kind of payments.  
3 Now, we did discuss -- you do have some people  
4 that -- because the age is not computer savvy.  
5 So, when they come to the office with their  
6 application, they have -- we'll have a debit  
7 card machine, all they do is come in, and they  
8 use the debit card, fill out a form, we'll run  
9 it, and then (inaudible) on the way to set up  
10 the operation. What we discovered was that  
11 when someone would come in is that with the  
12 manual system, they would have had to come in  
13 with their application, and we'll give them the  
14 chart there -- this chart here, say, okay, X  
15 number of dollars, and then we have to go drive  
16 down to Dodge's, the convenience store, it's  
17 about -- maybe about two -- about three miles  
18 away, and purchase some money orders, it's only  
19 225. Come back to the office through all that  
20 traffic, and then -- then -- then process it  
21 with a money order. So, we're gonna eliminate  
22 as much as possible, but we're still going to  
23 be able to accommodate individuals who do not  
24 go -- use the internet, go online, but we'll  
25 still able to accommodate them also. Okay.



1           So, we're gonna make it more user friendly and  
2           -- and reduce the time for that.

3       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    So, I've got a question for you.

4       **MALE SPEAKER:**     Yes, ma'am.

5       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    So, you're saying that there is  
6           not a credit card machine up there at the Town  
7           Hall for this?

8       **MALE SPEAKER:**     No.

9       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Well, we gonna backtrack in time  
10           because ---

11       **MALE SPEAKER:**     You had -- I saw one back there.  
12       (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

13       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    We had a credit card machine when  
14           I worked at the Town.

15       **MALE SPEAKER:**     I saw one back in the storage.

16       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Okay.

17       **MALE SPEAKER:**     But what we're gonna do is ---

18       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Yeah, we need to do that.

19       **MALE SPEAKER:**     Well, we're gonna sync up the --  
20           we're gonna sync up the new credit card machine  
21           into the new -- with the (inaudible) machine.  
22           Okay.

23       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    So, are you gonna get one just for  
24           license?

25       **MALE SPEAKER:**     No, no, no. All the operations.



1     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

2     (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

3     **MALE SPEAKER:**       (Inaudible) for building permits.

4             You come in here for business license, where we

5             ---

6     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     That's right.

7     **MALE SPEAKER:**     We gotta reduce all the -- all these

8             money orders, 'cause that's (inaudible)

9     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Y'all don't take checks now?

10    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Not personal checks, no.

11    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Business -- do y'all take business

12             checks?

13    **MALE SPEAKER:**     'Cause ---

14    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Business checks, yeah, but no

15             personal checks.

16    **MALE SPEAKER:**     But not personal, but only business

17             checks and money orders, right?

18    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible)

19    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay. Gotcha.

20    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Because (inaudible) you wouldn't

21             take my business check.

22    **MALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible) who was there at the

23             office then? Was Cheryl there (inaudible)

24    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay. So, (inaudible)

25    **MALE SPEAKER:**     You -- you told me to go get ---



1 **MALE SPEAKER:** The money order, okay. Well, I  
2 stand corrected. That's correct. You can use  
3 -- business check.

4 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Business.  
5 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

6 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Business checks.

7 **MALE SPEAKER:** Okay.

8 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** No personal checks, just ---

9 **MALE SPEAKER:** It was a business check, that's why  
10 I said that. 'Cause did I need a business  
11 check (inaudible)

12 **MALE SPEAKER:** That was my understanding at the  
13 time, and I stand corrected.

14 **MALE SPEAKER:** Y'all taking -- y'all take business  
15 checks now?

16 **MALE SPEAKER:** Yes.

17 **MALE SPEAKER:** Well, in the future, when you come,  
18 if you want to do an electronic transaction,  
19 bring a debit card and we'll run it for you.

20 **MALE SPEAKER:** All right. I stand corrected on  
21 that. Okay. On the -- Okay, let's do -- okay,  
22 this right here. Okay. Let's go to and --  
23 doing the Bike Fest -- hold on -- this is the  
24 amended -- this is ordinance 2-24, second  
25 reading 4-2024, it's amended to title 12



1           ordinances (inaudible) ordinance number --  
2           temporary camping and use of (inaudible)

3       **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right. Uh-huh.

4       **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay. Yes, okay. This was approved  
5           back in April. And during Bike Fest, we had a  
6           lot of questions about this because what --  
7           what was the -- what was it -- it was a very  
8           minimal fee prior to this.

9       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    \$10.

10      **MALE SPEAKER:**     \$10, okay. Okay. \$10, okay. Okay.  
11           (Inaudible) from 10 to 250. So, when the RV  
12           campers arrived, they came to register, and we  
13           explained to them now it's 250 (inaudible) 250  
14           and they had some concerns about that. So, the  
15           only way you can change this, the Council would  
16           have to make that decision, (inaudible) to be  
17           approved -- approved to make -- to make those  
18           decisions to change that. And we can have a  
19           conversation tonight, but we cannot make any  
20           decisions.

21      **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Well, I just want to say this  
22           right here, how it got there.

23      **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay.

