5		purpose of of this ordinance is to support
6		the re-zoning of the majority of the first and
7		second beachfront properties from waterfront
8		one and waterfront two to residential, R-2.
9	MR.	DAVID: Is there other discussion? I'd like to
10		say, a point of privilege, we have had our
11		oceanfront has been not developed for years.
12		Since probably `54 when Hurricane Hazel
13	MS.	GORE: I beg to differ
14	MR.	DAVID: Well, again, I
15	MS.	GORE: It's been it's been since then.
16	MR.	DAVID: And then since we had Hurricane Hugo,
17		which also continued to destroy the things that
18		we had on the oceanfront. One of the reasons
19		that we don't have development or can't get
20		commercial development, I believe, is that we
21		have misaligned land management ordinances with
22		the deed restrictions that are on the
23		oceanfront. So, when many people go to try to
24		get loans for commercial properties and they go
25		through underwriting, and when the underwriters



1	see that those lots are deed restricted, they
2	are not able to move forward commercially. And
3	why prevent many people that can build homes.
4	Such as George Tyson, originally put in the
5	deed restriction that says on a lot of the
6	lots it says, no hotel houses and only
7	residential use. And we want to align our land
8	management ordinance with the deed restrictions
9	that George Tyson originally placed. And this
10	will help us do it. This will help growth and
11	development on the oceanfront, I believe,
12	'cause it is easier for people to get
13	residential loans compared to commercial loans.
14	We've had a couple of economic development
15	forums in the Town. We've had several bankers
16	here, ten to twenty, at different times. We
17	have another forum scheduled in August, the
18	29th. It is very, very hard for people that
19	own 50 by 150 lots to get a commercial loan
20	that don't have previous business experience
21	and not five years of profit and loss
22	statements to show that they've had a
23	successful business. And, again, the deeds are
24	not aligned and they have never been they
25	haven't been aligned since I've been reading



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1	this information, and we are seeking to do
2	that. We're not seeking to harm anyone. We're
3	seeking to grow the beach and we're seeking to
4	follow the wishes of George Tyson, who
5	originally put the deed restrictions in place.
6	Any other comments?

7 MS. GORE: Yes.

8 MR. DAVID: Go ahead.

9 MS. GORE: I just don't see how it's gonna benefit 10 the Town. And I understand what you're saying, but why don't we let the property owner worry 11 12 about how they're gonna get financed through 13 the bank or what have you? Because you're 14 saying that the reason why there isn't anything 15 oceanfront is because οf the the on 16 restrictions, the bankers won't let them get 17 money, la da la, that's not true. That's not 18 the reason why there's nothing on that 19 oceanfront down there. The reason why there 20 isn't anything on the oceanfront, back in 2005, 21 2006, 2007, she was here -- the reason why 22 those folks didn't develop that property -- and 23 it was not for no homes, it was for commercial 24 buildings, was because of the economy fold on 25 It wasn't because of the banks telling 'em.



1	them they couldn't get no money. It was
2	because they've they've had money in line.
3	The economy went bad on 'em and that's why they
4	didn't build there. It wasn't because of no
5	restrictions there. And maybe there are
6	restrictions, but why don't we let those folks
7	figure out how they're gonna get the loan for
8	the property to put commercial on that
9	oceanfront. We talking about on our
10	oceanfront. So, we come to the beach, we got
11	four blocks here. We come to the beach, we
12	gotta go in somebody's back yard to go to the
13	beach whenever we could be going through
14	commercial buildings there versus going through
15	almost like getting permission to somebody
16	'cause we making too much noise at the beach
17	and now they're trying to sleep in their
18	we're on the oceanfront and we're talking about
19	putting houses on our oceanfront. That's to
20	me, it don't sound like it's nothing that
21	that make any sense at all.
22	MR. DAVID: In addition to that, we're also securing
23	the beach accesses on each one of the streets
24	that we can have going down 29th, 30th, 31st,
25	and 32nd, so that we can seeking to put



