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1 Call to Order:

2 **MAYOR EVANS:** This Town Council meeting is called  
3 back to order. Council, I need a motion -- I  
4 seek a motion to go into Executive session for  
5 Legal, Contractual and Personnel Matters.

6 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** I second.

7 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** We ain't got the first one yet.

8 **COUNCILMAN EVANS:** What, you want a motion?

9 **MAYOR EVANS:** A motion.

10 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Yeah.

11 **MAYOR EVANS:** Yeah.

12 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Oh. I seek a motion for ---

19 **MAYOR EVANS:** We're down to Old Business. Town  
20 Council meetings for adoption, we have none.  
21 And B is the FEMA reimbursement for Hurricane  
22 Florence.

23 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Mayor and Council, I reported in  
24 that last meeting that we received the first  
25 half of our reimbursement of 75 percent of



1 Hurricane Florence cost that the county  
2 expended for the clean up after the hurricane.  
3 We received our second installment of \$3,765  
4 for reimbursement of our cost. 75 percent of  
5 the cost for clean up. Just to report.

6 **MAYOR EVANS:** Okay. Thank you.

7 **New Business:**

8 **MAYOR EVANS:** Council we're down to New Business.  
9 Public Hearing for the 2019/2020 proposed  
10 general fund budget. I seek a motion to open  
11 the floor to the public for the public hearing  
12 for the general fund budget.

13 **COUNCILMAN EVANS:** So moved.

14 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Second.

15 **MAYOR EVANS:** There is a motion and second to open  
16 the floor for a public hearing on the proposed  
17 budget for 2019/2020. Any other questions or  
18 comments? Roll call?

19 **CLERK:** Mayor pro tem Kenneth McLaurin?

20 **MAYOR PRO TEM McLAURIN:** Yea.

21 **CLERK:** Councilman Lenearl Evans?

22 **COUNCILMAN EVANS:** Yea.

1 COUNCILWOMAN GORE: Yea.

2 CLERK: Mayor Jake Evans?

3 MAYOR EVANS: Yea. Motion granted.

4 Public Comments:

5 MR. QUATTLEBAUM: Mayor and Council, I just want --  
6 the public -- I just want to give an overview  
7 of the sheet I passed out with the budget  
8 projections. Starting with actuals for  
9 2017/'18. Budgeted for 2018/'19 and projected  
10 to the end of the fiscal year June 30th 2019.  
11 And (inaudible) we are projecting that our  
12 income -- total income by June 30th, will hit  
13 \$712,562.08. Primary increases coming in the  
14 area of license and permitting fees. We are  
15 collecting about 98 percent of our business  
16 license fees that have been assessed. All of  
17 our other costs. Franchise costs and the  
18 Governmental cost have remained pretty much the  
19 same. Our Hospitality tax has remained pretty  
20 much the same. So we're projecting at the end  
21 of the year, income of \$712,562. Expenses for  
22 2018/2019, third column. Our major costs have  
23 increased for personnel. The adding of  
24 additional staff, as well as providing medical  
25 coverage for employee only. And also a



1 dramatic increase in our insurance cost. Not  
2 only to the Town of Atlantic Beach but to all  
3 municipalities are in the insurance reserve  
4 fund. Possibly due to the hurricanes that  
5 we've sustained over the last couple of years.  
6 Major cost increase expenditure, line adding  
7 repairs and maintenance of \$73,889, due to the  
8 improvements to the old firehouse, community  
9 center and upgrades to Town Hall. Carpeting,  
10 phone system that were taken on this past  
11 summer. Projected expenses, \$712,298.76 for  
12 the end of this fiscal year, June 30th.  
13 Proposed for our fiscal year, 2019 beginning  
14 July 1st, 2019 running until June 30th, 2020.  
15 We anticipate property tax increases in income.  
16 Primarily due to -- we have five homes that are  
17 under construction and should be compleated and  
18 added to the tax rolls by the end of -- before  
19 the end of 2020. Projecting a modest projected  
20 increase of about 6 percent in property taxes  
21 collected. Also the major income increase area  
22 I'm looking to increase business license  
23 permitting fees from project \$279,756 for the  
24 current fiscal year to \$355,000. All other  
25 income sources remain pretty much constant,