24      **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Whenever -- and I think these  
25           three -- these two here on the same page, if



1 I'm not mistaken, as I am. Whenever we voted  
2 for \$250 for an RV coming up in this town, we  
3 were thinking we was charging -- the Town was  
4 charging people to sit on their property for  
5 \$250. We -- well, I can't speak for them. I  
6 can only speak for me.

7 **MALE SPEAKER:** Right.

8 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** I was under the impression that  
9 this was gonna be where you charge people for  
10 sitting on the Town's designated property for  
11 RVs. I had no clue that for them to sit on a  
12 ordinary property, it would be \$250. So,  
13 therefore, I -- however we have to rescind that  
14 or whatever, we need to rescind that. So,  
15 we'll talk about that. Yeah, we need to bring  
16 that back down too.

17 **MALE SPEAKER:** Right. If we can have a  
18 conversation about that ---

19 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

20 **MALE SPEAKER:** --- and, you know, you go  
21 (inaudible) you know, some guideline from 10 to  
22 250 or from 150 ---

23 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** No, \$50 should be all these people  
24 pay to come down here. If we had a hotel -- if  
25 we had a hotel, they could stay in a hotel. We



1           ain't got no hotels, so, therefore, they come  
2           down and we charge them \$50 -- I don't even  
3           know why we're charging them \$50 to come to our  
4           town for real. I honestly don't. We got to  
5           have some -- I don't think \$50 is (inaudible)  
6           (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

7           **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Huh?

8           **MALE SPEAKER:**     Y'all got (inaudible) motel.

9           **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah, we do, but they can't hold  
10           nothing but a few.

11          **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah.

12          **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay. Well, again, tonight, that's  
13           just -- it's a conversation.

14          **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Just a conversation.

15          **MALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible) we just sharing with you  
16           some feedback from -- from the RVers, saying  
17           that was too high.     (Inaudible)

18          **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Okay.

19          **MALE SPEAKER:**     What is number (inaudible) what is  
20           number 11 (Inaudible) second reading.

21          (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

22          **MALE SPEAKER:**     Let's do this. Ordinance number 8-  
23           2024, first reading, October 7th, 2024. This  
24           is a basic -- this is the same language from  
25           the last -- from the last -- previous



1 ordinance. And gives you the dates of the Bike  
2 Fest. Starting date is Friday, May, 23rd,

7           birds, the ones that come in Monday through ---

8       **MALE SPEAKER:**   Right.

9       **CHIEF CASTILLO:**   --- Wednesday, or Monday through  
10           Thursday. You know, that already -- come in  
11           early to establish themselves there? That was  
12           a suggestion. Yeah, during -- during the  
13           festival, there's no way for them to go down --  
14           -

15       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**   Yeah.

16       **CHIEF CASTILLO:**   --- 30th. That was just for like  
17           the early birds.

18       (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

19       **MALE SPEAKER:**   We were also looking at bringing,  
20           you know, maybe bringing on (inaudible) one  
21           person to go around and check because what  
22           happened was -- we were extremely busy in the  
23           office, and there's times that we would walk  
24           around and with golf carts we might see a  
25           person and decide let's (inaudible), and then



1           about four or five hours later, late at night,  
2           most of them showed up the middle of the night  
3           ---

4       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Uh-huh.

5       **MALE SPEAKER:**    --- while we were back in the office  
6           working and (inaudible) next morning, they're  
7           there.  It's a cat and mouse game.  So, and  
8           sometimes they move locations.  They did some  
9           of that stuff, too, so ---

10       (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

11       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**   But they don't be trying -- they -  
12           - they don't really be trying to be slick.  
13           They just feeling like there was a time ---

14       **MALE SPEAKER:**    Yeah.

15       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**   --- when they could come here, no  
16           problem.  And all of a sudden we want -- and  
17           we've been charging about 10 or 15, 20 dollars  
18           for a minute.  But at the same time, I don't  
19           think there's so much -- I don't think they're  
20           trying to be slick ---

21       **MALE SPEAKER:**    Right.

22       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**   --- whatever somebody, a property  
23           owner, might be told 'em, you can't park here,  
24           you got so -- it could be something like that.

25       (Inaudible - multiple speakers)



1     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     So, I don't think that we're --  
2                             yes.

3     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah, yes. Yes, sir.

4     **MALE SPEAKER:**     So, with the -- well, I've got two  
5                             things here, let me look, since we're on the RV  
6                             thing. So, if somebody brings in an RV and  
7                             they pay their money for the permit. Isn't it  
8                             some kind of way that we can put a sticker,  
9                             like we do -- like we do the vendors, so every  
10                            so often you have somebody go around the Town  
11                            and check ---

12    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right, yeah.

13    **MALE SPEAKER:**     --- if somebody got an RV and they  
14                            don't have the sticker displayed, they haven't  
15                            paid their money ---

16    **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    They get handed out a RV pass.

17    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

18    **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    And they're instructed to put it  
19                            on the window ---

20    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

21    **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    --- of the RV, so whenever we're  
22                            walking along, okay, he got it; he got it.

23    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah.

24    **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    So, like I said, some of them had  
25                            last year's pass, because ---



1 **MALE SPEAKER:** Yeah, okay. All right.

