- 18 **APPROVAL OF AGENDA:**
- 19 MR. DAVID: Okay. Next, we have approval of the
- 20 agenda. There was one item that was supposed
- 21 to be done last Wed- -- last Monday, which
- 22 would be item G, Bike Fest Presentation from
- 23 the promoter for the event, Jeffrey Gore. Is
- there a motion to approve the agenda with the
- 25 addition of item G?

NEW BUSINESS:

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Carolina ordinance granting South Public Service Authority a Franchise to own, operate and maintain a utility -- electric utility system within the corporate town -- corporate limits of the Town of Atlantic Beach, South Carolina. Ms. Cheatham, Anna, y'all anything else to say? Go ahead.

1	MS. CHEATHAM: Well, Mr. Mayor Pro Tem and members
2	of Council, the franchise agreement with the
3	Santee Cooper expires in June of 2025. This
4	amendment will continue it, and will also
5	restore the underground wire agreement that was
6	taken out the last time it was amended. The
7	Town has to match the funds at 40 percent and
8	it goes for 20 years, I believe. And it
9	incorporates all of the the other
10	franchising ordinances with Santee Cooper.
11	I'll be glad to answer any questions. And we
12	also have Ms. Anna Strickland from Santa
13	Cooper, if there are any questions, as well.

- MR. DAVID: You want to speak, Anna?
- 15 MS. STRICKLAND: I can take any questions if you 16 have any.
 - Okay. Ms. Cheatham, you said it MR. DAVID: incorporates the other franchise agreements. You mean the previous franchise agreements that were ---
- 21 MS. CHEATHAM: Yes.

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- 22 MR. DAVID: --- entered and exited?
- 23 MS. CHEATHAM: Yes, on page three, number three.
- 24 And, Anna, could you explain what the MR. DAVID:
- 25 franchise agreement entails as far as the

amount that citizens pay and how that reflects back to the Town?

- MS. STRICKLAND: Absolutely. So, thank you for having me here tonight. So, what this agreement does and we establish ---
- MR. DAVID: Press your button on that mic.

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MS. STRICKLAND: Can you hear me? Oh, now you can So, what a franchise agreement hear me, right. Cooper established this does, and Santee agreement with the Town οf Atlantic Beach 1975, and originally in it allowed Santee Cooper to come in, serve the Town, invest in the community, invest in putting in electricity So, that includes wires, assets. poles, transformers, fuses, switch boxes, switch gears, any equipment or facilities attached to that equipment in order to serve the Town of Atlantic Beach with power. And what а franchise does is it repays the Town for allowing us to use those easements in the areas within the Town to serve. And so the Town receives that through a five percent collected from each resident's electric bill.

24 MR. DAVID: Any questions, comments?

MS. CHEATHAM: Mr. Mayor, I just wanted to add that

in fiscal '25, the year that we're in, we received about \$22,000 from the agreement.

- MR. DAVID: So, with the -- and if we do 40 percent match, and I think before the Town was doing 40 percent match, and we never had -- were doing a match, and we never -- and that money was a -- was taken out of the match program, and the match program, which we hope Santee Cooper will continue to work with us to look at other opportunities. I know it's for underground, but so that means we have to raise a lot of money through grants. That means we have to -- in order to use this match money in addition to the money that we put aside, that does gain interest while it's aside, as well, too, right?
- MS. STRICKLAND: Right. So, when the Town originally decided to go into the agreement in 2005, it elected for ten years at 20 percent. So, y'all were only receiving 20 percent of those direct revenues from that franchise fund into the underground fund. So, if you wanted to do the ten-year term, that would again be at 20 percent, but if you wanted 40 percent of those direct revenues, then that would go into a 20-year term.

1	MR. DAVID: Is I know we talked before, is
2	does any match agreement go 40 percent or
3	you're saying now that if you do ten, you get
4	the max you can get is you don't get the 40
5	percent?

- MS. STRICKLAND: No. sir.
- 7 MR. DAVID: Okay.