1 with a slight increase with residuals from  
2 fines and tickets assessed in the portion the  
3 town received from those charges. Projected  
4 income for our fiscal year 2019/2020 is \$7,000  
5 -- \$757,300. Projected expenses. Dramatic  
6 increase in personnel cost, again due to the  
7 underlying medical costs, insurance cost,  
8 pension cost. An addition of additional police  
9 officer to the staff of the town. We currently  
10 have three. We wanted to try to hire two  
11 additional, but we're going to try to add one  
12 position for this current fiscal year.  
13 Possibly adding another, if fiscally possible.  
14 Other than that, all other costs are relatively  
15 remained the same. I've asked Council, major  
16 capital purchases to upgrade our internet  
17 system. To segregate our police department  
18 from administration as required by the state.  
19 The purchase of a new vehicle -- maintenance  
20 vehicle, under capital equipment purchases of  
21 \$25,000 for replacement of a police vehicle as  
22 well as a maintenance vehicle that is 19 years  
23 old. I've asked Council to earmark and reserve  
24 \$30,000 in 2019/2020 budget for development  
25 cost to hire technical assistance, grant



1 writers and any support we need to develop  
2 property within the Town of Atlantic Beach.  
3 Those are the major changes with total  
4 projected expenses of \$750,040. Open for  
5 questions.

6 **MAYOR EVANS:** At this time we will entertain any  
7 questions from the public as it pertains to the  
8 budget only. Come to the podium and state your  
9 name.

10 **MR. MONTGOMERY:** Just a question (inaudible) --  
11 Santee Cooper ---

12 **MAYOR EVANS:** State your name for the record, Joe.

13 **MR. MONTGOMERY:** I'm Joe Montgomery. Santee  
14 Cooper's been franchised here. We still have  
15 that with Santee Cooper?

16 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** The franchise fee that they pay to  
17 us?

18 **MR. MONTGOMERY:** Yeah. That's paid to the town.

19 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** No. Back -- back two years ago,  
20 Santee Cooper made a recommendation to --  
21 because they were not going to continue their  
22 underlying fiber optic program ---

23 **MR. MONTGOMERY:** Uh-huh.

24 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** --- and that they'd reimburse to  
25 the town at that time -- I can't remember the



1 exact amount -- I think it was two years ago  
2 and discontinued that program. So we don't  
3 receive that franchise fee from Santee Cooper  
4 anymore.

5 **MR. MONTGOMERY:** Okay. That's why I asked that  
6 question.

7 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Yes, sir.

8 **MR. MONTGOMERY:** Okay. So this franchise -- being  
9 it's here mostly on the ---

10 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Motor sports. Atlantic Water  
11 sports that we have an agreement. 20 year  
12 agreement.

13 **MR. MONTGOMERY:** That's it. Thank you.

14 **MAYOR EVANS:** Any other -- any other questions from  
15 the general public on the general fund budget?

16 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Let me -- I stand corrected. I  
17 stand corrected. We received back the residual  
18 money that was collected from Santee Cooper.  
19 Santee Cooper is still paying us the franchise  
20 fee. They are still paying us their franchise  
21 fee, I'm sorry. I stand corrected. They have  
22 the reserves built up that they returned and  
23 they discontinued that program. But they do  
24 still pay us a franchise fee.

25 **MR. MONTGOMERY:** (inaudible)



1 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Yes, sir. Thank you.

2 **MAYOR EVANS:** Any other questions from the public on  
3 the budget? Council do you have any questions?  
4 Okay. I seek a -- Council, I seek a motion to  
5 close the public hearing?