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1		restrooms, showers, seating areas as we move
2		forward to try to get monies to build those
3		areas so that people do have access and
4		continued access to the beach. Go ahead.
5	MS.	CHEATHAM: Mr. Mayor, if I may. This request,
6		while it says it says it's being initiated by
7		the Town, it's being initiated because the
8		majority of the property owners, people who own
9		property on the waterfront, have said that they
10		would like to have residential properties on
11		the property that they own. And because it's
12		zoned commercial, they are prohibited from
13		doing that. So, we've had substantial
14		conversation with property owners who have
15		asked us to
16	MS.	GORE: Who came and initially bought commercial
17		property but they want to put a house there
18	MS.	CHEATHAM: Right.
19	MS.	GORE: so, therefore, now they have a
20		problem. Well, they should have went somewhere
21		and bought a
22	MS.	CHEATHAM: A lot
23	MS.	GORE: a residential property where they
24		have residential property on the beach side.
25		How will we sit here and we're gonna just fold



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1		in because they came in and bought a property
2		a hundred years later and now they want to turn
3		our commercial into residential because they
4		want to put a house there?
5	(Ina	audible due to simultaneous speakers.)
6	MS.	CHEATHAM: A lot of times, Madam
7	COUL	NCILMAN: Go ahead.
8	MS.	CHEATHAM: Councilwoman, people aren't told
9		that the deed restrictions exist on the
10		property when they purchase it.
11	MR.	DAVID: Councilwoman Taylor?
12	MS.	GORE: Wait, wait a minute. Hold up.
13	MR.	DAVID: Let her speak.
14	MS.	GORE: Wait, wait. I'm speaking to her first
15		right now. Wait, wait, wait a minute.
16	MR.	DAVID: All right. Go ahead.
17	MS.	GORE: Because I don't see how you all just
18		you so how many people have came to ya'll
19		and asked you all to change it because they
20		want to put homes there? So, that we got one
21		man that own what, eight lots right there on
22		the oceanfront?

24	MS.	GORE: He got eight lots right there. So, he
25		gets to come in with his eight lots on the



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1	oceanfront and tell us that, well, we we
2	wanna put houses there. We just bought this
3	property for however many millions of dollars
4	they did, and it's very special property, but
5	still nah, I don't think that's fair to the
6	people. Not just the people that live in
7	Atlantic Beach, but for the surrounding areas.
8	MS. CHEATHAM: It's been more than it's it's
9	been more than him. It's been
10	MR. DAVID: A lot the peo the peo
11	MS. GORE: 20. We will say 20.
12	MR. DAVID: Go ahead Councilwoman Taylor.
13	MS. TAYLOR: I just I just wanna make the
14	something that you said about going to the
15	beach and being in people's back yards. You
16	make the assumption that if there were
17	commercial developments, that people from the
18	street could just walk through and and so,
19	I am just confused by that. What difference
20	does it make
21	MS. GORE: Okay, so let me (inaudible)
22	COUNCILWOMAN: if it's a commercial builder or
23	residential? Either way, the public won't have
24	access to those buildings. That's why we will
25	have beach accesses available. The dunes are

18	MS. CHEATHAM: Mr. Mayor and members of Council,
19	Ordinance Number 4-2025 accomplishes two
20	things. The first thing, it implements the
21	parking program that we discussed in January to
22	have paid parking on several of the public
23	lots. We have entered in agreements with
24	property owners to allow parking. There'll be
25	a revenue sharing proposal with them. Last



1	May, we issued a request for a proposal and we
2	have implemented that. The other is to begin to
3	re-write our Code of Ordinances and so this is
4	the general provisions section. There has to
5	be some renumbering of this, but the general
6	provisions, as well as the parking provision
7	for the paid parking.
8	MR. DAVID: And I do I do wish to notate that
9	with this parking, we are generating revenue
10	projections of revenue anywhere from 250,000 to
11	400,000. And the Town in year one would get
12	approximately 45 percent of that minus expenses
13	and revenue sharing with land owners. And in
14	year two, three year two and in the option
15	year three and four, we would split 50-50 with
16	the parking company in addition to the revenues
17	that we generate or split or share the land
18	owners. So, it would bring significant revenue
19	to the Town. I move that we approve Ordinance
20	Number 4-24 under the first reading with edits
21	by Town Council members to the Town Manager and
22	the attorney. Is there a second?