- MS. STRICKLAND: It's weighted, so, ten years you get 20 percent; 15 years you get 30 percent; and 20 years you get 40 percent. And then it stops at 40 percent.
- **FEMALE SPEAKER:** And that's the -- out of the five percent collected from each customer?
- 14 MS. STRICKLAND: Yes, ma'am.
- **FEMALE SPEAKER:** We get the 40 percent of that.
 - MS. STRICKLAND: So, for example, if you decided -so, right now, you make a little over 21,000
 collectively throughout the year. It's going
 to go up a little bit each year. So, say, we
 just say low at 21,000. If you do that on an
 annual basis at 40 percent, with our match,
 that will be \$16,800 a year.
 - MR. DAVID: And, again, you have to -- you only get that extra money to use for underground power lines whenever you're ready to use that for

underground power lines.

MS. STRICKLAND: Correct.

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MR. DAVID: Underground power lines rate at \$2.9 million to do the oceanfront, and if not longer, I think they base it on linear foot.

FEMALE SPEAKER: So, what happens after the 20-year term if we haven't used the money?

MS. STRICKLAND: You can either receive the portion that you have put in that fund back or continue the fund.

And that means it's imperative that we MR. DAVID: get grant monies and other monies to utilize this money. And we've had conversations, which we hope to have continued conversations with Santee Cooper about grants, as well as about other monies to be able to use. So, again, at the end of the day, if we did five years, and we got basically \$100,000, I think, and then if do by the end of 20 years, say wе \$400,000, we need to bury ten feet of land -ten feet to use our money, so we don't lose the money back to Santee Cooper. So, we need to be cognizant of that and pass that on to whomever after we're here, as well. And we need to make sure we use the match money instead of just if

- 1 the money's ever clawed back. You need to make
- 2 sure to use the match money.
- 3 Anything else? Any other questions?

- 5 MR. DAVID: Thank you, Ms. Strickland.

- Town Manager to replace two doors in the
- 24 Community Center.
- 25 MS. CHEATHAM: Yes, thank you. Mr. Mayor, Members

of Council, this proposal is to replace two of the doors in the Community Center. They wood rot, and one is completely gone. If you come -- if you're facing this room, the door over whatever -- the right side, it's all splintered and needs repair.

FEMALE SPEAKER: (Inaudible)

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MS. CHEATHAM: Uh-huh. Yeah, where the water fountain, I think, used to be. And then the door that goes into the kitchen area is completely gone. And we've been able to get quotes for both of those doors for around \$1,500. And as we hope to use the facility, we've got the roof fixed. The previous Town Manager bought -- bought or purchased a number tables and chairs, and we've got this οf building sitting here that we want to use, and we want to make it presentable.

BOARD MEMBER: How about the door to the closet right there?

MALE SPEAKER: That's the one she ---

MS. CHEATHAM: Oh, that's the one. I'm sorry.

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1 MR. DAVID: Now, 15 -- you know, a door or two, so

2 \$1,500 seems high. So, what kind of -- are

- 4 BOARD MEMBER: It's for both doors.
- 5 | MALE SPEAKER: It's for two doors, right?
- 6 MS. CHEATHAM: It's for two doors, for both doors.
- 7 | MR. DAVID: And installation?
- 8 MS. CHEATHAM: Yes, and installation, yes, yes,
- 9 sir.
- 10 MR. DAVID: Okay. Well, I do applaud you, because
- 11 you originally had \$2,000 on here.
- 12 MS. CHEATHAM: I did.
- 13 | MR. DAVID: So, you did some work, and I appreciate
- 14 it.
- 15 MS. CHEATHAM: You're welcome.
- 16 | MR. DAVID: Okay. Is there a motion to approve
- 17 item B?
- 18 | **BOARD MEMBER:** So moved.
- 19 MR. DAVID: Is there a second?
- 20 **BOARD MEMBER:** Second.
- 21 MR. DAVID: Roll call.

Next, item C, authorize the Town Manager to
enter into an agreement with Santee Cooper to
replace lights in Town Hall and Community
Center.