6 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** So moved, Mr. Mayor.

6 will be the budget for 2019/2020. And this is  
7 again, the first reading. Any other questions  
8 or comments; if not, roll call?

25 **MAYOR EVANS:** You forgot to make a motion. I seek a



1 motion, not make it.

2 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** I seek a mo- ---

3 **MAYOR EVANS:** Yes. You can go ahead.

4 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** The Town of Atlantic Beach  
5 advertised for clean up for the Bike Fest  
6 Festival in the Sun News. We received two  
7 proposals for clean up. The lowest bidder was  
8 TKK Irrigation and Landscaping out of Myrtle  
9 Beach, at an amount of \$10,875. We also  
10 received a bid proposal from Mr. James Lewis in  
11 the amount of \$13,500. I'm recommending the  
12 award of contract for clean up service for Bike  
13 Fest 2019 to TKK Irrigation and Landscaping in  
14 the amount of \$10,875.

15 **MAYOR EVANS:** Council, seek a motion, to award the  
16 clean up contract to TKK Irrigation in the  
17 amount of \$10,875.

18 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Yes, sir.

19 **MAYOR EVANS:** I made it. No I didn't. I seeked it.

20 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** I make a motion ---

21 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** So moved, Mr. Mayor.

22 **MAYOR EVANS:** Need a second.

23 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Second.

24 **MAYOR EVANS:** Okay. There's a motion and a second  
25 to award the clean up contract for the Bike



1 Fest and Cultural Heritage to TKK in the amount  
2 of \$10,875. Any other questions or comments?  
3 Roll call?

4 **CLERK:** Mayor pro tem Kenneth McLaurin?

21 **MAYOR EVANS:** Okay. There's a motion and a second  
22 to award the contract to Consensus Construction  
23 Consulting, LLC to demolish three buildings in  
24 town. In the amount of \$42,801.

25 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Well, let me read the ---



1     **MAYOR EVANS:**   Okay.

2     **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:**   --- process.   Mayor and Council  
3           and Public.   A public advertisement was posted  
4           in the Sun News for contractors --  
5           environmental contractors to demolish three  
6           buildings in the Town of Atlantic Beach.   705  
7           30th Avenue, for 6 30th Avenue and 512 30th  
8           Avenue.   Seven contractors picked up bid  
9           specifications.   Two responded to the request  
10          for bids.   Consensus Construction Consulting  
11          out of Myrtle Beach proposed the lowest bid of  
12          \$42,801.   The second lowest biller was Allens  
13          Demolition at \$47,324.82.   Recommend the award  
14          to Consensus Construction Consulting, LLC.

1     **MAYOR EVANS:**     We're down to the town managers  
2                   report.

3     **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:**   Mayor and Council, I've asked Mr.  
4                   Tony Marcus of Marcus media the entertainment  
5                   company that is doing the promotion and  
6                   implementation of entertainment for Bike Fest  
7                   2019 to come back and give us a comprehensive  
8                   report and update on entertainment for 2019  
9                   Bike Fest.

10    **MR. MARCUS:**    Hi.   How are y'all doing?

11    **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:**   Good.

12    **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:**   Good evening.

13    **MR. MARCUS:**     I'm going to give y'all this --  
14                   basically I'm going (inaudible) -- the Bike  
15                   Fest.  As you see in the first slide there's  
16                   like -- basically is -- obviously there's a  
17                   vendors design to be an additional feature to  
18                   the -- that you already have.  We would be  
19                   operating from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. daily.  
20                   We plan a biking stunt show that will happen  
21                   daily as well.  We have live performers.  We  
22                   have a Sunday worship and praise.  We'll have  
23                   food trucks and vendors as well.  And again,  
24                   this is just an overview of everything.  From  
25                   a marketing side of it -- from marketing views



