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1 **Call to Order:**

2 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** All right, this is a conference  
3 call meeting. It's held at 12:00 o'clock p.m.  
4 this Friday, May the 8th, 2020. And this  
5 meeting is held by teleconference. Roll call?

6 **CLERK:** Councilman Lenearl Evans? Councilwoman  
7 Josephine Isom?

8 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Here.

9 **CLERK:** Councilwoman Jacqueline Gore?

10 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Here.

11 **CLERK:** Councilwoman Glenda Williams?

12 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Here.

13 **CLERK:** Mayor Jake Evans?

14 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Madam Chair, for the record, Mayor  
15 Jake Evans and Councilman Lenearl Evans will  
16 not be in attendance due to the recent passing  
17 of their mother.

18 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Thank you. And I'd just like to  
19 say to Mr. Manager that, first of all, we send  
20 our condolences and our blessings out to the  
21 Evans family at this time.

22 **New Business:**

23 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** We're going to start with our  
24 New Business. Council, can I get a motion to  
25 approve Ordinance Number 3-2020, an ordinance



1 authorizing extension of declared emergency, a  
2 state of emergency, in the Town of Atlantic  
3 Beach, South Carolina due to the COVID-19  
4 Coronavirus Pandemic.

5 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** So moved.

6 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** I second.

7 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay. It has been moved and  
8 proper second. A motion -- proper second that  
9 we will approve the Ordinance Number 3-2020.  
10 Any questions?

11 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** No questions ---

12 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** I think Council wanted one  
13 modification on the language to leave vacation  
14 rentals.

15 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay. All right. So again ---

16 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

17 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** --- with all the correction and  
18 modification to be added as the modification on  
19 vacation rental. Roll call?

20 **CLERK:** Councilwoman Josephine Isom?

21 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Yea.

22 **CLERK:** Councilwoman Jacqueline Gore?

23 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Yea.

24 **CLERK:** Councilwoman Glenda Williams?

25 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Yea.



1 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** A motion approved -- Ordinance  
2 approved and adopted. B, Resolution Number 4-  
3 2020, a resolution in recognition of the life  
4 of Ms. Earlene Evans Woods in the Town of  
5 Atlantic Beach. Council, can I get a motion  
6 for that approval?

7 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** So moved.

8 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Second.

9 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay. It has been moved and  
10 proper second that we do adopt the Resolution  
11 Number 4-2020. Any questions?

12 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** No questions.

13 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay. There being no questions,  
14 I declare this resolution is approved here  
15 today. Resolution Number 4-2020 for the life  
16 of Earlene Evans Woods.

17 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Did we take a vote? You take a  
18 vote?

19 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** We didn't take a vote yet.

20 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Okay.

21 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Okay.

22 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Need a roll call vote.

23 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Roll call for the vote on the  
24 resolution?

25 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Yes, ma'am.



1 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Roll call?

2 **CLERK:** Councilwoman Josephine Isom?

3 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Yea.

4 **CLERK:** Councilwoman Jacqueline Gore?

5 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Yea.

6 **CLERK:** Councilwoman Glenda Williams?

7 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Yea.

8 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay. And a roll call has been  
9 completed and it's been approved -- adopted and  
10 approved. So moved. Okay. Our Town Manager  
11 have anything that we need to discuss while  
12 we're online?

13 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** No, ma'am. We just have any  
14 Public Time, Madam Town Clerk, have we received  
15 any requests for participation in Public Time?

16 **CLERK:** No, Mr. Quattlebaum.

17 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** No, ma'am, Madam Chair. I have  
18 nothing else to bring to the Council at this  
19 time.

20 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay.

21 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Let's have a -- I had a question  
22 to -- do we have everything in place from the  
23 Town for the Woods family in place for the  
24 flowers and whatever else? I know we have the  
25 resolution in place, but do we have flowers



1 ordered for her?

2 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Have a what?

3 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Did we order flowers ---

4 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** The flowers.

5 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** --- for Ms. Woods?

6 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** A flower ---

7 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

8 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** This is Councilwoman Glenda  
9 Williams. I'm sorry. This is Councilwoman  
10 Glenda Williams. Per the request of the family  
11 (inaudible) Thursday to everyone (inaudible)  
12 for -- to fund the youth program of the Earlene  
13 Evans Woods as opposed to donating a flower.

14 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Uh-huh.

15 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** They expected -- they want us to  
16 do what now? Sorry.