- MS. CHEATHAM: So, I'm just going to give you the money to pay for the doors. We -- we ---
- 11 (Laughter)

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- 12 MR. DAVID: Thank you.
 - MS. CHEATHAM: I'm gonna find you the money to pay for the doors. We had an energy audit done. We've been talking about the lights flickering, and we've also done some work on our bills from Santee Cooper. And so, we had an energy audit done of this building, as well as Town Hall. There's a proposal in your budget document, and I think in your package, but in the Town Hall, for \$834, we can save \$1,000 a year in our energy costs.
- BOARD MEMBER: So, we pay 800 and then we save \$1,000 a year?
- 25 MS. CHEATHAM: A year, yes -- yes, ma'am.

- 1 (Inaudible due to simultaneous speakers.)
- 2 | FEMALE SPEAKER: For -- by replacing light bulbs.
- 3 MS. CHEATHAM: But replacing the light bulbs, yes.
- 4 FEMALE SPEAKER: Where's (inaudible)
- MS. CHEATHAM: Oh, and in this facility for a cost
 of almost \$2,000, \$1,967, we'll get an
 estimated savings of \$4,000 per year by just
 replacing the fluorescent bulbs with LED, using
 -- using the same fixtures.
- 10 | MR. DAVID: And our light bill here is very high.
- 11 MS. CHEATHAM: It's very high.
- 12 MR. DAVID: Every month.

savings.

- 13 We've also -- Mr. Booker has gone MS. CHEATHAM: 14 around and looked at all of the -- the meters, 15 I guess, that we were being billed for, and 16 we've identified some that we didn't know what 17 they were, and so we've ordered those cut off. 18 So, we'll find out who they belong to when they 19 don't have electricity. But I would propose 20 that we get the savings for this building for 21 both energy efficiency, as well as cost
- 23 MR. DAVID: How soon can they do it?
- MS. CHEATHAM: They said it would be six weeks from the time we said, yes.

- 22 MS. BROOKS: Good evening.
- 23 | FEMALE SPEAKER: Good evening.
- 24 MR. DAVID: Turn that microphone or hold the
- 25 microphone in your hand maybe. Yeah, hopefully

1 it works.

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- MS. BROOKS: Council members and distinguished quests.
- MR. DAVID: Maybe that's it. Maybe you just turned it off. Did it click? Hit the top. Tap the top.
- MS. BROOKS: Thank you for the opportunity to share and design proposals that celebrate by shared (inaudible) and heritage choose economic My name is Sandra Brooks. growth. United Executive Director o f Communities Network, UCAN, and today I'm Assistance thrilled to introduce the 2025 UCAN Freedom Ride and Atlantic Beach Juneteenth Celebration, landmark event. We believe that Atlantic Beach is uniquely positioned to (inaudible). partnership will amplify your economic vitality, cultural legacy and regional visibility. So, let's (inaudible). So, quickly, I'm going to go over the agenda. want to introduce UCAN and what UCAN Freedom Ride and Juneteenth Celebration is, why Atlantic Beach, vendor program and revenue opportunities, the roles and responsibilities, media and exposure, and then a Q and A.

1	So, UCAN is the driving force behind this
2	event. We've been doing it now for the past
3	two years in Shallotte, North Carolina. Our
4	organization, we tackle food insecurity, health
5	disparities, barriers to education. We're huge
6	on entrepreneurship for minorities. We work
7	with marginalized individuals. During the
8	COVID, we made sure that we went out to
9	different churches to make sure that they got
10	COVID testing, as well as the COVID shots. So,
11	we we really are wanting our communities to
12	level up. We do healthy food boxes in
13	Brunswick County with the Medicaid program,
14	it's called HOP, Healthy Opportunities Pilot.
15	We also do training for minority entrepreneurs.
16	We host youth STEM camp in the summer. We
17	really try to have some programs that create
18	real, measurable change.

So, what is the UCAN Freedom Ride and Juneteenth Celebration? I would love for you all to imagine having hundreds of motorcycles, vintage cars, families embark on a Freedom Ride from Shallotte to Atlantic Beach. Following the historic (inaudible) board. By 1:00 p.m., our (inaudible) beach side celebrations begin.

