Ms. Rosa Rucker Lightfoot, and Ms. Pat Mallett, who now serves as the Chair of the Horry County Historic Preservation Commission. Since their appointment, these ladies have overseen the

telling of the full history -- oral history collection. Collecting many hours of history for many of us. If you shared your history with them, please stand right now, real quickly if you had the opportunity to share history with them. Thank you. Thank you. Thank you, everybody.

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MR. DAVID: The next thing that they are excited for is following the oral history collection, the committee work to digitize the historical artifacts that many of us have in our homes so that they can become a permanent part of our history. If you shared these documents, newspaper, or photos with the committee, please stand. Next, and finally, most recently, these fantastic ladies served as the committee which gave significant leadership to and support of the Atlantic Beach nomination as a Historic District on the National Registry of Historic Places. Our nomination was approved on November 5th -- 15th by the And each of these ladies was there to state. support in Columbia. So, with that we would like to give them a good round of applause.

Because of their hard work and on behalf of the town of Atlantic Beach I am please to present these certificates which we have as recognition on their behalf from the entire town. And we'll make sure that they get this. And we are really, really appreciative.

MR. DAVID: I can't read what I -- the certificates say the Town of Atlantic Beach, South

Carolina, the Black Pearl. Certificate of Appreciation. This certificate is presented to each of the four ladies for there tireless work to research, document, preserve, and share the rich history of Atlantic Beach.

The only beachfront community to remain in the hands of African-Americans since inception, in 1934, and as a member of the Atlantic Beach historic committee presented on January 6th, 2025. So again, we thank those

1	ladies for all their efforts. And today, we

DAVID: Next we have the Manager's report. FEMALE SPEAKER: Thank you. You gonna take this? 16 17 MR. DAVID: You want this? If it'll go. 18 MS. CHEATHAM: You can hear me right? 19 MALE SPEAKER: (Laughing.) 20 MS. CHEATHAM: No one's ever said it like that. 21 (Laughing) 22 MS. CHEATHAM: How is everyone? Happy New Year. 23 EVERYONE: Happy New Year.

MS. CHEATHAM: Mr. Mayor and members of council as
well the residents of the Town of Atlantic

Beach. I'd like to take a few minutes today
and talk about some of the accomplishments
that occurred in the town during 2024. Most,
or much of what we read about in the town is
not necessarily favorable news. In fact, I
cancelled my subscription Sun-News. But they
gave it to me for free. So I told them that
I was tired of seeing negative publicity
about where I live and there is never any
good things published. And, so I cancelled
it and they assured me that they were gonna
do some things differently. And, I said
okay. I'll take it if it's free. So we'll
see what happens. Well, I wanted to just to
spend a few minutes talking about some of the
great things that occurred. Last January,
we had a meeting of Black Pearl by a
playwright, Grace Robinson, and it was
directed a Mr. Williams. This play is going
to be put on again this year at Coastal. And
it's gonna cost a lot of money to buy tickets
and we were able to have read and care last
year for free. In February, the
International Gullah Geechee and African
Diaspora Conference visited the beach and had

a tour and shared stories with us. In May,
the Silvern Art Museum opened. In addition,
the town received three awards on the Harry
County Historic Preservation Committee. In
June, Adapt and Serve installed a wheelchair
access on 3rd Avenue for people who were not
able to get to the beach from the sand. On
the 23rd there was a Mullah Leechee Festival.
On the 22nd of June, we had the Bike Riders
Across Georgia who were traveling on their
bicycles from Florida to Maine, stopped by
here and had a conversation. They did not
know about Atlantic Beach, but they were
thrilled to come and we had very nice
discussion with them. On July 20th, we had
an Economic Development Workshop. On August
8th, we sponsored a meeting with the South
Carolina Department of Transportation about
the highway improvements on seventeen. In
November, we had our first groundbreaking for
a development property by the ground. Also,
on in November we traveled to Columbia to
be nominated to be on the National Registry
of the Historic Places, the Town of Atlantic
Beach. It was approved by Shifter and we

expect to receive confirmation any day now.