2 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** (Inaudible) and stuff. But if --  
3 if we have -- because, obviously, I mean, I  
4 don't know if the Town understands, I know we  
5 have a lot of police presence here ---

6 **MALE SPEAKER:** Right.

7 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** --- but all the work comes out to  
8 Atlantic Beach officers.

9 **MALE SPEAKER:** Exactly.

10 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** So, any incident or anything that  
11 happens, Atlantic Beach is responsible.

12 **MALE SPEAKER:** Right.

13 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** They're just there for  
14 enforcement, back-up, everything like that.  
15 So, when you have three or four officers  
16 checking RVs, that takes up a lot of time from  
17 everything going on during the festival.  
18 That's why my recommendation was to have  
19 somebody ---

20 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

21 **MALE SPEAKER:** I agree. I mean, that's ---

22 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

23 **MALE SPEAKER:** --- yeah, we definitely need to have  
24 someone to do that.

25 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** Now, if there's a problem, they



1 call us, and we'll handle it (inaudible).

2 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Right.

3 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** But just to make sure everybody  
4 has a pass, I mean, I think that we ---

5 **MALE SPEAKER:** Yeah, we're happy -- we'll issue  
6 that. We have one designated person do that.  
7 Maybe have one (inaudible) a few RVs come in  
8 late as usual anyway. So, maybe (inaudible)  
9 about five or six (inaudible).

10 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) because you got folks  
11 that live here in Town that's ---

12 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** That's true.

13 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** --- volunteer and do stuff like  
14 that. You know, I'm here and I -- I can  
15 volunteer whenever I'm not busy. But, I mean,  
16 I don't think that we have to take it -- go as  
17 much as (inaudible) hire somebody to just do a  
18 count on something, you know what I'm saying?  
19 You get on the golf cart, you ride up the  
20 street, you ride back down the street, and you  
21 got (inaudible). But at the same time and in  
22 the same token, we need to make sure that this  
23 is adjusted in it too. If a vendor comes here  
24 and they bring their RV, they don't have to pay  
25 because they are already paying. So,



1           therefore, they're doing that to keep from  
2           trying to have to go pay down at a hotel  
3           because they're trying to get they money  
4           (inaudible).

5       **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

6       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     You see what I'm saying?     So,  
7           therefore, for a vendor, I don't think ---  
8           (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

9       **MALE SPEAKER:**     No, no, no.

10      **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     --- to pay right.

11      **MALE SPEAKER:**     We'll make sure that ---

12      **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

13      **MALE SPEAKER:**     --- vendors don't pay.

14      **MALE SPEAKER:**     So -- so, what kind of system have  
15           we been using to figure out where we're going  
16           to place the portable ---

17      **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Michael.

18      **MALE SPEAKER:**     --- restroom?

19      **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Michael always schedule that.  
20           (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

21      **MALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible) he's been going out and  
22           talking with the landowners, but what we  
23           discovered is that -- is that some of the  
24           location that when we got the portalets  
25           delivered, we were not able to have access to



1           because that individual had already rented it  
2           out. So, what we doing now is, starting next  
3           week, we'll start contacting the property  
4           owners and ask 'em, say, that strategic  
5           location, can we have access to that location  
6           early on. Okay. But he had been going out and  
7           talking with the (inaudible)

8           (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

9           **MALE SPEAKER:**     --- but at some point, some -- and  
10           my understanding was that the -- some of the  
11           vendors, I mean, some of the independent land  
12           owners, had already rented their property out.  
13           Say, okay, we can't provide this location, but  
14           we can provide that location. So, what we  
15           ought to be doing now is going out well in  
16           advance and looking at strategic locations and  
17           talking with the landowner, so we can place the  
18           rollbacks and the portalets in certain  
19           strategic locations.

20           **MALE SPEAKER:**     So, I mean the portable restrooms,  
21           they're not on anybody's personal property, are  
22           they?

23           **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    They on the right-of-ways, aren't  
24           they?

25           **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    They on the right-of-way. You



1 don't have to get permission.

2 **MALE SPEAKER:** Well, some of them are on the right-  
3 of-way and some of them were, like -- like the  
4 roadways was on.

5 **MALE SPEAKER:** Well, I'm not talking about the  
6 roadways ---

7 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

8 **MALE SPEAKER:** --- the portable restrooms should  
9 never be on anybody's personal property.

10 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

11 **MALE SPEAKER:** If you have -- okay. See, what  
12 happens then -- Mike and I was looking at it,  
13 is that we had about -- there were some  
14 sections in there where -- between the islands  
15 that they were blocked off. And then what  
16 we're -- what we're trying to -- and he was  
17 saying, if you walk -- it's kind of -- if  
18 you're in -- in a portalet and you're in an  
19 island, and you step out of the portalet, you  
20 know ---

21 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** It's not too sightly ---

22 **MALE SPEAKER:** Right.

23 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

24 **MALE SPEAKER:** So, we're trying to reduce that.

25 **MALE SPEAKER:** I mean, I don't -- I mean, if it's



1           okay with the property owner, I mean, if the  
2           property owner say, hey ---

3   **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right, right.