1 and Facebook. We do a lot of advertisement on  
2 Facebook -- paid advertisement on Facebook,  
3 Instagram. We do email marketing as well as  
4 the billboard that you have placed here on  
5 17th. We have partnerships with different bike  
6 groups. As well as our Bike Week groups that  
7 are on social media that we are partners with.  
8 And then our immediate partner, we partnered  
9 with Coast 97.3 and they are giving us a lot of  
10 support from advertising. And in addition to  
11 that we have our promotional teams that will be  
12 passing out collateral material throughout the  
13 weekend, through Atlantic Beach as well as the  
14 North side -- North Myrtle. It is a free event  
15 to everyone. On the festival map -- and again,  
16 on the festival map, it's just a rough sketch  
17 of everything. Some of the things that you see  
18 there will be updated. Will be changed. But  
19 we are repositioning the stage to face center  
20 and kind of pointing a little towards the  
21 baywatch. Just so we can keep all the patrons  
22 inside of the festival area. And that's kind  
23 of how I got everything out laid for you. And  
24 then this -- on the schedule highlight piece,  
25 on that Thursday we'll do a "Welcome to



1 Atlantic Beach" we would like someone from  
2 Council to come to speak, if anyone is  
3 available.

4 **MAYOR EVANS:** I'll nominate Jackie.

5 **MR. MARCUS:** On Friday, we are doing a tribute to  
6 the Veterans. With -- featuring our Horry  
7 County Honor Guard. And I also would like  
8 someone from the town to come out and speak on  
9 Saturday -- as far as Council. And then we  
10 also have bike shows. The extreme Stunt show  
11 on Friday and then we're also doing a live  
12 broad cast with the radio station on Friday as  
13 well. Saturday, I said we had you guys come up  
14 and speak. Obviously the bulk of the crowd  
15 will be there on Saturday. So we will  
16 definitely like someone from Council to speak.  
17 And then we do the Bike and Stunt show  
18 beginning on Saturday. And then on Sunday we  
19 have the worship and praise with Bishop  
20 McFadden and disciples. So we'll have church  
21 service as well as a concert for free during  
22 that time. And some of the other performers  
23 that are scheduled to perform are other Bishop  
24 -- McFadden -- we have a few DJ's. DJ LarJazz,  
25 B-Lord, DJ Kahild, Payvee. We have a band,



1 Level 10. Nesha who's an R&B singer. And  
2 Soul2Soul band. That's another band that's  
3 coming from Greensboro, North Carolina. But,  
4 overall, this is just a overview of everything  
5 that's going to take place throughout the  
6 weekend. The times for -- all the schedule  
7 will be posed on our website by the end of the  
8 week. And I will convey everything over to Mr.  
9 Quattlebaum. And I -- but definitely if  
10 Council is available to speak on Thursday or  
11 Saturday, I would love someone to come by and  
12 greet all the bikers.

13 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Can I ask a question?

14 **MR. MARCUS:** Yes, ma'am.

15 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Where will the stunt show be  
16 held at?

17 **MR. MARCUS:** The stunt show will be held right in  
18 front of the -- on 30th. Right where the road  
19 is already blocked off.

20 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Oh. Oh.

21 **MR. MARCUS:** Down from off the hook.

22 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Oh. Okay.

23 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** (inaudible) -- that section in  
24 there.

25 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Oh. Okay. Okay. Okay.



1     **COUNCILMAN EVANS:**   Several years ago they had some  
2                   stunt show and the bikers mocked up ---

3     **MR. MARCUS:**    The ground.

4     **COUNCILMAN EVANS:**   --- yeah.

5     **MR. MARCUS:**    With burnouts, right.

6     **COUNCILMAN EVANS:**   It looked terrible after that.

7     **MR. MARCUS:**    Yeah.   I was told about that before.  
8                   That -- we talked to the bike crew about doing  
9                   the burnouts.   And they are going to do it on  
10                  something.   And they also -- they suggested  
11                  some type of chemical that we can put down to  
12                  help clean the roads.   But yes, there will be  
13                  some residue that will be left, but over time  
14                  it will definitely vanish.