17 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

18 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Oh, you're talking about what is  
19 standard. Okay, I'm sorry. Okay. Okay, I'm  
20 sorry. I just know that we're so accustomed to  
21 giving out flowers whenever someone in town  
22 passes away (inaudible). But yes, ma'am, I did  
23 read that. Okay, okay.

24 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Okay ---

25 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Also ---



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(Inaudible background noise.)

**COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** --- it will be listed on Facebook -- a Facebook link in memory of Ms. Earlene Evans Woods would be the information there as well of where the donation would go as it relates to the Youth Foundation and just to go on record, the Foundation is the (inaudible) of AME, Earlene Evans Woods Youth Foundation. That's where all donations, monetary donations, will go toward, being in person or company, they're looking forward to donating, as opposed to flowers, they're asking for monetary donations to be made payable to (inaudible) to Earlene Evans Woods Youth Foundation. Okay, all right ---

(Inaudible background noise.)

**MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Madam Councilwoman ---

**COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** That's ---

**MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** --- that website, what is it listed under, for that information?

**C O U N C I L W O M A N I S O M :** I t ' s facebook.com/earlene.evanswoods.

**MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Okay.

**COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay. And all the information will be there according to the donations.



1           Also, all the information is there in reference  
2           to the viewing of the body, which is scheduled  
3           today from 3:00 to 7:00 p.m.     Also, the  
4           information is listed there in relation to the  
5           graveside ceremony, which is taking place on  
6           Saturday, May 9th, 2020.

7           **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Thank you.

8           **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** They're not -- I've got a  
9           question. Is it really immediate family?

10          **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Yes.

11          **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** So, the information that I  
12          have received, the family will be allowed to go  
13          on the graveside and must remain six feet  
14          apart. Other -- all other patrons will be  
15          returned -- whoever else attends the graveside  
16          must remain in their vehicles. And there will  
17          be -- whereby the vehicle will be able to  
18          circle around or ride past the mausoleum so  
19          that they can at least, you know, see a viewing  
20          on the drive by. But only family will be  
21          allowed to get out of your vehicle and must  
22          remain six feet apart.

23          **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Oh, okay. Okay, (inaudible).

24          **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Yes. And information is  
25          Shields Funeral Home and the funeral director



1 is Theron Elford Shields and the information  
2 also -- that information also can be found at  
3 facebook.com/earlene.evanswoods.

4 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay, thank you. Manager  
5 Quattlebaum, I'm gonna ask you, have you all  
6 got the parking to the beach -- taking the body  
7 drive to the beach by the (inaudible), have you  
8 all got that squared away yet, how will they  
9 go?

10 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Yes, ma'am. I'll defer to Chief  
11 Robertson. Chief?

12 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** (Inaudible.)

13 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Yes, if -- if you'll give --  
14 Councilwoman asked in terms of the viewing  
15 tomorrow to the town, can you give us the  
16 particulars, the time ---

17 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** They're still working on it.  
18 Right now, it looks like they're gonna leave  
19 from Ms. Woods house at around 12:30. Proceed  
20 down towards Ocean Boulevard. Take a left  
21 right there where the cul-de-sac's at. They're  
22 gonna probably have a moment of silence to  
23 recognize Ms. Woods for being a (inaudible) and  
24 a lot of the public stuff she's done in town.  
25 And then they're gonna proceed from there up



1 30th Avenue and head on to 17 and proceed to  
2 the grave site.

3 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay. Does that mean we have to  
4 be in place at 12:30? You have your ---

5 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

6 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** I'm sorry. We're gonna block --  
7 we probably ---

8 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Come in to let it be -- and  
9 stand up to pay their respects, or I can tell  
10 them they need to be here at 12:30?

11 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** They probably need to be there by  
12 12:20 ---

13 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay.

14 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** --- we start blocking off the  
15 road, they're not going to be able to get  
16 through.

17 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay. All right.

18 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** So Mr. Chief, this is  
19 Councilwoman Glenda Williams ---

20 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

21 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** --- but then be there by  
22 12:15 to ensure that everything is clear and  
23 out of your all's way as it relates to whatever  
24 you have to enforce, or liability of the Town,  
25 to make sure that all the people are parking,



1           you know, on the side and out of the way of the  
2           vehicles?

3           **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM (ph):** Uh-huh. Okay.