4   **MALE SPEAKER:**     --- you can place them there.  But,  
5           I mean, normally, if we go around and every  
6           property owner say no, then, of course, that's  
7           what I was just saying.

8   **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

9   **MALE SPEAKER:**     I mean, the portapotties naturally  
10          supposed to be not on anybody's property  
11          anyway, unless we get their permission.

12   **MALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible)

13   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     And we never ever ever putting  
14          them on nobody -- only property where they have  
15          really been at has been on our property, or  
16          over by Mr. DeWitt's hotel over there -- motel  
17          over there.

18   **MALE SPEAKER:**     That's right.

19   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     But, you know, far ss that, I  
20          think right-of-ways for whoever -- don't -- you  
21          want to have them where people gonna be, it's  
22          gonna be accessible to the people.

23   **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

24   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible)

25   **MALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah, so ---



1 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Like ---

2 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

3 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** One of the issues that was brought  
4 up to me more than one time was that there was  
5 one over here on 30th and 3rd, but then the  
6 next portajohn was ---

7 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

8 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** --- was like three-quarters --  
9 three-quarters down ---

10 **MALE SPEAKER:** Right.

11 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** --- because the vendors didn't  
12 want anything close, because they didn't want  
13 it to ruin their business.

14 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Right, right.

15 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** Now, we gotta take into  
16 consideration the people walking up and down,  
17 because the vendors themselves were -- some of  
18 them were complaining, man, I gotta walk all  
19 the way up there, all the way down there. So,  
20 you can't make everybody happy.

21 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** No.

22 **MALE SPEAKER:** Well, see another thing that I want  
23 to bring to your attention is when Bike Fest is  
24 going on and traffic is coming from the Myrtle  
25 Beach way, when they get to Atlantic Beach, the



1           only street they're allowed to come in is 31st  
2           and possibly 29th.

3   **MALE SPEAKER:**     32nd.

4   **MALE SPEAKER:**     32nd.

5   **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    No, 32nd was blocked off.

6   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**   They can't go up 32nd. They can't  
7           go in 32nd.

8   **MALE SPEAKER:**    No, they can't come in 29th. They  
9           go out 29th.

10   (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

11   **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    So, the only street would be 31st.

12   **MALE SPEAKER:**     31st.

13   **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    Yes, sir.

14   **MALE SPEAKER:**     So, that's what I wanted to get the  
15           attention on.

16   **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    Yes, sir.

17   **MALE SPEAKER:**     So, when some -- the only place they  
18           come in is 31st, when the traffic gets backed  
19           up, guess where traffic is, people lined up,  
20           just traffic ---

21   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Just sitting.

22   **MALE SPEAKER:**     --- and guess what's not there on  
23           31st avenue.

24   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    (Inaudible)

25   **MALE SPEAKER:**     Portapotties.



1     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Toilets.

2     (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

3     **MALE SPEAKER:**     On 30th?

4     **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    No, 31st, 31st.

5     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah, yeah, 31st.

6     **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    I understand.

7     **MALE SPEAKER:**     That's -- that's -- and people  
8                           probably, you sitting in traffic, sitting in  
9                           traffic, and they have to go to the bathroom,  
10                          and it's ---

11    **MALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible)

12    **MALE SPEAKER:**     --- I mean, there's just no way that  
13                          it's -- there's nothing there. I mean, they --  
14                          they had a couple every once in a while, but I  
15                          think that more attention needs to be paid to  
16                          that is all I'm saying.

17    **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    So, we would have to figure out  
18                          where on 31st we can ---

19    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

20    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    That you can -- right.

21    **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    --- we can place (inaudible)

22    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah.

23    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    On 31st, they had 'em right there,  
24                          right past me, right there.

25    **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    Yeah, and that -- and that



1 (inaudible)

2 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

3 **MALE SPEAKER:** Yeah, they had a couple in the area  
4 where I'm at right there, too.

5 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Uh-huh. Uh-huh.

6 **MALE SPEAKER:** Yeah. But they didn't have a whole  
7 lot on (inaudible). I mean, we just kind of  
8 just need to pay attention to it. I'm not  
9 saying anything, but, you know, just kind of  
10 manage that we definitely need some on 31st, as  
11 well.

12 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** No, I mean, you don't want nobody  
13 coming into the festival angry either.

14 **MALE SPEAKER:** Right.

15 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** You may not -- somebody not being  
16 able to use the bathroom right away (inaudible)

17 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Oh, they use it now.

18 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** Well, yes, but not in a convenient  
19 way. But, you know, yeah, anything that we can  
20 reduce anybody coming in angry already or any  
21 hostility, that's always a plus.

22 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) 31st (inaudible)

23 **MALE SPEAKER:** That's what I'm saying, strategic  
24 location. (Inaudible) Where -- whatever access

25 ---



1 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

2 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) 'cause they only  
3 putting one over there by the church.

4 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

5 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Well, you really want to -- you  
6 really want to watch how the crowd is, what  
7 they be doing, 'cause, see, at some points of  
8 the day, you may have a crowd here ---

9 **MALE SPEAKER:** Right.

