TOWN OF ATLANTIC BEACH, SOUTH CAROLINA

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PARKING OF ANY VEHICLES THE ENTIRE LENGTH OF 30TH AVENUE SOUTH DURING THE ANNUAL MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND BIKE FEST

WHEREAS, Bike Fest is held in the Town of Atlantic Beach, South Carolina, every Memorial Day Weekend; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Town of Atlantic Beach (the "Town Council") has determined that vehicular parking on the entire length of 30th Avenue South creates an unsafe situation for persons attending the festival;

WHEREAS, the Town Council believes there would be a threat to the safety of Town residents and visitors if parking on the entire length of 30th Avenue South were permitted during the festival;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Town of Atlantic Beach that

- 1. The parking of any vehicles (including but not limited to cars, trucks, van, motorcycles, motorbikes, or motor scooters) on the entire length of 30th Avenue South during the annual Memorial Day weekend bike festival is prohibited.
- 2. Any vehicles parked on the entire length of 30th Avenue South shall be towed and the vehicle may not be redeemed without payment in full of all costs associated with the towing.
- 3. A person violating this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction shall be fined in any sum not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) for each offense hereunder.

This Ordinance shall be included in the comprehensive Code of Ordinances of the Town of Atlantic Beach.

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately.