1	(Inaudible) fusion of cultural (inaudible). We
2	want to highlight some of this (inaudible). We
3	would like to ask invite elders to come out
4	and tell untold stories. We would love to have
5	some sweetgrass basket weaving going on. Also,
6	maybe some drum circles. We'll have a 50-50
7	cash raffle. And we would even love to have a
8	boots on the ground flash mob, 'cause that is
9	what's trending now, and so we would love to
10	exhibit that as our unity. So, why did we want
11	Atlantic Beach? Because Atlantic Beach isn't
12	just a venue, it's the heartbeat of this event.
13	Here's why. We want to bring economic impact.
14	We would love for you all to charge 33 \$300
15	per vendor to set up. We our goal is to
16	have at least 50 vendors at this event, which
17	can bring a direct \$15,000 in revenue to
18	Atlantic Beach. And we know that you all have
19	local projects and services that could help the
20	cultural legacy. It honors the Gullah Geechee
21	Heritage, a cornerstone of our coastal
22	identity, and by hosting, Atlantic Beach
23	becomes a beacon for cultural tourism,
24	attracting future visitors eager to learn and
25	connect, and community pride. This isn't just

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a festival, it's a movement. We'll bridge communities across state lines, engage residents through contests and volunteer roles and create memories that define -- define Atlantic Beach as a town that champions unity.

So, the vendor program, again, our goal is to have 50 vendors, food, craft, non-profit, local faith-based, businesses. The fee structure would be managed by Atlantic Beach. UCAN will support the marketing, the regional vendors, registration coordination. This could be a diverse marketplace. We encourage -- UCAN encourages minority growth when it comes starting your own business. It's not always easy for us to start our own business, so any that we do community to support can as а support each local minority business is always a win-win for everybody. So, our role again, we'll establish our (inaudible). We'll handle the event logistics; we'll handle marketing, sponsor recruitment and cultural programming. And we'll also coordinate the parade line. ask that you provide the venue space for the celebration from 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., manage the vendor registration and fees, so that if

you can provide us a link that we can share the
other ones that they directly go through you
all for the vendor's registration, provide
security, and we feel like this would promote
local locally (inaudible). We already have
sent out I sent two draft press releases out
to share with you all of how our press release
will look, making sure everyone knows that this
is a unified project between the two
organizations. We'll make sure we have all the
features, the hashtags, the contest winners,
have the press available. Let's see, I think
that's it. Council members, this is more than
event. It's an investment in Atlantic Beach
future. Let's make history together. By
approving this partnership, you'll unlock the
venue revenue, a surge in tourism and local
business, a legacy of unity that residents will
cherish for years.

And I would like to thank you for your time and your consideration. If there's any questions, I'll be glad to answer any of those.

FEMALE SPEAKER: You've already lined up entertainment for this. I see you have the basket weaver, is that already ---

MS. BROOKS: I I've been in contact, waiting for
that final I couldn't go too much further
without being able to say yes, Atlantic Beach
is partnered with us.

- **FEMALE SPEAKER:** So, we won't have to recruit entertainment?
- MS. BROOKS: No, we will do all -- everything. The only thing we ask is that you all provide security, the venue, if you'll do the link for the vendors, so that they can directly pay you all, that would be -- and we'll get the press releases out. We'll market it. Have a good time.
- **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Okay.

- 16 (Laughter)

- 17 MS. BROOKS: That'll be embarrassing (inaudible).
- MR. DAVID: Let me ask you something. How -- How
 many folks attended this event last year in
 Shallotte?
 - MS. BROOKS: In Shallotte, we had about 30 vendors, and we did it on the last weekend. Coast 97.3 came out. They would be glad to come out again if we -- if I can secure 'em fast enough. But we had approximately on and off all day, three

- to four hundred people attended. So, that's

 Shallotte. With you all ---
- 3 MR. DAVID: Uh-huh.