10 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** --- and not -- especially coming  
11 down 31st. 31st gonna get a little crowded  
12 whenever -- it don't be like this. Instead,  
13 you putting four or five there, you might want  
14 to put two here and two down like that. You  
15 know, instead of putting all (inaudible)  
16 together, I think we just spread them out.

17 **MALE SPEAKER:** Right.

18 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** You'll probably be better off like  
19 that, you know. In the hot body areas, you're  
20 gonna need a little bit more.

21 **MALE SPEAKER:** Yeah.

22 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** People -- like coming down 31st  
23 right here, two here, two on this side, two on  
24 two side, like that. And do, you know, so ---

25 **MALE SPEAKER:** Yeah.



1     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah.

2     (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

3     **MALE SPEAKER:**       (Inaudible) observation, the late  
4                            evening, the bulk of the population is near the  
5                            entertainment center, so ---

6     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

7     **MALE SPEAKER:**       --- shift there and go back and  
8                            forth and ---

9     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah, ordinarily, you have the most  
10                            portalets where the most people are.

11    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah, right.

12    **MALE SPEAKER:**     That's a given.

13    (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

14    **CHIEF CASTILLO:**     Another thing, since we're just  
15                            bouncing ideas, Mr. Bellamy and myself were  
16                            talking, oh, the staff about maybe there's a  
17                            designated area for people to sit down and eat.  
18                            I don't know where, but just, you know, a lot  
19                            of people don't like walking and eating. Some  
20                            people were sitting on the curb.

21    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right. Makes sense.

22    **CHIEF CASTILLO:**     You know, I don't know if there's  
23                            an area, if we have land or area somewhere that  
24                            we can have a few tables and some chairs, you  
25                            know, that'll ---



1     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Well, all the vendors was on 30th.  
2             It's gonna be tough to do that on 30th Avenue.

3     **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    And ---

4     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Right.

5             (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

6     **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    That's what -- that's what ---

7     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Maybe down in the culdesac, but, I  
8             mean, that's just on that end.

9     **CHIEF CASTILLO:**    Yeah, somewhere --

10            (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

11    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Entertainment down there.

12    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

13    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Huh?

14    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Well, that's where the barriers are.

15    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Where the barriers are.

16    **MALE SPEAKER:**     But I'm saying don't need the  
17            barriers.

18    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    But, you know ---

19            (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

20    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Where?

21            (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

22    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    What he say?

23    **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    You got a few festivals, you got a  
24            few people out there, you got a few vendors out  
25            there that's gonna have places where to sit



1 down. But for the most festivals you go to,  
2 ain't too many people sitting down. They walk  
3 around and eat the food. That's how they do  
4 it. So, therefore, we got four blocks over  
5 here that only two of them utilized before  
6 (inaudible) You know, what are we gonna do.

7 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Can't put them on no residential  
8 (inaudible)

9 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Now, (inaudible) across the street  
10 there, you got them lots that over there that  
11 may not be, so they're -- maybe those folks  
12 will say, yeah, you know, you all can use mine,  
13 so maybe ask somebody like that. Michael ---  
14 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

15 **MALE SPEAKER:** Well, somebody's lot that's not ---

16 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** That they don't ---

17 **MALE SPEAKER:** --- that's not usable?

18 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) uh-huh.

19 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

20 **MALE SPEAKER:** Now, what is it, because I -- I  
21 don't understand. Wait a minute (inaudible)  
22 Craft Fest and they have areas that you can sit  
23 down ---

24 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Uh-huh.

25 **MALE SPEAKER:** --- in tent (inaudible) to the left



1 and down in Charleston area ---

2 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** So, they got businesses down  
3 there. These are all, (inaudible) businesses  
4 (inaudible)

5 **MALE SPEAKER:** Right.

6 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) businesses right here.  
7 They (inaudible) mostly (inaudible) yeah, they  
8 got (inaudible)

9 **MALE SPEAKER:** But (inaudible) they had tents set  
10 up.

11 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Yeah.

12 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) Charleston.

13 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

14 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** --- this year and then make sure  
15 the church (inaudible)

16 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

17 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** And maybe (inaudible).

18 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

19 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

20 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

21 **CHIEF CASTILLO:** (Inaudible) preliminary talks  
22 (inaudible) decision to make.

23 **MALE SPEAKER:** We'll take a look at it (inaudible)

24 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Okay. Let me -- just like  
25 (inaudible) they church is gonna park cars this



1 year because they didn't put the portapotty  
2 over there but one last year. So, if you're  
3 gonna use it, then we probably need to put back  
4 two like we used to do. Do you know if they  
5 going to use it?

6 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

7 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** No, Ms. Graham.

8 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

9 **MALE SPEAKER:** Oh, Ms. Graham, okay.

10 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Yeah, Ms. Graham, yeah.

11 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

12 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

13 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Okay. So, we only put the one  
14 back over there then.

15 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

16 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

17 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** No, because they put two cross on  
18 the other side, on 39, yeah.

19 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible). Okay.

20 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** But if they was doing that  
21 parking, we put two back there behind the  
22 church.

23 **MALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible) church (inaudible)

24 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Yeah, she said they're not going  
25 to use it.