And in December, the police had a wonderful

Christmas party. They were advertised for

the youth but a lot of people like myself

came and --

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MS. CHEATHAM: And had a good time. In addition to those activities we are able to put some EV chargers in the town. We have one that is already outside and we'll be putting another three level charging fast speed next to the And we also anticipate getting a Art Museum. couple of more. We have made commitments to make the repairs to the roof so the lights will stop blinking. We have also began to discussing to take out these florescent lights and get some LED lights. And on Wednesday, we are going to visit with Santee Cooper to talk about burying those wires, some of the wires, underground. And we've also had some paving done for the town. So I'd like you all to give yourself a round of applause for a wonderful job.

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UNKNOWN SPEAKER: It is not a question. I just want to thank you for highlighting for the public, and the press, all the positive things that are happening, and have happened in the Town of Atlantic Beach this past year. And I'd also like to give a special shout out to our Public Safety Department for the Children's Christmas Party or the Community Christmas Party. As a parent, my child was very excited about her gift, as you said the food was good, the atmosphere was beautiful. They did a great job decorating, so I just wanted to thank you all again for the time and effort that you put into celebrating the holidays with the community. Thank you.

MR. DAVID: I just want to mention one thing too, great report. The Black Pearl play at Coastal Carolina will be in full force. And opening night is Friday March 28th, and it will run until April 6th. So, I encourage everyone to go out and see. The readings

were exceptional. We were blessed to have them here and I look forward to seeing the actual play, so if anybody can go we like to make sure that we are well represented on open night -- opening night. As well as throughout the play's performance.

FEMALE SPEAKER: Are the ticket's on sale yet?

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- MR. DAVID: I think they are, they are listed. The pricing is \$19.00 for adults and down to \$16.00 for seniors and -- \$15.00 for seniors and alumni, and stuff like that.
- MS. CHEATHAM: I just wanted to talk a little bit about the budget for the year. We had a budget of 1.3 million dollars. And that's all we can spend, no more no less, because we have to have balanced budget. We were fortunate as I went through the accounts to -I didn't find any money but there was some money that was provided to the town during That they put out a number the the pandemic. second -- the last week in November that had to be spent by the end of December -- had to be obligated. And so that's how we're getting the roof fixed. To be able to do that, that's \$83,000.00. And, so we think

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that we can probably get about 200 thousand more dollars for the year. And, so they will give us a budget of 1.4. We've had a lot of legal expenses. We had a legal budget of \$87,000.00. We've already spent \$114 and the cases keeps piling on. And, so we gonna have to make some adjustments because we have to pay for our attorneys and we can't not respond when people file charges with us. All in all, we think that we will -- we will end the year in a positive light. We have some more work to do to understand some of the charges that have been made before I But, all in all, we got a good year -we had a good year and we will continue to have a good year. Thank you and I will be back (sic).

MR. BOOKER: (unclear audio) - - I just want to make an announcement about Dominion energy service. You may hear from someone that they are not able to get gas service. I know that there is a business owner here in town, who I spoke with that wanted to add on some commercial operations and they wanted to get gas. they called Dominion Energy and then Dominion Energy told them that they would not no longer add any gas service to Atlantic Beach. So, from looking into that, what I determined from talking protagf?? From Duke Energy that they need to improve or increase their live gas lines that brings the gas to Harry County. And they have a plan to do that, but, there is an environmental group that has

1	taken legal action against them to prevent
2	them from making this approved.
3	Until then it is necessary so that they can
4	add on more service and name change the
5	pressure from the current customer. Until
6	then buy those roots to build a court
7	Dominion Energy won the lawsuit. But, they
8	appealed the decision, so they still can't do
9	the upgrade. So, until that upgrade can
10	occur Dominion Energy is not adding any
11	commercial services in Harry County. And
12	they are not added any residential services
13	that they are not on a street that already
14	have a gas lane. So if there is a gas lane
15	in front of a property and you wanted to get
16	gas they could tap into that but if they
17	happen to be on a street where there is no
18	gas service on that street then they are not
19	going to run a lane along that street to give
20	people the service. And they wanted to do
21	this so that they can maintain the service
22	and the pressures from the current customers
23	and so once this lawsuit is resolved. Then
24	they can continue to increase their number of
25	customers and give service where other people

would want it, but, they can't do it right now because (cough). So, just, I wanted to share this with you in case you hear someone say, they can't get gas and when the person calls they said that we are not adding any gas to Atlantic Beach and I was curious as to why just Atlantic Beach. And it is not just the black community, it is Harry county. I just wanted to make you aware. Thank you