4           **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** And then I'll -- and I'm  
5           sorry, Mr. Chief, I didn't -- I'll wait to hear  
6           you before I get any further. So is that  
7           suggested spot where you (inaudible)?

8           **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** I'm sorry. You were talking to  
9           me, Council?

10          **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Yes. I was saying is it  
11          okay for me to suggest that perhaps that  
12          everyone be (inaudible) that wants to stand  
13          along of the -- stand along the side of the  
14          highway as the (inaudible) drives through. Is  
15          it (inaudible) suggest that the roads are  
16          closed off by 12:15 (inaudible)?

17          **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** Yes.

18          **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Okay. And then I have one  
19          another -- my other question is on (inaudible)  
20          also, Mr. -- (inaudible) circle the Town twice  
21          with the body going through Town one time, and  
22          then the body going through the (inaudible)  
23          stop here at the cul-de-sac for a moment of  
24          silence, or will that need corrections (ph)?

25          **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** Well, I'm still talking with the



1 funeral home and the Mayor about that part.  
2 They're supposed to get back with me today.  
3 The first -- where they planned on going first  
4 was leaving from the Mayor's mother's house,  
5 heading towards 30th Avenue, going down Ocean  
6 Boulevard, coming down -- or correction --  
7 going down 31st, coming down Ocean Boulevard,  
8 coming back up 30th Avenue then turning right  
9 there by the Town Hall and then turning back on  
10 31st and proceeding back down to Ocean  
11 Boulevard. The second time when we get to the  
12 cul-de-sac was the time when we're supposed to  
13 stop and do the moment of silence for Ms. Woods  
14 and then proceed -- after that, proceed back up  
15 31st, I mean -- correction -- 30th towards 17.  
16 That part of the route is still in the work-in-  
17 process, but I should know a little bit more  
18 probably in the next hour of which one we're  
19 going to do, if we're going to ride one time or  
20 twice.

21 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Well, my ---

22 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** I also ---

23 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Okay.

24 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** --- you all go through the same  
25 road twice.



1 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** Ma'am?

2 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** I said I don't think they would  
3 want to take the body through the same -- on  
4 the same road twice.

5 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** They are kind of ---

6 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** (Inaudible) ---

7 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** --- the family wanted to go way --  
8 kind of up to the funeral home also.

9 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Uh-huh. All right ---

10 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** Also ---

11 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Mr. Quattlebaum, this is --  
12 I'm sorry. Go ahead, Mr. Chief, then I'll  
13 (inaudible).

14 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** Yeah. All -- you know, all the  
15 Police Department would do is escort it, you  
16 know, we would do whatever we need to do on our  
17 end to make sure everybody's safe and sound,  
18 and assure everything's going as smooth as  
19 possible. Basically, we're just going off the  
20 request of the family. So that part's --

21 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Right.

22 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** --- still kind of being worked  
23 out. So, like I said, I was hoping to know a  
24 direct answer by 1:30 'cause with that being  
25 we're gonna ride through the town one time or



1 twice, or even they might change and ride  
2 through another street (inaudible).

3 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Okay.

4 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** All right. But you will let --

5 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Yes.

6 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** --- us know, right?

7 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** Yes, ma'am ---

8 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** When you finalize that, you will  
9 try to let us know, right?

10 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** Yes, ma'am, I will ---

11 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM (ph):** Okay.

12 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** I will tell -- everybody still  
13 should need to be down there, like Councilwoman  
14 Glenda Williams stated, around 12:15 because we  
15 do start right at noon and block off the roads  
16 ---

17 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay.

18 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** --- we don't want people coming in  
19 because we're not gonna let them come in once  
20 we start blocking off.

21 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** All right. And if it's  
22 okay, thank you so much, Chief, I would like to  
23 just go on record and just read from the Evans  
24 Woods family here and that's we, the Evans  
25 Woods Family chose Shields Funeral Home to