1     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Said they're not gonna (inaudible)  
2     **MALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible)  
3     **MALE SPEAKER:**        We have any public comment  
4         (inaudible) anybody ---  
5     **MALE SPEAKER:**        Anyone sign up for public  
6         (inaudible)  
7         (Inaudible - multiple speakers)  
8     **MALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible) sign up.  
9         (Inaudible - multiple speakers)  
10    **MALE SPEAKER:**     I'd like to say something.  
11    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay. (Inaudible)  
12    **MALE SPEAKER:**     You can go ahead and come to the  
13         podium and state your name and ---  
14    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay.  
15    **MALE SPEAKER:**     --- make your comment.  
16    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Jeffrey Boyer (ph), everybody know  
17         me. How y'all doing? With the few things,  
18         I've identified a few blocks that I'm hoping to  
19         purchase (inaudible) Street. So, I mean,  
20         (inaudible)  
21    **MALE SPEAKER:**     We working on (inaudible)  
22    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Another thing, with the Bike Fest  
23         committee -- I mean, with the entertainment,  
24         this is just a suggestion.  
25    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay.



1     **MALE SPEAKER:**     You know, this -- you have to -- in  
2                   order to -- in order to get the proper  
3                   entertainment, I own the drag strip out in the  
4                   country also.     So, we -- in order to get  
5                   sponsorship, in order to get the dollars, you  
6                   know, to have a big event, especially a free  
7                   event (inaudible), you got to have -- you have  
8                   to have enough time in order to get the  
9                   sponsorship dollars.   And -- and -- and -- and  
10                  you don't always get the sponsorship dollars  
11                  because a lot of people (inaudible).     So,  
12                  everything you can do to make extra money is a  
13                  plus, and when it comes to putting the type of  
14                  entertainment that -- that you want to have.  
15                  So, when you said something about the alcohol,  
16                  about limiting the alcohol, I mean, it's just  
17                  a suggestion, and this would -- this, I think  
18                  -- with this change, it would make -- after my  
19                  four or five years up, it would make it more  
20                  attractive for the next person coming to do the  
21                  ---

22     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Entertainment?

23     **MALE SPEAKER:**     ---- entertainment.     I think we  
24                   should -- we should allow the -- the  
25                   entertainment people to spend another ten grand



1 or whatever the number be, and -- and -- and  
2 let them be the only one that serve alcohol.  
3 You know what I'm saying?

4 **MALE SPEAKER:** Well, I see -- okay. I understand  
5 what you're saying, because I've seen vendors,  
6 entertainment vendors like that, because it's -  
7 - it's called exclusive rights, because they're  
8 providing all the entertainment and then they  
9 have the alcohol license. I've seen that in --  
10 in -- at venues where the entertainment was in  
11 charge of the alcoholic beverages.

12 **MALE SPEAKER:** Right.

13 **MALE SPEAKER:** And ---

14 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

15 **MALE SPEAKER:** And my question, not not only -- not  
16 only ---

17 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** We did that one year.

18 **MALE SPEAKER:** Not only would the entertainment,  
19 and I would limit the entertainment to -- to  
20 the places to where they can put it, it's just  
21 throughout -- for that festival, throughout the  
22 city ---

23 **MALE SPEAKER:** Okay.

24 **MALE SPEAKER:** --- whoever control the  
25 entertainment, control that. They paying for



1           it. They're not giving it to them for free.

2   **MALE SPEAKER:**   Right. Yeah.

3   **MALE SPEAKER:**   You know.

4   **MALE SPEAKER:**   Like a franchise (inaudible)

5   **MALE SPEAKER:**   Yeah. Unless it's -- unless it's a  
6           -- a owner, someone like -- like Brenda, that's  
7           -- that's got a permanent business license that  
8           want to ---

9   **MALE SPEAKER:**   Right.

10  **MALE SPEAKER:**   --- you know, I wouldn't say keep  
11           her, or anyone else that's like her, that's  
12           already permanent here.

13  **MALE SPEAKER:**   Okay.

14  **MALE SPEAKER:**   Keep them from getting a ---  
15           (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

16  **MALE SPEAKER:**   You know, but it's -- that's just a  
17           suggestion, you know what I'm saying? I think  
18           that that would -- because, like I said, you  
19           know, we spent a lot of money down there doing  
20           entertainment this year, and, frankly, I didn't  
21           really walk away with a lot of money, you know  
22           what I'm saying. But it -- with good planning  
23           and -- and utilizing every resource at our  
24           disposal, I think we can make it a whole lot  
25           bigger and better for the Town, you know.



1     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay. All right.

2     **MALE SPEAKER:**     And one more thing I'd like to  
3     suggest too, like I say, being that I own the  
4     business of North Myrtle Beach Drag Strip, I  
5     would like -- I'm coming up with some ideas  
6     that -- (inaudible) if we could work with the  
7     Town, the Police Department or whoever, to,  
8     like, either joint venture, where -- where --  
9     or either to -- to move the crowd, you know,  
10    when the crowd need to be moved, so it won't be  
11    jammed up all at one time. 'Cause we got -- I  
12    got 27 acres out there, you know, we will --  
13    and it's -- it's a bike -- a bike event go on,  
14    you know. So, we would like to -- if it's for  
15    you all to think about it and see how we can  
16    better serve, better work with the Town in a  
17    joint venture project out there, you know. And  
18    it wouldn't -- it really wouldn't cost you  
19    nothing, but it can -- it can probably be  
20    profitable for the Town and -- and I think it  
21    can serve to move the traffic around a little  
22    better, you know.