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- 4 MS. BROOKS: --- we're talking about a whole new ball game. This is like a level up for us.
 - MR. DAVID: Okay. And then what revenue did you receive last year? Or estimated revenue, or thought?
 - MS. BROOKS: Last year, we did -- we did not do vendor fees. The first two years, we did donations. We allowed them to come out, set up, and then they donated to us, and we had a donation of over \$2,500.
 - MR. DAVID: That was just from vendors. But what about the complete sponsorships and stuff like that?
- MS. BROOKS: The sponsorships, we had about the same amount. With our sponsorships, we had ---
- 19 MR. DAVID: Do you see that ---
- MS. BROOKS: (Inaudible) Plantation was one of our sponsors. This year, we feel like that we can really broaden our sponsorship with the highlight. Shallotte is a small town.

- 25 | BOARD MEMBER: (inaudible) 300 people in Shallotte

2 MALE SPEAKER: You did good.

3 | **BOARD MEMBER:** --- great.

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MS. BROOKS: Thank you.

6 | BOARD MEMBER: You did great.

MS. BROOKS: Well, we did -- we just did it the last weekend because we -- we started a little late with our planning, and we didn't want to override anyone that was doing already had their (inaudible). So, they actually opened it up so that we were able to have more people 'cause that weekend, we have people (inaudible).

One more thing, as far as the security, MR. DAVID: I think we -- depending on how many security, and if you were to work with us, we'd have to do the special permit through the Town, we'd probably talk to you about at least а 50 - 50split, depending on how much weneed with security or whatever, depending on -- a 50-50 split at a minimum, depending on how manv security folks we need estimated that weekend.

24 MS. BROOKS: Oh, on the security?

MR. DAVID: Yes, yes, yes.

- 1 MS. BROOKS: I'll take that to the board and see
 2 what ---
- 3 MR. DAVID: Yeah.

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- 4 MS. BROOKS: --- what they would say about it.
- 5 **BOARD MEMBER:** Your vendors, you say you charged each one of the vendors 300 bucks?
- 7 MS. BROOKS: No. Previous years, we didn't charge anything.
- 9 **BOARD MEMBER:** So, you were asking the Town to charge the vendors 300 bucks?
- MS. BROOKS: Yes, we have already vendors this year

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- 13 **BOARD MEMBER:** That will be coming back?
 - --- from previous years, already MS. BROOKS: reaching out to see what the vendor fee's gonna be, 'cause we told them at the time that we were starting out, so, we weren't charging anything at the beginning, and we were just requesting donations. Most οf 'em gave anywhere between 10 and 25 percent of what they made that day.
 - MR. DAVID: And with this, for the vendors, such as
 we're doing with the -- with the concert
 series, we're going to try to close off the
 street and not be where you have to pay the

landowners and and the vendors. So, we
if we close off the streets and get the
permission to do that until we own the street
ourself, then that money will come straight to
the Town, and then there won't be the extra
money going back so to the landowners for
taking up their land or being on their land.
We'll use hypothetically the lines from the
parking lines, so, each one would be a vendor
slot, and that would be revenue coming directly
to the Town.

- FEMALE SPEAKER: Okay. That was my question, so, you make your money through the sponsorships?
- MS. BROOKS: Ours is through the sponsorships and through ---
- **FEMALE SPEAKER:** Okay. Because we get all the vendor fees?
- MS. BROOKS: Yes, ma'am. We're doing it more for the connection ---
- **FEMALE SPEAKER:** And exposure.

MS. BROOKS: --- and for the history and making sure that, I mean, they -- every turn that you look, we are (inaudible) out education about history, and so we can continue making sure that our history, that's our biggest, but we

She -- we're 20 looking to put a mural on the side of the --21 well, we'd like to have murals everywhere, but 22 this current proposal is to put one as you come 23 down 30th, on the t-shirt shop side of the 24 window. And I think you all have a package 25 that -- well, it may not be in this package,