1 service our needs. Due to the COVID-19  
2 pandemic, a formal service will not be  
3 permissible during this challenging time.  
4 Please feel confident that we will take all  
5 extra precautions to ensure the facility is  
6 sanitized and safe for viewing. That -- and  
7 they're represented by Shields Funeral Home and  
8 they also said the viewing will be held Friday,  
9 May 8th, 2020 from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.  
10 Please observe the following guidelines. At  
11 the family's request, no pictures. Again,  
12 okay, it goes on record that at the family's  
13 request, no pictures. Guidelines are if you  
14 are sick, stay at home. Number 2, wear a mask.  
15 Number 3, wash your hands. Number 4, use  
16 sanitizer. And Number 5, only ten people  
17 permitted at a time for the viewing. No more  
18 than ten people at a time. And it says please  
19 remain six feet apart. Number 7, they're  
20 asking any -- everyone to refrain from kissing,  
21 hugging or shaking hands in any manner at all.  
22 And also, again, they are reiterating a  
23 graveside service will be starting May 9th,  
24 2020 at 1:00 p.m. at Mount Zion AME Church  
25 Cemetery located at 3055 Mount Zion Road in



1 Little River, South Carolina 29566. We will be  
2 leaving from the home of Sister Earlene Evans  
3 Woods located at 613 31st Avenue, Atlantic  
4 Beach, South Carolina 29582. Upon arrival at  
5 the cemetery, immediate family only at the  
6 graveside. Please remain six feet apart. All  
7 other patrons or visitors, please remain in  
8 your vehicle. And this is also implemented by  
9 Shields Funeral Home as well as the Evans Woods  
10 Family.

11 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay. Thank you, Councilwoman  
12 for that information ---

13 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Okay. One more thing before we  
14 get off this call, Ms. Isom, I'm sorry. One  
15 more thing. I just wanted to ask Mr.  
16 Quattlebaum one more question pertaining to the  
17 rentals in the town. Has the Elliott Realty  
18 and everybody, I mean, the Airbnbs, have they  
19 been contacted -- knowing that we are closed?  
20 We would not be having any renters in our town?

21 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** We're gonna send out notifications  
22 ---

23 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Have they been ---

24 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** We will ---

25 **(Inaudible background noise.)**



1 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** So whose our -- Airbnb in the  
2 town, we don't have to worry about them. They  
3 are not going to let anybody rent on their  
4 program until I think June 15th. But Elliot  
5 Realty has rentals here in town that must be --  
6 notified because they had some here this week.

7 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Oh, okay.

8 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** We will ---

9 (Inaudible background noise.)

10 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** --- we'll send out a notification.

11 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Okay, all right. Thank you.

12 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** That being all ---

13 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** All right.

14 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Council -- I'm sorry -- and Chief  
15 Robertson.

16 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Yes.

17 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** When we do the moment of silence  
18 down there at the cul-de-sac, there's a parking  
19 spot down there in the (inaudible) at the cove.  
20 Is it okay for the Town to allow people to park  
21 there during this time so we won't block the  
22 road with cars and such?

23 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** That's fine ---

24 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** I believe it's popular. I --  
25 have a problem with that. I would say, yes,



1           it's okay.

2       **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:**   Yes.

3       **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:**  At the same time, Mr. Chief,  
4           (inaudible) questions.  I know we're saying  
5           it's okay for people to park in certain places  
6           where we will not block the highway, but for  
7           that particular time of acknowledging a  
8           (inaudible) body in the town, would we even be  
9           concerned about the road being blocked at the  
10          time, being that that is a special moment?

11      **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:**  But the only problem is ---

12      **CHIEF ROBERTSON:**  Right.

13      **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:**  --- is that we are -- you're  
14          parking, right?

15      **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:**  Well, what I'm saying is  
16          that there's always a what -- if it's a special  
17          moment for a special cause and we're already  
18          gonna close the roads off, then would -- that  
19          could certainly be a concern about blocking  
20          that highway in knowing that this is taking  
21          place, would we not just go forth with it and  
22          then be normal access can open up and proceed  
23          after we finish this -- the acknowledgment and  
24          (inaudible) by, they're leaving the town with  
25          the body of Ms. Earlene Evans Woods, would that



1 even be a concern?

2 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** Well, one -- basically with the  
3 parking down there at the cul-de-sac, we've got  
4 lots down there that people can park. One of  
5 our concerns, if they park on the side of the  
6 road, with this being a crowd coming through  
7 with the family and the funeral home -- the  
8 funeral home is carrying the body, then we  
9 don't want to cause any backup because of cars  
10 in the way and it'd be hard for them to turn --  
11 -

12 (Inaudible background noise.)

13 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** --- yes. We're gonna try to keep  
14 the streets clean, open as much as we can for  
15 them. It'll be easy access in and out. So  
16 once we block off with -- probably about 1:15  
17 we'll -- I'll probably have one of my officers  
18 at the top of the road down there on 30th to  
19 sit there and just stop traffic coming in.  
20 That anybody that may ---

21 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Right.

