18	charisma and loving and the love of
19	community to the historic Town of Atlantic
20	Beach in the early 2000s where he quickly
21	established himself himself as a vital
22	member of the community. Whereas, Will work
23	tirelessly for the Atlantic Beach community,
24	serving on the Atlantic Beach beau
25	Beautification Committee and co-founding the

1	Atlantic Beach Gullah Geechee Organization,
2	Inc. Whereas, Will inspired the creation of
3	the stage play, The Black Pearl, performed
4	which was performed at Coastal Carolina
5	University in 2025 as a direct result of the
6	2023 Gullah Geechee Festival success and Will's
7	visionary influence. Whereas, Will saw the
8	need for street signs and personally raised
9	over \$5,000 for the installation through door-
10	to-door community fundraising. Whereas, Will
11	supported the installation of the community
12	seating in the Town's cul de sac and in front
13	of Town Hall and the Atlantic Beach Community
14	Center. Whereas, Will was an influence
15	influential member of the Atlantic Beach Zoning
16	Board of Appeals. Whereas, Will's kindness and
17	quiet gestures touched everyone in our
18	community and renewed sense of identity and
19	rooted deeply in heritage and lifted by hope.
20	Whereas, Will's legacy reminds us that service
21	is sacred, that beauty can be communal and that
22	true leadership often whispers rather than
23	shouts. Whereas, Will showed us legacy begins
24	and endures with love. Whereas, on June 29,
25	2025 Will peacefully ended his journey on this

earth. MR. JONES: Well, the Town of Atlantic Beach has -for -- in order for us to come to complete and start our comprehensive plan, we have to do a series of things, and one is updating our land ordinances and our LMOs and how they pertain to certain businesses. So, here, over the near future, we're going to be updating the processes with our land ordinances for uses of golf carts, traffic ordinances, public nuisance, stuff of that nature. We'll be refining and updating those ordinances to that -- you got anything you want me to ---

MR. DAVID: That's it. And I think this just follows in suit. We did the parking ordinances back a month or two ago. We're doing the traffic ordinances now so that also the police had mentioned plenty of times that they didn't have the teeth to do certain things. And I

1	think the police chief will talk about that.

3	and then they turn 'em into different citations
4	that can then be processed through the Town.
5	I think one of the biggest things, too, we had
6	people down at Ocean, and we still do,
7	hopefully they'll regulate that as much as
8	possible that we have, you know, people living
9	down in the dunes, and they shouldn't be living
10	in the dunes. And we had nothing or teeth to
11	say anything, to do anything about that, and
12	now we do. So, the traffic ordinances just

- 23 archivist for the historical Town of Atlantic
- 24 Beach, and today I'm standing on behalf of the
- Town's Historical Committee, which includes Pat

1	Millette, Rose Rucker, Helen Pierce and John
2	Skeeters. That's just to name a few. We are
3	all very proud of our Town's recent designation
4	as a historic district on the National Register
5	of Historic Places. This designation is
6	designed to ensure that our history is
7	preserved, and all that visit our town are
8	aware of the importance of the cultural and
9	historical events which took place here. As a
10	part of our nomination, a survey was conducted
11	of the properties, memorabilia and artifacts.
12	This survey identified many historical
13	artifacts and items. Today, I'm standing to
14	discuss the properties in the Town which were
15	identified. The application lists 72
16	properties within Atlantic Beach which are 50
17	years and older and which were important during
18	the time of our historical designation. These
19	72 properties were listed in the application as
20	contr as contributing properties, and we
21	have a list of them, because I know somebody's
22	going to ask me that. We do have a list of
23	them. The request of the Historical Committee
24	to the Town Council is that the Council approve
25	a specific marker for the contributing

1	properties. This came about because several
2	citizens have asked us what what could we do
3	so that they could designate their property as
4	one of those properties that was here 50 years
5	or longer, and what could we do that would be
6	uniform. So, the committee researched it, and
7	what we found that the there are markers
8	offered by the South Carolina Office of
9	Historic Preservation, and as our Town for
10	you can make it our Town's official marker.
11	These markers are referred to as plaques. The
12	reason that is, you remember, we have a marker
13	at the Town Hall. You can't have that, but you
14	can have what's referred to as a plaque. This
15	is the this one was one of the ones that's
16	up in Greenville. This is just one of the
17	designs, and this goes on your door. It goes
18	on would be right on your front door, and
19	designate you there as a contributing historic
20	property. And basically that's that's what
21	we're asking you to consider. If you have

And there's other dates after that, in September, October and November. Tomorrow is the needs assessment, which will be held here in the Community Center. The last needs assessment that was done by Waccamaw Regional Council of Governments was in 2019, so, we're gonna update that, and hopefully it'll help us with the CBDG grants and other things that are going on. So,

please come out in the community, if you can, let 'em know your thoughts, your needs.

FEMALE SPEAKER: Is there a time?

MR. DAVID: 6:00 o'clock, I think. I think there's flyers out there, yeah.

MR. DAVID: So, if there's flyers and please come out and provide your input. And I'll second, we need to have everyone's input when it comes to the comprehensive plan.