23    **MALE SPEAKER:**     You got anybody else in public time  
24    want to speak? You can go ahead.

25    **MS. DAS:**     First of all, thank you, because to have



1           so many people there and not have an incident  
2           is -- is huge.

3           **MALE SPEAKER:**     State your name for the record.

4           **MS. DAS:**     Krishna Das (ph).    I own three lots on  
5           30th.    So, I had an incident.    I just don't  
6           like the fact that I have to come up here to  
7           discuss an incident.    It should have probably  
8           been resolved already.    So, the process for the  
9           vendor has a add-on button, but the add-on is  
10          already clicked, and so the Town charged a  
11          space fee that should have went to the owners  
12          instead of the Town.

13          **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    The Town got the money?

14          **MS. DAS:**     Correct.

15          **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Okay.

16          **MS. DAS:**     And so we tried to rectify it.    And I  
17          think three emails.    And then we're up to this  
18          point where we're having a quote, unquote  
19          workshop or after action review, which to me,  
20          personally, that would mean that you would have  
21          to get the perspective of the vendors, the  
22          perspective of the owners, the perspective of  
23          a participant, so, you can have a 360 review of  
24          the actual event.    So, if you guys really want  
25          to improve on the delivery of the Bike Fest, I



1 would make the recommendation to do that, as  
2 opposed to saying this as an action -- after  
3 action review or workshop, when, in fact, it's  
4 just an information session.

5 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** That's what it (inaudible)

6 **MS. DAS:** Yeah ---

7 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

8 **MALE SPEAKER:** That's what it is.

9 **MS. DAS:** So, yeah, so, my point is this, is that  
10 throughout the process, there's obviously some  
11 issues with it.

12 **MALE SPEAKER:** Right. That's correct.

13 **MS. DAS:** Yet, I'm still down money that should have  
14 been refunded to me, and the Town has it. So,  
15 I hate that I'm in this venue to -- to say  
16 that.

17 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** We need to know (inaudible)

18 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

19 **MS. DAS:** This is the venue that I was given ---

20 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Okay.

21 **MS. DAS:** --- to come to address it.

22 **MALE SPEAKER:** Okay.

23 **MS. DAS:** And, so, I would appreciate some action,  
24 because I think I sent the email, the first one  
25 on ---



1     **MALE SPEAKER:**     And I responded back to your email,  
2                     and ---

3     **MS. DAS:**         That was back in May 24th.

4     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

5     **MS. DAS:**         And so we're now ---

6     **MALE SPEAKER:**     And we didn't get the email.     That  
7                     was administrative.

8                     (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

9     **MS. DAS:**         So, my recommendation would be is,  
10                     obviously, one, is that if there's an issue,  
11                     let's try to address it in a timely manner.  
12                     Two, is that everybody -- I thought you guys  
13                     did a phenomenal job.     There was one person in  
14                     that office that was extremely rude and  
15                     condescending.     I don't know his name, and he  
16                     traveled with them in the (Inaudible).

17     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay.

18     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible)

19     **MS. DAS:**         I don't know, he was an aspiring lawyer  
20                     or something like that.     So, he was very  
21                     condescending and rude ---

22     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Okay.

23     **MS. DAS:**         --- when we brought it to his attention.  
24                     So, customer service certainly should be first  
25                     and foremost.



1       **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Amen.

2       **MS. DAS:**        So, I felt almost dismissed, and that's  
3                    kind of rude, considering we undercharged  
4                    everybody who used our space, because our goal  
5                    was to give more diversity of food, more  
6                    opportunities for people to come in and make  
7                    money.     We weren't looking to really make  
8                    money, per se.     So, my recommendation moving  
9                    forward is to actually do a 360 review and ask  
10                   the various entities how we can improve.     And  
11                   I think if we do that, then we're not getting  
12                   just information, we're actually contributing  
13                   to it.     So, there's a difference between being  
14                   informed and being involved.     And the key is,  
15                   if you involve people in the process, then you  
16                   get buy in, and when you get buy in, you more  
17                   than likely will improve every single year.  
18                   And so I think it's important that the approach  
19                   -- although I get it, this is the fashion in  
20                   which we deliver information, I think, moving  
21                   forward, if you're really gonna assess and have  
22                   an action -- after action review, that it  
23                   should involve the people, all entities.

24       **MALE SPEAKER:**        But what I'm actually hearing,  
25                    though, is this something that affected you



1           personally. That's something that you should  
2           have went right away (inaudible) ---

3   **MS. DAS:**     I did.

4   **MALE SPEAKER:**   And I responded back ---

5   **MS. DAS:**     I did.

6   **MALE SPEAKER:**   I said ---

7   **MS. DAS:**     He responded and ---

8   **MALE SPEAKER:**   Okay.