15    **COUNCILMAN EVANS:**   Mr. Mayor -- on anything we put  
16                   out, we're not really using the name.   The  
17                   appropriate name.   It's not the Atlantic Beach  
18                   Bike and Music Festival.   It's the Atlantic  
19                   Beach Memorial Day Black Pearl Cultural  
20                   Heritage Festival.   And we'd like for you to  
21                   use that.   And get from the manager the correct  
22                   name of the festival.

23    **MR. MARCUS:**    All right.

24    **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:**   Please.

25    **MR. MARCUS:**    All right.



1 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Thank you.

2 **COUNCILMAN EVANS:** The last time you were here I  
3 raised a question about something for kids.  
4 Did we incorporate that into it?

5 **MR. MARCUS:** Uh---

6 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** We -- let me answer that.  
7 Council, we looked into it and we tried to  
8 identify locations and a place for it. It's  
9 difficult because we committed on the planning  
10 for the entertainment. For adult entertainment  
11 along the waterfront. So trying to acquire an  
12 additional location and plan activities, would  
13 be challenging to do with short notice for  
14 (inaudible) ---

15 **COUNCILMAN EVANS:** That's something that we ought to  
16 continue to pursue because a parent's going to  
17 bring -- a lot of parent's are going to bring  
18 kids down. And we ought to have something that  
19 appeals to them this whole weekend. You're  
20 going to have plenty of kids on the beach. And  
21 everything ought not to be adult centered.

22 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** I think though, that they were  
23 strictly for the entertainment for the adults.  
24 And we were to find somebody that was going to  
25 be interested in doing something for the kids.



1           That's what we should have done.

2   **COUNCILMAN EVANS:**   No.

3   **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:**       Because he was for the  
4           entertainment and music; right?

5   **MR. MARCUS:**   Yeah. But he mentioned at the last ---

6   **COUNCILMAN EVANS:**   It belongs to him too.

7   **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:**   It was recommended at the last  
8           meeting to try and incorporate -- short notice  
9           -- but to try to incorporate -- we talked about  
10          it (inaudible) ---

11   **COUNCILMAN EVANS:**   We want you to continue to work  
12          on that.

13   **MR. MARCUS:**   Yes, sir. (inaudible) ---

14   **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:**   Let me just indicate that based on  
15          -- as all of you know -- Council knows,  
16          registration always lags behind in terms of a  
17          firm commitment. But we've seen an uptick in  
18          the number of new vendors already that have  
19          verbally and have registered. So we do have a  
20          number of new vendors that have already  
21          registered. And we hope that that number will  
22          increase. We're getting significant increase  
23          in interest on (inaudible) -- motion that  
24          they're doing. Hearing it promoted around the  
25          surrounding areas. We have seen an uptick in



1 the number of vendors.

2 **MAYOR EVANS:** Okay. Anybody else have any questions  
3 for Marcus Media?

4 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

5 **MAYOR EVANS:** Well no. We're getting ready to  
6 close. You can ask him a question. We'll go  
7 ahead and close out though. Council, we seek  
8 a motion to adjourn.

9 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** So moved.

10 **COUNCILMAN EVANS:** Second.

11 **MAYOR EVANS:** Motion and a second to adjourn. Roll  
12 call?

13 **CLERK:** Mayor pro tem Kenneth McLaurin?

14 **MAYOR PRO TEM McLAURIN:** Yea.

15 **CLERK:** Councilman Lenearl Evans?

16 **COUNCILMAN EVANS:** Yea.

17 **CLERK:** Councilwoman Josephine Isom?

18 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Yea.

19 **CLERK:** Councilwoman Jacqueline Gore?

20 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Yea.

21 **CLERK:** Mayor Jake Evans?

22 **MAYOR EVANS:** Yea. Motion granted. This meeting is  
23 adjourned at 6:35 p.m.