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but it's on email or somewhere, but that has an
idea that she'd have to work through to put the
big sign that they have Atlantic Beach open
year round, with the Atlantic beach shield, and
then some beachy scenes under the bottom. And
then which she gave us a good price of about
\$10,000 for, but said normally the price might
be, in my mind, 13,500. And then to put
another mural, the Gullah Geechee emblem that
we're using for the 2020 2025 festival
along the side of the fire station, and maybe
paint around that and make it beachy, as well
as just the scene of that. And that's for
5,000. I think she normally would have said
since we're doing both, she said that normally
that would be 6,500, based on her calculations,
but she dropped that price down to 5,000. So,
the total cost would be \$15,000 to do both
murals. I think there's a \$500 deposit for her
to get some drawings, and hopefully we can work
into that. But we're also seeking some
donations by some of the local businesses, as
well. We're still working on that. So, right
now, the cost would be \$15,000 minus any
sponsorships we get from local businesses.

The Town of Atlantic Beach was selected as thriving community by the United States Department of Transportation in 2022. We were one of the first groups of communities to do it, and our three years are ending. And as in getting recognition of our three years of excellent service and community engagement and discussion, we are proposing that we have a community event and put some street art on 32nd Avenue, which is the only street that the Town owns. At the current time, SCDOT is not in favor of street art on streets that they own, and so we are proposing that on Tuesday, May 13, that we have a community event and paint the street, 32nd Avenue.

BOARD MEMBER: What -- what kind of artwork will you be putting in?

MS. CHEATHAM: I -- it's -- I think you can do it.

It's just the Atlantic Beach with the pearl -black pearl in it that says Atlantic Beach.

4	40,206. There was \$79,263 worth of deposits.
5	There were \$57,532 worth of expenditures. And
6	so, at the end of Bike Fest, there was \$61,937
7	available. So that's in the Bike Fest bank
8	account, which we will use again this year to
9	put all the debits and run all the credits
10	rather than going through the general fund.

- 11 MR. DAVID: So, basically, we made \$37,000 or, if

 12 my math is right, 30----
- MS. CHEATHAM: We made 20- ---
- 14 MR. DAVID: Last year.
- 15 MS. CHEATHAM: Made \$21,000. You started with 40,000 and ---
- 17 MR. DAVID: And we're at 79.
- 18 MS. CHEATHAM: No, you're at 61,900, almost 62,000.

 19 That's -- that's the ---

 this year, you know, we spoke -- but the goal
 is to monetize Bike Fest.

- MR. DAVID: And we looked at -- I think Mr. Bellamy
 did a Bike Fest report ---

- 5 that we did not monetize correctly.

 - MR. DAVID: It didn't account for a lot of RVs. It didn't account for a lot of things that the Town should be paying for. I think it only had like 30 or 40 -- or 30-so vendors. So, we need to make sure that we monetize this event to the maximum.
 - In addition, and I don't know that I MS. CHEATHAM: went back -- I don't think I went back to address it, there were charges made to the general fund that were really Bike Fest expenditures. And so, they were -- the checks were made out of the wrong -- the wrong fund. So, I ---
- MR. DAVID: So, it's even less money made last year.

They're saving 8 Atlantic Beach, and we weren't making a dime 9 I think we need to look off of it. into 10 trademarking the name because at one time, I had anything trademark 11 don't even think we 12 here, but the Town was making anybody that was 13 using the Town of Atlantic Beach name, they had 14 to pay for it. So, I think, though -- I mean, once -- that's kind of iffy, because at 15 16 time, there was a time when that trademark was 17 gone. So, I'm not sure if somebody kept it up 18 and let it go or whatever, but I think we need 19 to look into that, because that way we could 20 get money off our (inaudible), 'cause right now 21 aren't getting anything off of it, 22 they're making thousands of dollars of the Town 23 of Atlantic Beach (inaudible). So, I think 24 that's something that might (inaudible).

comments, we checked with our t-shirt guy that's here at the beach about getting some -- some Atlantic Beach memorabilia and other things. And we've checked -- I've checked with two other vendors, I haven't got anything back, to have some Atlantic -- we'd like to sell Atlantic Beach memorabilia. And I know y'all got a bunch of jobs already to do, but if there's some way we can look at that, if not this year, in the future, 'cause I think that's excellent with the trademarks ---

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information on where with you wе were and revenue οf the end expenditures as οf January, when the accountant left, and for some items, how much money we received in February and March of this year, what the anticipated revenue or expenditure is for April through June, and what the projection would be as of June 30, '25. So, for property taxes, we had a budget of 302 -- 302,000. We think we'll end the year with \$360,768, and that's after we do the rollback. This is money that we would -be in our treasures. It would not be any money that we needed to send back.