22 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** --- running a couple minutes late,  
23 they could go down 29th and come up that way  
24 (inaudible) and park that way.

25 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Okay. And then I'm not gonna



1 drag this out, but isn't our beach closed, or  
2 are you talking about people of the  
3 neighborhood going there, or there's  
4 (inaudible) going to the park? Because right  
5 now, we're closed to any outside people coming  
6 within the beach area, at least Atlantic Beach  
7 area anyway.

8 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** The beach will stay closed. I'm  
9 talking about just the beach -- just the lots  
10 to park vehicles for people that want to stand  
11 out and view the family coming through ---

12 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Oh, good ---

13 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** --- so on the cul- ---

14 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Okay.

15 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Like a parade type, where  
16 they're just standing out. Whenever you're  
17 coming -- like more like a holiday (ph) parade,  
18 they're just standing out waiting for it --  
19 like the motorcade comes through. So we're  
20 just gonna be stand -- just standing out there,  
21 is that what you're saying?

22 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** Yes. Yes, ma'am ---

23 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** I just received -- for the --  
24 most of the people -- we may have like four or  
25 five cars out of the town that's gonna drive



1 down there. For the most of the people in  
2 town, they may walk down there or even stand in  
3 front of their own homes and stuff. I think  
4 there's more likely gonna be -- I mean, the  
5 ones that know to go down because they may  
6 think we'll -- but for the most, people gonna  
7 stand outside -- believe it or not, a lot of  
8 people are not -- still aren't going outside  
9 their homes. They're staying at home. They  
10 can just stand ---

11 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Right.

12 **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** --- it's no (inaudible) because  
13 a lot of folks aren't even gonna be down in the  
14 cul-de-sac. Just for the most of the people --  
15 I'm almost sure to tell you that they're gonna  
16 be standing outside their homes more than  
17 likely.

18 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Right ---

19 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** But just to come back --  
20 this is probably (inaudible). Just to come  
21 back and saying ---

22 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

23 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** --- and requesting this, I  
24 really, really want to change, Jacqui, that I  
25 think a couple of more -- I think we had



1 already said we'd do (inaudible) as well. I do  
2 understand we're leaving all options open. If  
3 it does happen, basically we'll just try to  
4 (inaudible) -- to go ahead and appear and be on  
5 hand to say we usually -- I agree. I  
6 understand what you're saying now.

7 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Yeah. Chief ---

8 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

9 **MR. QUATTLEBAUM:** Somebody had a question for Chief?

10 **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Not me.

11 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Chief, so you have that all  
12 taken care of, right?

13 **CHIEF ROBERTSON:** Yes, ma'am. We'll have all that  
14 taken care of ---

15 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay. Anyone else have anything  
16 else want to talk about? I think we all have  
17 it all taken care of. Like I said, my  
18 condolences go with Mayor Jake Evans' family --  
19 -

20 **(Inaudible background noise.)**

21 **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** --- resident here with us, you  
22 know. I know what even he's going through  
23 really 'cause I've lost my mother also. So  
24 let's keep the family in prayer and do all we  
25 can to help him keep the beach moving forward.



1           And that being all that I have to say, thank  
2           you, all ---

3           **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Well, Ms. Jo, I want to commend  
4           you on a great job. You did a real good job  
5           today.

6           **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Thank you.

7           **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Thank you, Ms. Jo.

8                           **(Inaudible background noise.)**

9           **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** --- I've been here such a long  
10           time with her, and their father, so it hurts me  
11           too, you know. And that being all -- no public  
12           time? Meeting is adjourned. Can I get a  
13           motion to adjourn?

14           **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** So moved.

15           **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS:** Second.

16           **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Okay. It's been moved and  
17           proper second that this meeting is adjourned at  
18           12:30 p.m. Thank you all ---

19           **CLERK:** Roll call. Roll call.

20           **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Roll call?

21           **CLERK:** Councilwoman Josephine Isom?

22           **COUNCILWOMAN ISOM:** Yea.

23           **CLERK:** Councilwoman Jacqueline Gore?

24           **COUNCILWOMAN GORE:** Yea.

25           **CLERK:** Councilwoman Glenda Williams?



1 COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS: Yea.

2 COUNCILWOMAN ISOM: It has approved that the meeting  
3 is now adjourned. Thank you.