9   **MS. DAS:**     He responded and he said ---

10   **MALE SPEAKER:**   Okay.

11   **MS. DAS:**     --- that we'll discuss it at the venue  
12           here.

13   **MALE SPEAKER:**   All right. (Laughter)

14   **MS. DAS:**     (Inaudible) September 23rd.

15   **MALE SPEAKER:**     I know why you feel kind of  
16           uncomfortable saying that (inaudible) that's  
17           not a good position to put her in.

18   (Laughter)

19   **MS. DAS:**     So, I've been told to say (inaudible)

20   (Laughter)

21   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     And this isn't our first time  
22           hearing this, because we did hear right after.  
23           Matter of fact, you told us about it.

24   **MS. DAS:**     Yes.

25   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**   Because I think that -- if I'm not



1           mistaken, I thought we was told to tell you --  
2           because I don't care if -- she's good, she's  
3           real good.

4   **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

5   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible) rented my property  
6           (inaudible) and the Town got my money, oh, oh.  
7           She doing real good.

8   **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right. What is the -- I think the  
9           issue was ---

10 **MS. DAS:**        There's a (inaudible) space.

11 **MALE SPEAKER:**    Well, see, the thing is, what this -  
12           - this shouldn't even be discussed here ---

13 **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Amen.

14 **MALE SPEAKER:**     --- that's a personal matter that  
15           involves her.

16 **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    That should not even be come up in  
17           here.

18 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

19 **MALE SPEAKER:**     Talk to her about it. Okay.

20 **MALE SPEAKER:**     (Inaudible)

21 **MALE SPEAKER:**     Well, that's -- you -- you need ---

22 **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     You go ahead and take care of  
23           that.

24 **MALE SPEAKER:**     A personal issue that involved her.

25 **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah.



1     **MALE SPEAKER:**     That you didn't ---

2     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Take care of that.

3     (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

4     **MALE SPEAKER:**     That shouldn't even be a part of  
5                    this meeting.

6     **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Yeah, but she brought it up.

7     **MALE SPEAKER:**     Yeah, I understand.

8     (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

9     **MS. DAS:**     Well, yeah, because he -- I was told this  
10                   was the venue to discuss it.

11    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right. I gotcha.

12    (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

13    **MS. DAS:**     But, if I were to make a recommendation,  
14                   moving forward, though, if you really want to  
15                   assess and to improve on, then you need all  
16                   parties that are involved in it to have a  
17                   voice, and when they have a voice, they can  
18                   contribute to improving the process.

19    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

20    **MS. DAS:**     And so I feel like, you know, having an  
21                   assessment just with your staff doesn't kind of  
22                   give a full perspective ---

23    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right.

24    **MS. DAS:**     --- on how we can truly improve it.

25    **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right.



1 **MS. DAS:** And so that would be my recommendation.  
2 And the second would be, obviously, is to  
3 resolve these issues before it gets to this  
4 level.

5 **MALE SPEAKER:** And see, the thing is right now,  
6 we're in September ---

7 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** September.

8 **MALE SPEAKER:** --- and normally we don't even  
9 attack any of this stuff till the first of the  
10 year. So, I'm glad you know we're this far in  
11 adv- ---

12 (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

13 **MALE SPEAKER:** -- and actually even talking about  
14 it. So, you know, it's not ---

15 **MS. DAS:** Absolutely.

16 **MALE SPEAKER:** --- it's not that we still can't  
17 have something to kind of (inaudible)

18 **MS. DAS:** Push for. (Inaudible)

19 **FEMALE SPEAKER:** (Inaudible)

20 **MS. DAS:** You know, obviously, just a full  
21 disclosure, my job involves strategy and  
22 efficiency and analyzing processes and systems  
23 in order for it to be more effective and  
24 efficient. And I certainly would volunteer my  
25 time to improve on some of these processes.



1           So, please understand that my intent was not to  
2           bring anything negative to this space.

3   **MALE SPEAKER:**     Right. I clearly understand.

4   **MS. DAS:**        But is to actually improve on and to move  
5           forward in a positive way. So ...

6   **MALE SPEAKER:**     Thank you.

7   **MALE SPEAKER:**     Thank you.

8   **MALE SPEAKER:**     Thank you.

9   **MALE SPEAKER:** If I could piggyback on that. Maybe  
10          there should be a survey to all the vendors  
11          after the vendors oversee (inaudible) anything  
12          that could be (inaudible)

13         (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

14   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Send it in.

15         (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

16   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    And the property owners.

17   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Yeah, send it online.

18   **MALE SPEAKER:**     Survey on line.

19   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**    Yeah, yeah, online.

20         (Inaudible - multiple speakers)

21   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Thank you.

22   **MALE SPEAKER:**     And the property owners.

23   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Okay.

24   **FEMALE SPEAKER:**     Thank you.

25   **MALE SPEAKER:**     And thank you. Because (inaudible)



1 as we're -- it's not (inaudible) everything, it  
2 was during the process, and I said, well, we're  
3 going to review the process, and I would like

25 **MS. GORE:** Yay.

2 **MAYOR EVANS:** Yay. Motion granted. Meeting  
3 adjourned at 7:13 p.m.