The next largest item is licenses and permits. We had a budget of 644. We think we'll end the year with 647.

the other income is on the back, the last pa- -- well, the third page, what that other income is, because there wasn't anything. It was \$57,000 budgeted, but in other income, we received a \$24,000 grant for the electric chargers. We had some American Rescue money of \$83,000 that we used to fix the roof and to buy the additional EV chargers. We had -- we got a historic preservation grant from the Donnelly

Foundation that we paid out of the general 1 2 fund. And so that foundation owes us \$17,000.

- MR. DAVID: They paid it, or they owe it to us?
- MS. CHEATHAM: They paid it ---
- 5 MR. DAVID: And we spent it?
- 6 MS. CHEATHAM: We spent it, but we owe it back to 7 ourselves.
- 8 MR. DAVID: Okav.

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- MS. CHEATHAM: There's \$11,000 in a police reserve fund that I don't know what that's for, so I'm going to claim that. We applied for Santee Cooper grant for economic development, which they denied everything except the computer. And that totals \$136,000. And then for the 3rd Street water project, we're going to get \$69,000 from that. So, that makes that other income. That's the one ---
- 18 MR. DAVID: That's not in there, though.
- 19 MS. CHEATHAM: I know, it's not in there. I'm 20 sorry. So, there's another \$69,000 that should 21 be added to the other income. I keep playing 22 with the numbers. And then the parking program 23 is new for \$40,000. Hopefully, we can get 24 between now and June 30th for the parking program.

And then our rate after that, for every \$1,000 is 28 cents, which is high. 3 4 And I think we talked about it -- I thought we 5 had -- hope we -- I thought we agreed to it, the -- do 90 cents, because we had the 6 proposals in front of us. The 90 cents and for 7 8 the first 2000, and 26 cent for the thousands 9 after that.

- 10 **MS. CHEATHAM:** 26?
- 11 MR. DAVID: Yes, ma'am. So, we ---
- 12 BOARD MEMBER: So ---
- 13 MR. DAVID: Go ahead.
- 14 | BOARD MEMBER: So, that's for the business license?
- 15 MR. DAVID: Yes.
- 16 | BOARD MEMBER: And so, therefore, we're saying, drop

- 25 gets us minus 16 to \$18,000, and we've



increased our property tax, as you see, I think
by about \$40,000 at that current rate of 77
cent. And if we go higher than that, it'll be
slightly higher than that. So, we will make
that revenue back with even if we decrease
the millage. But it does give the build our
businesses some relief, and also hopes to keep
the businesses here, because, again, our
business license tax is one of the highest in
the states, if not the highest, and our tax
millage is one of the highest in the State.
So, we hope to give our land owners and
businesses some relief since, you know,
assessments went up last year with property
taxes. So, we do make money from that. And
the other revenue generators that we do have,
such as the concert series or the parking and
any other things that we're able to bring
forward to the Town.

BOARD MEMBER: But don't we want -- do we really want to do these at the same time, though?

MR. DAVID: Yes, 'cause they're overdue.

BOARD MEMBER: Well, I mean, I understand ---

(Inaudible due to simultaneous speakers.)

MR. DAVID: And it's only a difference -- even if

you look at it, again, if we bring the business taxes down -- and you have the sheet in your la- -- in your packet, it is only -- not in this package, the last one in your folder, it's only 17 to \$18,000 with decreasing the business taxes that much. And we actually have gained last year, even with the rebates that we have to do, we gained basically 41 -- \$42,000, so, we haven't lost anything in revenues. We've actually gained.
