ORDINANCE

REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 1-99 ENACTED JANUARY 4, 1999; ACKNOWLEDGING THE REINSTATEMENT OF THE ADULT ENTERTAINMENT ORDINANCE ADOPTED APRIL 2, 1990; AND A DECLARING A MORITORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF BUSINESS LICENSES FOR SEXUALLY-ORIENTED BUSINESSES

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Atlantic Beach, South Carolina (the "Town Council") has heretofore purported to enact Ordinance No. 1-99 to make modifications in the regulation of sexually oriented businesses; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was not held in connection with the adoption of said Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has been advised the enactment of Ordinance No. 1-99 was procedurally defective.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL as follows:

- 1. The Town Council finds that Ordinance No. 1-99 is of no legal force and effect.
- 2. The Town Council finds that to the extent necessary Ordinance No. 1-99 is repealed.
- 3. The Town Council finds that the Adult Entertainment Ordinance adopted April 2, 1990, has been in and continues to be in full force and effect since the date of its enactment.
- 4. The Town Council is in the process of considering amendments to its Zoning Ordinance including amendments to the regulations related to sexually oriented businesses. Until such time as said amendments are adopted the Town Council directs that a moritorium be placed on the issuance of any new or additional business licenses relating to sexually oriented businesses. The Town Manager is directed to not issue any such licenses.
- 5. The Town Council finds and declares that it intends to make all such modifications in the Zoning Ordinance by the end of August 1999, and that the moritorium referenced above will expire at the end of business on August 31, 1999, unless extended by ordinance of the Town Council.
